Heb. 12:1-2

"Building the Bridge to Keep Building Bridges"

Heb. 12:1 Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset *us*, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, 2 Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of *our* faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.

### I. THE OPERATION OF BRIDGE BUILDING, 12:1

Heb. 12:1 Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset *us*, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us,

A. The Motivation to Keep Building

Others have built them – "Wherefore seeing we also are compassed about with so great a cloud of witnesses..."

### B. The Methods to Keep Building

Eliminate the encumbrances – "...let us lay aside every weight..."

Original Word: ὄγκος

**Transliteration:** ogkos

**Definition:** (properly: bulk, mass, hence) a weight, burden,

encumbrance.

# Abraham and Isaac – perhaps the offering of Isaac was the removal of a "weight"

- Eradicate the evil "...and the sin..."
- Envision the encircling "...which doth so easily beset us..."

Original Word: εὐπερίστατος

Transliteration: euperistatos

**Definition:** easily beset, surrounding, encircling, easily

distracted.

A serious hindrance that "encircles" (hampers) someone who desperately needs to advance.

Weights and sins so easily encircle us, inhibiting us as we try to "run the race" that God has intended for our lives. A loose shoelace can trip up the most experienced runner!

Endure the engagement – "...let us run with patience..."

**Original Word:** τρέχω **Transliteration:** trechó

**Definition:** I run, exercise myself, make progress.

Original Word: ὑπομονή

Transliteration: hupomoné

**Definition:** endurance, steadfastness, patient waiting for or

patience

Properly, remaining under, endurance; steadfastness, especially as God enables the believer to "remain (endure) under" the challenges He allots in life.

In the NT the characteristic of a man who is not swerved from his deliberate purpose and his loyalty to faith and piety by even the greatest trials and sufferings.

<u>Jas. 1:3</u> Knowing *this*, that the trying of your faith worketh patience.

4 But let patience have her perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing.

End the encounter – "...the race that is set before us,"

**Original Word:** ἀγών

Transliteration: agón

**Definition:** an (athletic) contest, race, conflict; hence, a struggle (in the soul).

In the ancient world, athletic contests could be so severe they caused the toughest men to crumble. Indeed, this was common (so Euripedes, Xenophon).]

Phil. 1:30 Having the same conflict which ye saw in me, and now hear to be in me.

<u>Col. 2:1</u> For I would that ye knew what great **conflict** I have for you, and *for* them at Laodicea, and *for* as many as have not seen my face in the flesh;

1 Thess. 2:2 But even after that we had suffered before, and were shamefully entreated, as ye know, at Philippi, we were bold in our God to speak unto you the gospel of God with much contention.

1 Tim. 6:12 Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and hast professed a good profession before many witnesses.

Original Word: πρόκειμαι

Transliteration: prokeimai

**Definition:** I am **set** (placed, put) before, am already there.

 God "set" the purpose, the "race" itself, not just the path for our life's race.

The Apostle Paul's attitude when he was building bridges is seen in Acts 20:24:

Acts 20:24 But none of these things move me, neither count I my life dear unto myself, so that I might finish my course with joy, and the ministry, which I have received of the Lord Jesus, to testify the gospel of the grace of God.

His attitude at the end is seen in 2 Tim. 4:7.

2 Tim. 4:7 I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith:

Note: What Paul had taught about John the Baptist:

Acts 13:25 And as John fulfilled his course, he said, Whom think ye that I am? I am not he. But, behold, there cometh one after me, whose shoes of his feet I am not worthy to loose.

### II. THE OBJECTIVE OF BRIDGE BUILDING. 12:2

Heb. 12:2 Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of *our* faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.

A. The Focusing of our Purpose – "Looking unto Jesus the author and finish of *our* faith..."

Look to the Lord – "Looking unto Jesus..."

Original Word: ἀφοράω

Transliteration: aphoraó

**Definition:** I look away from (something else) to, see

distinctly.

Properly, "looking away from all else, to fix one's gaze upon" (Abbott-Smith). <a href="http://biblehub.com/greek/872.htm">http://biblehub.com/greek/872.htm</a>

To turn the eyes away from other things and fix them on something

Learn the lesson – "...the author and finisher of our faith..."

The Lord Jesus Christ is the Founder

Original Word: ἀρχηγός

Transliteration: archégos

**Definition:** originator, author, founder, prince, leader.

Acts 3:15 And killed the Prince of life, whom God hath raised from the dead; whereof we are witnesses.

Acts 5:31 Him hath God exalted with his right hand to be a **Prince** and a Saviour, for to give repentance to Israel, and forgiveness of sins.

Heb. 2:10 For it became him, for whom *are* all things, and by whom *are* all things, in bringing many sons unto glory, to make the captain of their salvation perfect through sufferings.

The Lord Jesus Christ is the Finisher

Original Word: τελειωτής

**Transliteration:** teleiótés

**Definition:** a perfecter, completer, finisher.

Properly, a consummator, bringing a process to its finish (used only in Heb 12:2).

This specifically refers to Jesus, the one bringing the life of faith to its complete conclusion (consummation, finish).

Phil. 1:6 Being confident of this very thing, that he which hath begun a good work in you will perform it until the day of Jesus Christ:

<u>Eph. 4:13</u> Till we all come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ:

<u>Col. 1:28</u> Whom we preach, warning every man, and teaching every man in all wisdom; that we may present every man perfect in Christ Jesus:

<u>Col. 4:12</u> Epaphras, who is *one* of you, a servant of Christ, saluteth you, always labouring fervently for you in prayers, that ye may stand perfect and complete in all the will of God.

Heb. 5:14 But strong meat belongeth to them that are of full age, even those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil.

<u>Jas. 1:4</u> But let patience have *her* perfect work, that ye may be perfect and entire, wanting nothing.

1 Jn. 4:18 There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear: because fear hath torment. He that feareth is not made perfect in love.

B. The Finishing of our Passion – "...who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God."

- Enjoy the end "...who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross..."
  - Enjoy the vision "...who for the joy that was set before him..."
  - Endure for victory "...endured the cross, despising the shame..."

Original Word: ὑπομένω

Transliteration: hupomenó

**Definition:** (a) I remain behind, (b) I stand my ground, show

endurance, (c) I endure, bear up against, persevere.

 Exalt the Eternal One – "...and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God."

1 Pet. 5:11 To him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

2 Pet. 3:18 But grow in grace, and *in* the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. To him *be* glory both now and for ever. Amen.

Rom. 11:36 For of him, and through him, and to him, are all things: to whom be glory for ever. Amen.
