I. WALK BY FAITH

Col. 2:6 As ye have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk ye in him:

A. Consider Reception of Christ – "As ye have therefore received Christ Jesus the Lord..."

<u>Eph. 2:8</u> For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: *it is* the gift of God:
<u>9</u> Not of works, lest any man should boast.
<u>10</u> For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.

B. Conduct Required for Christians – "...so walk ye in him:"

Original Word: περιπατέω **Transliteration:** peripateó **Short Definition:** I walk, **I conduct my life**, live. <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/4043.htm</u>

Rom. 6:4 "...even so we also should walk in newness of life."

Rom. 13:13 "Let us walk honestly..."

<u>2 Cor. 5:7</u> (For we walk by faith, not by sight:)

Gal. 5:16 This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh.

Eph. 4:1 "...walk worthy of the vocation wherewith ye are called,"

Eph. 5:8 For ye were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light:

Col. 4:5 Walk in wisdom toward them that are without, redeeming the time.

<u>1 Thess. 4:1</u> "...ye ought to walk and to please God, so ye would abound more and more."

<u>1 Jn. 1:6</u> If we say that we have fellowship with him, and walk in darkness, we lie, and do not the truth:
<u>7</u> But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin. <u>1 Jn. 2:6</u> He that saith he abideth in him ought himself also so to walk, even as he walked.

<u>2 Jn. 1:4</u> I rejoiced greatly that I found of thy children walking in truth, as we have received a commandment from the Father. ...

<u>6</u> And this is love, that we walk after his commandments. This is the commandment, That, as ye have heard from the beginning, ye should walk in it.

<u>3 Jn. 1:4</u> I have no greater joy than to hear that my children walk in truth.

II. WORK ON THE FOUNDATION

<u>Col. 2:7</u> Rooted and built up in him, and stablished in the faith, as ye have been taught, abounding therein with thanksgiving.

A. The Starting Point – "Rooted and built up in him..."

Original Word: ἐποικοδομέω **Transliteration:** epoikodomeó **Definition:** I build upon (above) a foundation.

Properly, appropriately build on, following a plan with predesigned (pre-defined) specifications. http://biblehub.com/greek/2026.htm <u>1 Cor. 3:11</u> For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ.

Eph. 3:17 That Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith; that ye, being rooted and grounded in love,

B. To Stabilize Perspective – "...stablished in the faith..."

Acts 16:5 And so were the churches established in the faith, and increased in number daily.

<u>1 Cor. 16:13</u> Watch ye, stand fast in the faith, quit you like men, be strong.

<u>2 Cor. 13:5</u> Examine yourselves, whether ye be **in the faith**; prove your own selves. Know ye not your own selves, how that Jesus Christ is in you, except ye be reprobates?

<u>1 Tim. 4:1</u> Now the Spirit speaketh expressly, that in the latter times some shall depart from **the faith**, giving heed to seducing spirits, and doctrines of devils;

2 Tim. 4:7 I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith:

C. The Staying Points – "...abounding therein with thanksgiving."

<u>1 Cor. 15:57</u> But **thanks** *be* to God, which **giveth** us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

<u>Col. 3:17</u> And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, *do* all in the name of the Lord Jesus, **giving thanks** to God and the Father by him.

<u>1 Thess. 5:18</u> In every thing **give thanks**: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you.

<u>Heb. 13:15</u> By him therefore let us offer the sacrifice of praise to God continually, that is, the fruit of *our* lips **giving thanks** to his name.

III. WITHSTAND FOES

<u>Col. 2:8</u> Beware lest any man spoil you through philosophy and vain deceit, after the tradition of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not after Christ.

A. Stay on Watch – "Beware lest any man spoil you..."

B. Sense the Worldliness – "...after the tradition of men, after the rudiments of the world, and not after Christ."

Original Word: στοιχεῖον Transliteration: stoicheion Definition: (a) plur: the heavenly bodies, (b) a rudiment, an element, a rudimentary principle, an elementary rule.

Properly, *fundamentals*, like with **the** *basic components* of a philosophy, structure, etc.; (figuratively) "first principles," like the basic fundamentals of Christianity. http://biblehub.com/greek/4747.htm

Definition – rudiments.

The elements or first principles of a subject: A mere beginning, first slight appearance, or undeveloped or imperfect form of something: <u>http://dictionary.reference.com/browse/rudiment?s=t</u>

IV. WORSHIP HIS FULNESS

<u>Col. 2:9</u> For in him dwelleth all the fulness of the Godhead bodily.

A. The Perpetual Resource – "For in him dwelleth..."

Original Word: κατοικέω **Transliteration:** katoikeó **Definition:** I dwell in, settle in, am established in (permanently), inhabit.

Properly, settle *down* as a permanent resident, i.e. in a *fixed* (*permanent*) dwelling place as one's personal residence; (figuratively) "to be *exactly at home*." [The force of the prefix (*katá*) suggests "*down* to the finest, exact details."]

B. The Perfect Reflection – "…all the fulness of the Godhead bodily."

Original Word: πλήρωμα **Transliteration:** pléróma **Short Definition:** fullness, fulfillment, completion <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/4138.htm</u> Phil. 4:6 Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with **thanksgiving** let your requests be made known unto God.
