## THE MIND OF CHRIST AND THE MISSION OF THE CHURCH Phil. 2:5-11

Phil. 2:5 retains mind be in you, which was also in Christ

- Jesus:
- <u>6</u> Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God:
- <u>7</u> But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men:
- <u>8</u> And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.
- <u>9</u> Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name:
- <u>10</u> That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of things in heaven, and things in earth, and things under the earth;
- <u>11</u> And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

## I. THE PERCEPTION OF THE CONCEPT

Phil. 2:5 Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:

A. The Imperative – "Let this mind..."

Original Word: φρονέω Transliteration: phroneó Definition: (a) I think, (b) I think, judge, (c) I direct the mind to, seek for, (d) I observe, (e) I care for.

(phronéō) essentially equates to personal opinion fleshing itself out in action (see J. Thayer). This idea is difficult to translate into English because it combines the visceral and cognitive aspects of thinking. http://biblehub.com/greek/5426.htm Phil. 1:7 Even as it is meet for me to think this of you all, because I have you in my heart; inasmuch as both in my bonds, and in the defence and confirmation of the gospel, ye all are partakers of my grace.

<u>Phil. 2:2</u> Fulfil ye my joy, that ye be **likeminded**, having the same love, being of one accord, of one **mind**. ... <u>5</u> Let this **mind** be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:

<u>Phil. 3:15</u> Let us therefore, as many as be perfect, be thus **minded**: and if in any thing ye be otherwise **minded**, God shall reveal even this unto you.

<u>16</u> Nevertheless, whereto we have already attained, let us walk by the same rule, let us mind the same thing. ... <u>19</u> Whose end is destruction, whose God is their belly, and

whose glory is in their shame, who mind earthly things.)

Phil. 4:2 I beseech Euodias, and beseech Syntyche, that they be of the same mind in the Lord. ...

<u>10</u> But I rejoiced in the Lord greatly, that now at the last your **care** of me hath flourished again; wherein ye were also **careful**, but ye lacked opportunity.

<u>Mt. 16:23</u> But he turned, and said unto Peter, Get thee behind me, Satan: thou art an offence unto me: for thou **savourest** not the things that be of God, but **those that be of men**.

<u>Rom. 12:3</u> For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith.

<u>1 Cor. 13:11</u> When I was a child, I spake as a child, I **understood** as a child, I thought as a child: but when I became a man, I put away childish things.

<u>Col. 3:2</u> Set your **affection** on things above, not on things on the earth.

## How we think affects what we do!

<u>Mk. 7:21</u> For from within, **out of the heart** of men, **proceed** evil thoughts, adulteries, fornications, murders, <u>22</u> Thefts, covetousness, wickedness, deceit, lasciviousness, an evil eye, blasphemy, pride, foolishness:

Lu. 6:45 A good man **out of the good treasure of his heart** bringeth forth that which is good; and an evil man **out of the evil treasure of his heart** bringeth forth that which is evil: for of the abundance of the heart his mouth speaketh.

<u>Prov. 4:23</u> Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it are the issues of life.

B. The Influence – "....be in you..."

1. Have Fellowship with God, 2:6

a. Selflessness – 2:7 "...the form of a servant..."

<u>Mt. 23:11</u> But he that is **greatest** among you shall be your **servant**.

b. Submission – 2:8a "...humbled himself..."

<u>Acts 20:19</u> Serving the Lord with all humility of mind, and with many tears, and temptations, which befell me by the lying in wait of the Jews:

**Original Word:** ταπεινοφροσύνη **Transliteration:** tapeinophrosune **Definition:** humility, lowliness of mind, modesty.

In Scripture, tapeinophrosýnē ("lowliness, humility") is an inside-out virtue produced by comparing ourselves to the Lord (rather than to others). For the believer, tapeinophrosýnē ("humility") means living in complete dependence on the Lord, i.e. with no reliance on self (the flesh). <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/5012.htm</u>

c. Sacrifice – 2:8b "...obedient unto death..."

Rom. 12:1 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.

<u>2</u> And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.

2. Having Favor of God, 2:9-11 "...to the glory of God the Father."

<u>Phil. 1:11</u> Being filled with the fruits of righteousness, which are by Jesus Christ, unto the glory and praise of God.

<u>1 Cor. 4:5</u> Therefore judge nothing before the time, until the Lord come, who both will bring to light the hidden things of darkness, and will make manifest the counsels of the hearts: and then shall every man have praise of God.

C. The Imitation – "...which was also in Christ Jesus:"

<u>Rom. 6:4</u> Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that **like as Christ** was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, **even so we also should walk** in newness of life.

<u>1 Cor. 11:1</u> Be ye followers of me, even as I also am of Christ.

<u>Phil. 3:17</u> Brethren, be followers together of me, and mark them which walk so as ye have us for an ensample.



Jn. 15:8 Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit; so shall ye be my disciples.

<u>2 Thess. 1:10</u> When he shall come to be glorified in his saints, and to be admired in all them that believe (because our testimony among you was believed) in that day.

<u>Jas. 1:12</u> Blessed *is* the man that endureth temptation: for when he is tried, **he shall receive the crown of life**, which **the Lord hath promised to them that love him**.

Heb. 11:6 But without faith *it is* impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.

<u>Gal. 5:6</u> "...faith which worketh by love."

<u>Heb. 6:10</u> For God *is* not unrighteous to forget your work and labour of love, which ye have shewed toward his name, in that ye have ministered to the saints, and do minister.
