Principles for Planting

Acts 13:1 Now there were in the church that was at Antioch certain prophets and teachers; as Barnabas, and Simeon that was called Niger, and Lucius of Cyrene, and Manaen, which had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch, and Saul.

<u>2</u> As they ministered to the Lord, and fasted, the Holy Ghost said, Separate me Barnabas and Saul for the work whereunto I have called them.
<u>3</u> And when they had fasted and prayed, and laid their

hands on them, they sent them away.

B. Involvement developing Opportunity, Acts 13:13-14




Acts 13:13 Now when Paul and his company loosed from Paphos, they came to Perga in Pamphylia: and John departing from them returned to Jerusalem.

<u>14</u> But when they departed from Perga, they came to Antioch in Pisidia, and went into the synagogue on the sabbath day, and sat down.

- <u>24</u> And after they had passed throughout Pisidia, they came to Pamphylia.
- <u>25</u> And when they had preached the word in Perga, they went down into Attalia:

<u>26</u> And thence sailed to Antioch, from whence they had been recommended to the grace of God for the work which they fulfilled.

27 And when they were come, and had gathered the church together, they rehearsed all that God had done with them, and how he had opened the door of faith unto the Gentiles.
28 And there they abode long time with the disciples.







II. THE CHURCH, THE MECHANISM FOR EVANGELISM

A. The Authority to Initiate, Acts 13:1, 14:26

Acts 13:1 Now there were in the church that was at Antioch certain prophets and teachers; ... <u>3</u> And when they had fasted and prayed, and laid *their* hands on them, they sent *them* away.

Acts 14:26 And thence sailed to Antioch, from whence they had been recommended to the grace of God for the work which they fulfilled.

B. The Assurance for Indemnity, <u>Acts 14:26, 15:35,</u> <u>18:22-23</u> Acts 14:26 And thence sailed to Antioch, from whence they had been recommended to the grace of God for the work which they fulfilled.

<u>Acts 15:35</u> Paul also and Barnabas continued in Antioch, teaching and preaching the word of the Lord, with many others also.

Acts 18:22 And when he had landed at Caesarea, and gone up, and saluted the church, he went down to Antioch. 23 And after he had spent some time *there*, he departed, and went over *all* the country of Galatia and Phrygia in order, strengthening all the disciples.

7 Principles for Church Planting According to the NT Pattern By Joseph Mattera

- 1. Church planters were sent; they did not just volunteer to go.
- 2. Church planters were nurtured first under apostolic church leadership.
- 3. Planters had a clear leading of the Lord that was confirmed by the church.
- 4. They went into cultural contexts they were prepared for.
- 5. They had a leadership team.
- 6. They had financial backing.

7. They planted congregations that stayed connected to the founding apostolic leader.
