1. The Record of Warfare – "...things...heard..."

Prov. 20:11 Even a child is known by his doings, whether his work *be* pure, and whether *it be* right.

2. The Report of Witnesses – "...among many witnesses..."

A. The Endurance – <u>2 Tim. 2:3</u> Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ.

Original Word: συγκακοπαθέω **Transliteration:** sugkakopatheó **Definition:** I suffer hardships together with.

– properly, suffer together because closely-identified; to endure hardship with someone as a co-sufferer, i.e. as a true partner (comrade). It is only used in 2 Tim 1:8.

Mark 4:16 And these are they likewise which are sown on stony ground; who, when they have heard the word, immediately receive it with gladness; 17 And have no root in themselves, and so endure but for a time: afterward, when affliction or persecution ariseth for the word's sake, immediately they are offended. Jer. 9:3 And they bend their tongues *like* their bow *for* lies: **but they are not valiant for the truth upon the earth**; for they proceed from evil to evil, and they know not me, saith the LORD.

<u>Heb. 11:34</u> Quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong, waxed valiant in fight, turned to flight the armies of the aliens.

B. The Entanglement – <u>2 Tim. 2:4a</u> "No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of *this* life..."

"But once war is forced upon us, there is no other alternative than to apply every available means to bring it to a swift end...

C. The Expectation – <u>2 Tim. 2:4b</u> "...that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier."

1. Earning the Stripes – "...please him..."

Original Word: ἀρέσκω **Transliteration:** areskó **Definition:** I please, with the idea of willing service rendered to others;

Hence to please, winning someone's favor (affection, approval) because meeting their expectation.

2. Enlistment for Service – "...chosen...to be a soldier."

Original Word: στρατολογέω **Transliteration:** stratologeó **Definition:** I collect an army, enlist troops.

Performance proves that the purpose is becoming appropriate for the profession.
