The Book of ZECHARIAH Zech. 1:7-17



Zech. 1:7 Upon the four and twentieth day of the eleventh month, which *is* the month Sebat, in the second year of Darius, came the word of the LORD unto Zechariah, the son of Berechiah, the son of Iddo the prophet, saying,

<u>8</u> I saw by night, and behold a man riding upon a red horse, and he stood among the myrtle trees that *were* in the bottom; and behind him *were there* red horses, speckled, and white. <u>9</u> Then said I, O my lord, what *are* these? And the angel that talked with me said unto me, I will shew thee what these *be*. <u>10</u> And the man that stood among the myrtle trees answered and said, These *are they* whom the LORD hath sent to walk to and fro through the earth.

a. The Four Horses, 1:7-17

(1) The Imperialist Powers, 1:7-11

(a) Their Coming, 1:7-8a

(b) Their Character, 1:8b

...Major Message

Zech. 1:8b "...riding upon a red horse, and he stood among the myrtle trees that *were* in the bottom; and behind him *were there* red horses, speckled, and white."

<u>Rev. 6:4</u> And there went out another horse that was red: and *power* was given to him that sat thereon to take peace from the earth, and that they should kill one another: and there was given unto him a great sword.

(c) Their Commission, 1:9-10

<u>Zech. 1:9</u> Then said I, O my lord, what *are* these? And the angel that talked with me said unto me, I will shew thee what these *be*. <u>10</u> And the man that stood among the myrtle trees answered and said, These *are they* whom the LORD hath sent to walk to and fro through the earth.

(d) Their Complacency, 1:11

Zech. 1:11 And they answered the angel of the LORD that stood among the myrtle trees, and said, We have walked to and fro through the earth, and, behold, all the earth sitteth still, and is at rest.

(2) The Impassioned Plea, 1:12-17

Zech. 1:12 Then the angel of the LORD answered and said, O LORD of hosts, how long wilt thou not have mercy on Jerusalem and on the cities of Judah, against which thou hast had indignation these threescore and ten years?

(a) The Plight of Jerusalem, 1:12

Zech. 1:12 Then the angel of the LORD answered and said, O LORD of hosts, how long wilt thou not have mercy on Jerusalem and on the cities of Judah, against which thou hast had indignation these threescore and ten years?

Jer. 25:12 And it shall come to pass, when seventy years are accomplished, *that* I will punish the king of Babylon, and that nation, saith the LORD, for their iniquity, and the land of the Chaldeans, and will make it perpetual desolations.

Jer. 29:10 For thus saith the LORD, That after seventy years be accomplished at Babylon I will visit you, and perform my good word toward you, in causing you to return to this place.

(b) The Pledge of Jehovah, 1:13-17

i. The Lord's Command Exceeded, 1:13-15

Zech. 1:13 And the LORD answered the angel that talked with me *with* good words *and* comfortable words. <u>14</u> So the angel that communed with me said unto me, Cry thou, saying, Thus saith the LORD of hosts; I am jealous for Jerusalem and for Zion with a great jealousy. <u>15</u> And I am very sore displeased with the heathen *that are* at ease: for I was but a little displeased, and they helped forward the affliction.

ii. The Lord's Coming Explained,1:16-17

Minor Prophets... Conclusion
