Hab. 3:1 A prayer of Habakkuk the prophet upon Shigionoth.

<u>2</u> O LORD, I have heard thy speech, and was afraid: O LORD, revive thy work in the midst of the years, in the midst of the years make known; in wrath remember mercy.

<u>3</u> God came from Teman, and the Holy One from mount Paran. Selah. His glory covered the heavens, and the earth was full of his praise.

<u>4</u> And his brightness was as the light; he had horns coming out of his hand: and there was the hiding of his power.

5 Before him went the pestilence, and burning coals went forth at his feet.

Hab. 2:4b "...but the just shall live by his faith."

This hymn is similar in language and imagery to Deuteronomy 33, Psalm 18:4-19, and Psalm 68. Its structure is chiastic. (See Psa. 17, 86, 90, 102, 142 for other "prayer psalms.")

III. <u>THE PROPHET IS TRIUMPHANT</u> (Worshipping and Witnessing) – 3:1-19

A. Faith Submits, 3:1-2

<u>Hab. 3:1</u> A prayer of Habakkuk the prophet upon Shigionoth. <u>2</u> O LORD, I have heard thy speech, and was afraid: O LORD, revive thy work in the midst of the years, in the midst of the years make known; in wrath remember mercy.

1. Habakkuk's Response to Revelation, 3:1-2a

<u>Hab. 3:1</u> A prayer of Habakkuk the prophet upon Shigionoth. <u>2</u> O LORD, I have heard thy speech, and was afraid...

Job 28:28 And unto man he said, Behold, the fear of the Lord, that is wisdom; and to depart from evil is understanding.

<u>Psa. 111:10</u> The fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom: a good understanding have all they that do his commandments: his praise endureth for ever.

<u>Prov. 1:7</u> The fear of the LORD is the beginning of knowledge: but fools despise wisdom and instruction.

<u>Prov. 8:13</u> The fear of the LORD is to hate evil: pride, and arrogancy, and the evil way, and the froward mouth, do I hate.

Prov. 14:27 The fear of the LORD is a fountain of life, to depart from the snares of death.

Prov. 15:16 Better is little with the fear of the LORD than great treasure and trouble therewith.

<u>Prov. 16:6</u> By mercy and truth iniquity is purged: and by the fear of the LORD men depart from evil.

Minor Prophets... <u>Prov. 22:4</u> By humility and the fear of the LORD are riches, and honour, and life.

Prov. 23:17 Let not thine heart envy sinners: but be thou in the fear of the LORD all the day long.

(<u>Psa. 119</u>)

Isa. 66:2 For all those things hath mine hand made, and all those things have been, saith the LORD: but to this man will I look, even to him that is poor and of a contrite spirit, and trembleth at my word.

Rom. 10:17 So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

Jas. 4:8 Draw nigh to God, and he will draw nigh to you. Cleanse your hands, ye sinners; and purify your hearts, ye double minded.

2. Habakkuk's Request for Revival, 3:2b – "...O LORD, revive thy work in the midst of the years, in the midst of the years make known; in wrath remember mercy."

Isa. 59:16 And he saw that there was no man, and wondered that there was no intercessor...

B. Faith Sees, 3:3-15

1. The Lord's Presence, 3:3-5

a. The Region, 3:3

Hab. 3:3 God came from Teman, and the Holy One from mount Paran. Selah. His glory covered the heavens, and the earth was full of his praise.

b. The Resplendence, 3:4

c. The Result, 3:5

2. The Lord's Power, 3:6-9a

a. Rending the World, 3:6-7

<u>Hab. 3:6</u> He stood, and measured the earth: he beheld, and drove asunder the nations; and the everlasting mountains were scattered, the perpetual hills did bow: his ways are everlasting. <u>7</u> I saw the tents of Cushan in affliction: and the curtains of the land of Midian did tremble.

i. Methodically, 3:6

Isa. 53:5 But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed.

<u>Nah. 1:5</u> The mountains quake at him, and the hills melt, and the earth is burned at his presence, yea, the world, and all that dwell therein. *Major Message*

ii. Mindfully, 3:7

Hab. 3:7 I saw the tents of Cushan in affliction: and the curtains of the land of Midian did tremble.

Jud. 3:8 Therefore the anger of the LORD was hot against Israel, and he sold them into the hand of **Chushanrishathaim king of Mesopotamia**: and the children of Israel served Chushanrishathaim eight years. <u>10</u> And the Spirit of the LORD came upon him, and he judged Israel, and went out to war: and the LORD delivered Chushanrishathaim king of Mesopotamia into his hand; and his hand prevailed against Chushanrishathaim.

b. Riding the Waves, 3:8

<u>Hab. 3:8</u> Was the LORD displeased against the rivers? was thine anger against the rivers? was thy wrath against the sea, that thou didst ride upon thine horses and thy chariots of salvation?

<u>Isa. 63:1</u> Who is this that cometh from Edom, with dyed garments from Bozrah? this that is **glorious in his apparel**, travelling in the greatness of his strength? I that speak in righteousness, mighty to save.

2 Wherefore art thou red in thine apparel, and thy garments like him that treadeth in the winefat?

<u>3</u> I have trodden the winepress alone; and of the people there was none with me: for I will tread them in mine anger, and trample them in my fury; and their blood shall be sprinkled upon my garments, and I will stain all my raiment.

<u>4</u> For the day of vengeance is in mine heart, and the year of my redeemed is come.

5 And I looked, and there was none to help; and I wondered that there was none to uphold: therefore mine own arm brought salvation unto me; and my fury, it upheld me.

<u>6</u> And I will tread down the people in mine anger, and make them drunk in my fury, and I will bring down their strength to the earth.Major Message

c. Remembering the Word, 3:9a – "Thy bow was made quite naked, according to the oaths of the tribes, even thy word. Selah..."
