- Control your thoughts. "...call to remembrance..."
- Concentrate on your enlightenment. "...after ye were illuminated..."
- Consider your endurance. "...ye endured a great fight of afflictions."
- Companionship cost you. "…ye were made a gazingstock…whilst ye became companions…"

Original Word: θεατρίζω **Transliteration:** theatrizó **Definition:** I make a public show of, a gazingstock, to expose to public shame.

Cognate: 2301 *theatrízō* (from 2302 */théatron*, "theatre") – to ridicule, making a *public spectacle* out of someone, putting them on *exhibit* for *public jest* and *mockery* (used only in Heb 10:33). <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/2301.htm</u>

II. <u>N – NOW LIVE BY FAITH, Heb. 12:38-39</u>

<u>Heb. 12:38</u> Now the just shall live by faith: but if *any man* draw back, my soul shall have no pleasure in him. <u>39</u> But we are not of them who draw back unto perdition; but of them that believe to the saving of the soul.



- Place the emphasis on the immediate. "Now..."
- Pinpoint your standing with the Lord. "...the just shall live by faith..."
- Put the pleasure in the proper place. "...draw back...no pleasure..."
- Provide a perspective of difference. "…we are not of them who draw back unto perdition; but of them that believe to the saving of the soul."



III. <u>A – ASSURE YOURSELF OF REWARDS, Heb. 10:35</u>

Heb. 10:35 Cast not away therefore your confidence, which hath great recompence of reward.

- Hold on with assurance. "Cast not away...your confidence..."
- Hold on with affection. "...great recompence of reward."



IV. <u>P – PERSEVERE WITH PATIENCE FOR THE PROMISE, Heb. 10:36-37</u>

Heb. 10:36 For ye have need of patience, that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise. 37 For yet a little while, and he that shall come will come, and will not tarry.

- Persevere with patience for the promise. "…ye have need of patience…might receive the promise."
- Prioritize your life. "...after ye have done the will of God..."
- Prepare for the inevitable promise. "...he...will come and will not tarry."
