Phil. 1:27 Only let your conversation be as it becometh the gospel of Christ: that whether I come and see you, or else be absent, I may hear of your affairs, that ye stand fast in one spirit, with one mind striving together for the faith of the gospel;

Rom 12:10 Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another; ... 16 Be of the same mind one toward another. Mind not high things, but condescend to men of low estate. Be not wise in your own conceits.

 - 1. The Implication, 2:1 "If *there be* therefore any consolation in Christ, if any comfort of love, if any fellowship of the Spirit, if any bowels and mercies,"

a. The Consolation – "If there be therefore any consolation in Christ..."

Original Word: παράκλησις

Transliteration: paraklésis

Definition: a calling for, summons, hence: (a) exhortation, (b) entreaty, (c) encouragement, joy, gladness, (d) **consolation**.

paráklēsis – properly, a personal exhortation that delivers the "evidence that stands up in God's court."

paráklēsis ("holy urging") is used of the Lord directly motivating and inspiring believers to carry out His plan

Phil. 2:5 Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:

b. The Comfort – "...if any comfort of love..."

Original Word: παραμύθιον

Transliteration: paramuthion

Definition: comfort, an exhortation, persuasion,

encouragement.

Paramýthion – comfort produced by using soothing words (actions). paramýthion focuses on the principle and results of comfort (being consoled).

Psa. 51:4 "Against thee, thee only, have I sinned, and done this evil in thy sight..."

c. The Communion – "...if any fellowship of the Spirit..."

Original Word: Kolvwvia **Transliteration:** kolnónia

Definition: (lit: partnership) (a) contributory help, participation, (b) sharing in, communion, (c) **spiritual fellowship, a fellowship in the spirit**.

d. The Compassion – "...if any bowels and mercies..."

Original Word: σπλάγχνα

Transliteration: splagchnon

Short Definition: bowels, compassion, pity

Definition: the inward parts; the heart, affections, seat of

the feelings or emotion.

"mercies"

Original Word: οἰκτιρμός **Transliteration:** οἰκτιρμός

Definition: pity, compassion, favor, grace, **mercy**.

oiktirmós is used of the deep feelings God has for all of us, and powerfully shows and shares in those following Him.

<u>Conclusion</u>

- Rom 12:1 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God, which is your reasonable service.

 2 And be not conformed to this world: but be ye transformed by the renewing of your mind, that ye may prove what is that good, and acceptable, and perfect, will of God.
- <u>3</u> For I say, through the grace given unto me, to every man that is among you, not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think; but to think soberly, according as God hath dealt to every man the measure of faith.
