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1. The Reflection of Christ, 1:27

a. Life of Christ Manifested Consistently, 1:27a – "Only let your conversation be as it becometh the gospel of Christ..."

Original Word: πολιτεύομαι **Transliteration:** politeuomai **Short Definition:** I live the life of a citizen

<u>Acts 23:1</u> And Paul, earnestly beholding the council, said, Men and brethren, I have lived in all good conscience before God until this day.

<u>Phil. 3:20</u> For our **conversation** is in heaven; from whence also we look for the Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ:

b. Life of the Church Mirrors Christ, 1:27b – "...that whether I come and see you, or else be absent, I may hear of your affairs, that ye stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel;"

Original Word: συναθλέω Transliteration: sunathleó Definition: I compete together with others, cooperate vigorously with, striving together.

2. The Resolution of Courage, 1:28

<u>1:28</u> And in nothing terrified by your adversaries: which is to them an evident token of perdition, but to you of salvation, and that of God.

 Be strong, and in NOTHING terrified by adversaries = faith in spite of fear

Josh. 1:9 Have not I commanded thee? Be strong and of a good courage; be not afraid, neither be thou dismayed: for the LORD thy God is with thee whithersoever thou goest.

<u>Heb. 13:5</u> Let your conversation be without covetousness; and be content with such things as ye have: for he hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee. •"...an evident token..." = revealing authenticity of true character and relationship

Original Word: ἕνδειξις **Transliteration:** endeixis **Definition:** a showing, proof, demonstration, sign, token.

Cognate: éndeiksis – (a brand of) display, emphasizing the character of the demonstration which is made obvious (undeniable, conspicuous). <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/1732.htm</u>

endeíknymi – properly, to make fully evident, showing conspicuous proof which demonstrates something as undeniable. The prefix (en) adds the dimension of "abiding condition" making the "showing forth" on "open display" for all to see, i.e. obvious so "no one could miss it." <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/1731.htm</u> 3. a. The Inevitable Conflict, 1:29

<u>1:29</u> For unto you it is given in the behalf of Christ, not only to believe on him, but also to suffer for his sake;

<u>1 Jn. 3:13</u> Marvel not, my brethren, if the world hate you.

2 Tim. 3:12 Yea, and all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution. 13 But evil men and seducers shall wax worse and worse, deceiving, and being deceived.

b. The Identifiable Conflict, 1:30

<u>1:30</u> Having the same conflict which ye saw in me, and now hear to be in me.

<u>1 Cor. 10:13</u> There hath no temptation taken you but such as is common to man: but God *is* faithful, who will not suffer you to be tempted above that ye are able; but will with the temptation also make a way to escape, that ye may be able to bear *it*.



Jas. 1:2 My brethren, **count it all joy** when ye fall into divers temptations;

<u>1 Pet. 4:13</u> But **rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings**; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye **may be glad also with exceeding joy**.

<u>3 Jn. 1:4</u> I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth.
