Lu. 12:42-48

"Accountability and Approval"

- <u>Lu. 12:42</u> And the Lord said, **Who then is that faithful and wise steward**, whom *his* lord shall make ruler over his household, to give *them their* portion of meat in due season?
- 43 Blessed is that **servant**, whom his lord when he cometh shall find so **doing**.
- 44 Of a truth I say unto you, that he will make him ruler over all that he hath.
- 45 But and if that servant say in his **heart**, My lord delayeth his coming; and shall begin to beat the menservants and maidens, and to eat and drink, and to be drunken;
- 46 The lord of that servant will come in a day when he looketh not for him, and at an hour when he is not aware, and will cut him in sunder, and will appoint him his portion with the unbelievers.
- 47 And that servant, which knew his lord's will, and prepared not himself, neither did according to his will, shall be beaten with many stripes.

48 But he that knew not, and did commit things worthy of stripes, shall be beaten with few *stripes*. For unto whomsoever much is given, of him shall be much required: and to whom men have committed much, of him they will ask the more.

Original Word: οἰκονόμος

Transliteration: oikonomos

Definition: a household manager, a steward, guardian.

oikonómos (from oíkos, "house, household" and nemō, "to allot, apportion") – properly, a steward (literally, "household-manager").

oikonómos ("manager") often functioned as the "steward" of a household, and was generally a freedman

- I. THE ENQUIRY, 12:42a "...Who then is that faithful and wise steward..."
 - A. The Question "faithful and wise"
 - B. The Quest "steward"
- Phil. 3:14 I press toward the mark for the prize of the high calling of God in Christ Jesus.
- II. <u>THE ENTRUSTING</u>, 12:42b "...whom *his* lord shall make ruler over his household..."
 - A. The Dominion "...whom his lord..."



- Gen. 39:2 And the LORD was with Joseph, and he was a prosperous man; and he was in the house of his master the Egyptian.
- 3 And his master saw that the LORD was with him, and that the LORD made all that he did to prosper in his hand.
- 4 And Joseph found grace in his sight, and he served him: and he made him overseer over his house, and all that he had he put into his hand.
- 5 And it came to pass from the time *that* he had made him overseer in his house, and over all that he had, that the LORD blessed the Egyptian's house for Joseph's sake; and the blessing of the LORD was upon all that he had in the house, and in the field.
- 6 And he left all that he had in Joseph's hand; and he knew not ought he had, save the bread which he did eat. And Joseph was a goodly person, and well favoured.

- B. The Design "...shall make ruler over his household..."
- 1 Pet. 4:10 As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.
- 1 Chron. 29:11 Thine, O LORD, *is* the greatness, and the power, and the glory, and the victory, and the majesty: for all *that is* in the heaven and in the earth *is thine*; thine *is* the kingdom, O LORD, and thou art exalted as head above all.
- 12 Both riches and honour *come* of thee, and thou reignest over all; and in thine hand *is* power and might; and in thine hand *it is* to make great, and to give strength unto all.
- 13 Now therefore, our God, we thank thee, and praise thy glorious name. 14 But who am I, and what is my people, that we should be able to offer so willingly after this sort? for all things come of thee, and of thine own have we given thee.

Prov. 22:2 The rich and poor meet together: the LORD is the maker of them all.

- III. <u>THE ENCOURAGEMENT</u>, 12:43-44 "...Blessed *is* that **servant...** he **will make him ruler** over all that he hath."
 - A. The Acknowledgement "Blessed is that servant..."
- 1 Cor. 3:8 Now he that planteth and he that watereth are one: and every man shall receive his own reward according to his own labour.
- 2 Jn. 1:8 Look to yourselves, that we lose not those things which we have wrought, but that we receive a full reward.
 - B. The Advancement "...he will make him ruler..."
- Prov. 10:22 The blessing of the LORD, it maketh rich, and he addeth no sorrow with it.



- Prov. 13:7 There is that **maketh himself** rich, yet *hath* nothing: there is that **maketh himself** poor, yet hath great riches.
- 1 Pet. 5:6 Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time:
- IV. <u>THE ENIGMA</u>, 12:45-47 "But and if that servant say in his heart... The lord of that servant will come in a day when he looketh not for *him...* that **servant**, **which knew his lord's will, and prepared not** *himself***, neither did according to his will..."**
 - A. The Choice "...if that servant say in his heart..."
- Prov. 4:23 **Keep thy heart with all diligence**; for out of it *are* the issues of life.



- Mt. 15:8 This people draweth nigh unto me with their mouth, and honoureth me with *their* lips; but **their heart is far from me**. ...
- 18 But those things which proceed out of the mouth come forth from the heart; and they defile the man.
- 19 For out of the heart proceed evil thoughts, murders, adulteries, fornications, thefts, false witness, blasphemies:
- Lu. 12:34 For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.
 - B. The Consequences "...which knew his lord's will...neither did according to his will..."
- Gal. 6:7 Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap.
- 8 For he that soweth to his flesh shall of the flesh reap corruption; but he that soweth to the Spirit shall of the Spirit reap life everlasting.
- 9 And let us not be weary in well doing: for in due season we shall reap, if we faint not.

- Rom. 12:1 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, *which is* your reasonable service.
- 2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.
- V. THE ENABLING, 12:48a "...unto whomsoever much is given..."
 - A. The Provisions

1 Cor. 2:12 Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God.

Eccl. 5:19 Every man also to whom God hath given riches and wealth, and hath given him power to eat thereof, and to take his portion, and to rejoice in his labour; this is the gift of God.

B. The Power

Phil. 4:13 I can do all things **through Christ** which strengtheneth me.

VI. THE ENCOUNTER, 12:48a – "...For unto whomsoever much is given, of him shall be much required ..."

A. The Personal Accountability – "...For unto whomsoever..."

Heb. 9:27 And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment:

- Rom. 14:10 But why dost thou judge thy brother? or why dost thou set at nought thy brother? for we shall all stand before the judgment seat of Christ.
- 11 For it is written, As I live, saith the Lord, every knee shall bow to me, and every tongue shall confess to God.
- 12 So then every one of us shall give account of himself to God.
 - B. The Proportional Assessment "...much given...much required..."
- 1 Cor. 4:1 Let a man so account of us, as of the ministers of Christ, and stewards of the mysteries of God.
- <u>2</u> Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man be found faithful.

Conclusion - THE ENVISION, 2 Cor. 5:10-11

2 Cor. 5:10 For we must all appear before the judgment seat of Christ; that every one may receive the things *done* in *his* body, according to that he hath done, whether *it* be good or bad.

11 Knowing therefore the terror of the Lord, we persuade men; but we are made manifest unto God; and I trust also are made manifest in your consciences.

Rev. 14:7 Saying with a loud voice, Fear God, and give glory to him; for the hour of his judgment is come: and worship him that made heaven, and earth, and the sea, and the fountains of waters.

2 Cor. 6:2 (For he saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the day of salvation have I succoured thee: behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.)
