

Jn. 20:1 The first day of the week cometh Mary Magdalene early, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulchre, and seeth the stone taken away from the sepulchre.

<u>2</u> Then she runneth, and cometh to Simon Peter, and to the other disciple, whom Jesus loved, and saith unto them, They have taken away the Lord out of the sepulchre, and we know not where they have laid him.

<u>3</u> Peter therefore went forth, and that other disciple, and came to the sepulchre.

<u>4</u> So they ran both together: and the other disciple did outrun Peter, and came first to the sepulchre.

5 And he stooping down, and looking in, saw the linen clothes lying; yet went he not in.

<u>6</u> Then cometh Simon Peter following him, and went into the sepulchre, and seeth the linen clothes lie,



7 And the napkin, that was about his head, not lying with the linen clothes, but wrapped together in a place by itself. 8 Then went in also that other disciple, which came first to the sepulchre, and he saw, and believed. 9 For as yet they knew not the scripture, that he must rise again from the dead. 10 Then the disciples went away again unto their own home. <u>11 But Mary stood without at the sepulchre weeping: and as she wept,</u> she stooped down, and looked into the sepulchre, 12 And seeth two angels in white sitting, the one at the head, and the other at the feet, where the body of Jesus had lain. <u>13</u> And they say unto her, <u>Woman</u>, why weepest thou? She saith unto them, Because they have taken away my Lord, and I know not where they have laid him.

14 And when she had thus said, she turned herself

back, and saw Jesus standing, and knew not that

it was Jesus.

<u>15</u> Jesus saith unto her, Woman, why weepest thou? whom seekest thou? She, supposing him to be the gardener, saith unto him, Sir, if thou have borne him hence, tell me where thou hast laid him, and will take him away.

- <u>16</u> Jesus saith unto her, Mary. She turned herself, and saith unto him, Rabboni; which is to say, Master.
- <u>17</u> Jesus saith unto her, Touch me not; for I am not yet ascended to my Father: but go to my brethren, and say unto them, I ascend unto my Father, and your Father; and to my God, and your God.
 <u>15</u> Mary Magdalene came and told the disciples that she had seen the Lord, and *that* he had spoken these things unto her.

I. THE FIRST APPEARANCE WAS TO ONE WHO WAS FEARFUL

A. From Darkness to Deliverance

Lu. 8:2 And certain women, which had been healed of evil spirits and infirmities, Mary called Magdalene, out of whom went seven devils,

<u>Mk. 16:9</u> Now when Jesus was risen early the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, out of whom he had cast seven devils.

Lu. 11:24 When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through dry places, seeking rest; and finding none, he saith, I will return unto my house whence I came out.
 25 And when he cometh, he findeth *it* swept and garnished.
 26 Then goeth he, and taketh *to him* seven other spirits more wicked than himself; and they enter in, and dwell there: and the last state of the last state in the last state of the last state in the last state.

Lu. 8:35 Then they went out to see what was done; and came to Jesus, and found the man, out of whom the devils were departed, sitting at the feet of Jesus, clothed, and found the man out of whom the devils were

in his right mind: and they were afraid.

<u>2 Cor. 5:17</u> Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.

B. From Deliverance to Dedicated

Lu. 8:1 And it came to pass afterward, that he went throughout every city and village, preaching and shewing the glad tidings of the kingdom of God: and the twelve were with him,
 2 And certain women, which had been healed of evil spirits and infirmities, Mary called Magdalene, out of whom went seven devils,
 3 And Joanna the wife of Chuza Herod's steward, and Susanna, and many others, which ministered unto him of their substance.

Jn. 8:36 If the Son therefore shall make you free, ye shall be free indeed.



II. THE FIRST APPEARANCE WAS TO ONE WHO WAS A FOLLOWER

Being changed includes becoming a fearless follower.

Lu. 9:23 And he said to them all, If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me.

A. Mary Magdalene Followed the Savior When it was Easier

Lu. 8:1 And it came to pass afterward, that he went throughout every city and village, preaching and shewing the glad tidings of the kingdom of God: and the twelve were with him,

<u>2</u> And certain women, which had been healed of evil spirits and infirmities, Mary called Magdalene, out of whom went seven devils,

<u>3</u> And Joanna the wife of Chuza Herod's steward, and Susanna, and many others, which ministere B. Mary Magdalene Followed the Savior When it was Excruciating

<u>Jn. 19:25</u> Now there stood by the cross of Jesus his mother, and his mother's sister, Mary the *wife* of Cleophas, and Mary Magdalene.

<u>Mt. 27:54</u> Now when the centurion, and they that were with him, watching Jesus, saw the earthquake, and those things that were done, they feared greatly, saying, Truly this was the Son of God.
 <u>55</u> And many women were there beholding afar off, which followed Jesus from Galilee, ministering unto him:

56 Among which was Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James and Joses, and the mother of Zebedee's children.

III. THE FIRST APPEARANCE WAS TO ONE WHO WAS FAITHFUL

Being a follower develops one to become faithful and fruitful.

A. Mary Magdalene was Faithful at the Cross

 <u>Mt. 27:57</u> When the even was come, there came a rich man of Arimathaea, named Joseph, who also himself was Jesus' disciple:
 <u>58</u> He went to Pilate, and begged the body of Jesus. Then Pilate commanded the body to be delivered.

- 59 And when Joseph had taken the body, he wrapped it in a clean linen cloth,
- 60 And laid it in his own new tomb, which he had hewn out in the rock: and he rolled a great stone to the door of the sepulchre, and departed.
- 61 And there was Mary Magdalene, and the other Mary, sitting over against the sepulchre.

B. Mary Magdalene was Faithful After the Cross

<u>Mt. 28:1</u> In the end of the sabbath, as it began to dawn toward the first *day* of the week, came wary Magdalene and the other Mary to see the sepulchre.

<u>Mk. 16:1</u> And when the sabbath was past, <u>Mary Magdalene</u>, and Mary the *mother* of James, and Salome, had bought sweet spices, that they might come and anoint him. ...

<u>Jn. 20:1</u> The first day of the week cometh Mary Magdalene early, when it was yet dark, unto the sepulchre, and seeth the stone taken away from the sepulchre.

- Mary Magdalene came to the tomb of Jesus before daylight.
- She saw the stone was rolled away and ran to tell Peter and John.
- John out runs Peter to the tomb, but Peter goes in first.
- Peter and John see the empty tomb, and went back to their homes.
- Mary Magdalene, stays at the tomb, weeping, and sees two angels.
- Jn. 20:13 And they say unto her, Woman, why weepest thou? She saith unto them, Because they have taken away my Lord, and I know not where they have laid him.
- <u>14</u> And when she had thus said, she turned herself back, and saw Jesus standing, and knew not that it was Jesus.
- <u>15</u> Jesus saith unto her, Woman, why weepest thou? whom seekest thou? She, supposing him to be the gardener, saith unto him, Sir, if thou have borne him hence, tell me where thou hast laid him, and will take him away.
- <u>16</u> Lesus saith unto her, Mary. She turned herself, and saith unto him, Rabboni; which is to say, Master.
- <u>17</u> Jesus saith unto her, Touch me not; for I am not yet ascended to my Father: but go to my brethren, and say unto them,
 - ascend unto my Father, and your Father; and to ask God, and your God.
- 18 Mary Magdalene came and told the disciples that she had seen the Lord, and *that* he had spo these things unto her.



- The angels ask Mary Magdalene why she is weeping.
- Mary Magdalene turns to leave, sees Jesus, doesn't recognize Him, and He asks why she is weeping.
- Mary Magdalene offers to care for the body of Jesus.
- Jesus calls her by name "Mary" and she immediately knows His voice and responds by calling Him "Master."
- Mary Magdalene goes from weeping to worshipping!
- Mary Magdalene wants to embrace the Lord Jesus, but He interrupts her with a directive – "...go to my brethren, and say unto them..."
- Mary Magdalene faithfully obeys.

<u>Jn. 20:18</u> Mary Magdalene came and told the disciples that she had seen the Lord, and that he had spoken these things unto her.

Conclusion

- Mary Magdalene was in horrible bondage to Satan.
- The Lord Jesus delivered her from spiritual bondage.
- Mary Magdalene faithfully followed the Lord Jesus Christ.
- Mary Magdalene was THE FIRST one to view the RISEN SAVIOR!

Jn. 6:37 All that the Father giveth me shall come to me; and him that cometh to me I will in no wise cast out.

Mt. 11:28 Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.

29 Take my yoke upon you, and learn of me; for I am meek and lowly in heart: and ye shall find rest unto your souls.
30 For my yoke *is* easy, and my burden is light.

Isa. 38:17 Behold, for peace I had great bitterness: but thou hast in love to my soul delivered it from the pit of corruption: for thou hast cast all my sins behind thy back.
