

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2. Testings are for our profit, 1:12

<u>Jas. 1:12</u> Blessed is the man that endureth temptation: for when he is tried, he shall receive the crown of life, which the Lord hath promised to them that love him.

a. The crisis endured, 1:12a "Blessed *is* the man that endureth temptation..."

makarios: blessed, happy Original Word: μακάριος Transliteration: makarios Short Definition: happy, blessed

**3107** makários (from mak-, "become long, large") – properly, when God extends His benefits (the advantages *He confers*); blessed.

<u>3107</u> /makários ("blessed") describes a believer in *enviable* ("fortunate") position from receiving *God's provisions* (*favor*) – which (literally) *extend* ("make long, large") His grace (benefits). This happens with receiving (obeying) the Lord's inbirthings of faith. Hence, faith (<u>4102</u> /pístis) and <u>3107</u> (*makários*) are closely associated (Ro 4:5-7,14:22,23; Rev 14:12,13). http://biblehub.com/greek/3107.htm Mt. 5:3 2 Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

<u>4</u> **Blessed** are they that mourn: for they shall be comforted.

5 Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth.

<u>6</u> **Blessed** *are* they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled.

<u>7</u> **Blessed** are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy.

<u>8</u> **Blessed** *are* the pure in heart: for they shall see God.

<u>9</u> **Blessed** *are* the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God.

<u>10</u> **Blessed** *are* they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

<u>11</u> **Blessed** are ye, when *men* shall revile you, and persecute *you*, and shall say all manner of evil against you falsely, for my sake. <u>12</u> **Rejoice, and be exceeding glad: for great** *is* **your reward in heaven**: for so persecuted they the prophets which were before you.



Jn. 13:17 If ye know these things, happy are ye if ye do them.

Jas. 1:25 But whoso looketh into the perfect law of liberty, and continueth *therein*, he being not a forgetful hearer, but a doer of the work, this man shall be **blessed** in his deed.

<u>1 Pet. 3:14</u> But and if ye suffer for righteousness' sake, **happy** *are ye*: and be not afraid of their terror, neither be troubled;

<u>1 Pet. 4:14</u> If ye be reproached for the name of Christ, happy are ye; for the spirit of glory and of God resteth upon you: on their part he is evil spoken of, but on your part he is glorified.

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# Jas. 1:12 "Blessed *is* the man that **endureth temptation...**"

hupomenó: to stay behind, to await, **endure** Original Word: ὑπομένω Transliteration: hupomenó Definition: (a) I remain behind, (b) I stand my ground, show endurance, (c) I endure, bear up against, persevere.

*hypoménō* – **literally**, *remaining under* (the load), bearing up (enduring); for the believer, this uniquely happens by *God's* power (cf. <u>1 Thess. 3:5</u>). <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/5278.htm</u>




<u>1 Thess. 3:5</u> For this cause, when I could no longer forbear, I sent to know your faith, lest by some means the tempter have tempted you, and our labour be in vain.


<u>Mt. 4:3</u> And when the tempter came to him, he said, If thou be the Son of God, command that these stones be made bread.

b. The crown ensured, 1:12b "...for when he is tried, he shall receive the **crown of life**, which **the Lord hath promised to them that love him**.

<u>Deut. 6:5</u> And thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might. (10:12, 11:13, 13:3, Josh. 22:5)

<u>Deut. 30:16</u> In that I command thee this day to **love the LORD thy God**, to walk in his ways, and to keep his commandments and his statutes and his judgments, that thou mayest live and multiply: and the LORD thy God shall bless thee in the land whither thou goest to possess it. ## B. The Temptations of the Christian life, 1:13-16

Jas. 1:13 Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God: for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempteth he any man:

<u>14</u> But every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed.

<u>15</u> Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death.

<u>16</u> Do not err, my beloved brethren.

1. The source of temptation, 1:13-15

a. What we must realize, 1:13

Jas. 1:13 Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God: for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempteth he any man:

(1) Recording a common error, 1:13a "Let no man say when he is tempted, I am tempted of God..."

(2) Refuting a common error, 1:13b "...for God cannot be tempted with evil, neither tempteth he any man:"

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b. What we must recognize, 1:14-15

Jas. 1:14 But every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed.

<u>15</u> Then when lust hath conceived, it bringeth forth sin: and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death.

This is spiritual LSD = Lust -> Sin -> Death

## (1) The mother of sin, 1:14-15a

<u>Jas. 1:14</u> "But every man is tempted, when he is drawn away of his own lust, and enticed. 15 Then when lust hath conceived..."

epithumia: desire, passionate longing, lust Original Word: ἐπιθυμία Transliteration: epithumia Definition: desire, eagerness for, inordinate desire, lust.

**Cognate: 1939** *epithymía* (from <u>1909</u> /*epí*, "focused *on*" and <u>2372</u> /*thymós*, "passionate desire") – properly, *passion* built *on* strong feelings (urges). These can be positive or negative, depending on whether the desire is *inspired by faith* (God's inbirthed *persuasion*). <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/1939.htm</u>

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exelkó: to draw out or away Original Word: ἐξέλκω Transliteration: exelkó Definition: (lit: I draw out of the right place, or I draw aside out of the right way), I entice. http://biblehub.com/greek/1828.htm

deleazó: to lure Original Word: δελεάζω Transliteration: deleazó Short Definition: I allure, entice (by a bait)

*deleázō* (from *delear*, "bait") – properly, to *bait* a hook or set a trap with bait; (figuratively) *entice* a victim into a moral trap, luring them in through their own *selfish impulses*. <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/1185.htm</u>

Lust – when a desire becomes a distraction that leads to debate, luring a believer away from the will of God. <u>Gal. 5:17</u> For the flesh lusteth against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh: and these are contrary the one to the other: so that ye cannot do the things that ye would.

You cannot keep birds from flying over your head, but you can keep them from nesting in your hair.

Jas. 1:15 "Then when lust hath conceived..."

Original Word: εἶτα Part of Speech: Adverb – denoting sequence Transliteration: eita Definition: **then**, thereafter, next (marking a fresh stage); therefore, then, furthermore.

**1534** *eíta* (a primitive, temporal adverb communicating *time*) – *next* (in succession), *after that* ("*then*"). <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/1534.htm</u>

sullambanó: to collect, i.e. to take, by impl. to take part with, **spec. to conceive** Original Word: συλλαμβάνω Transliteration: sullambanó Definition: I seize, apprehend, assist, conceive, become pregnant <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/4815.htm</u> Conception denotes beginning or existence of something.

tiktó: to beget, bring forth Original Word: τίκτω Transliteration: tiktó Definition: I bear, bring forth, produce, beget, yield. <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/5088.htm</u>

When the germination of lust, joins with the flesh, and is acted upon, sin begins.

### (2) The method of sin, 1:15b "...it bringeth forth sin..."

<u>1 Jn. 2:15</u> Love not the world, neither the things *that are* in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him.

<u>16</u> For all that *is* in the world, the **lust of the flesh**, and the **lust of the eyes**, and the **pride of life**, is not of the Father, but is of the world.


<u>1 Pet. 2:11</u> Dearly beloved, I beseech *you* as strangers and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts, which war against the soul;

(3) The maturity of sin, 1:15c "...and sin, when it is finished, bringeth forth death."

<u>Rom. 6:21</u> What fruit had ye then in those things whereof ye are now ashamed? for **the end of those things** *is* **death**. <u>22</u> But now being made free from sin, and become servants to God, ye have your fruit unto holiness, and the end everlasting life. <u>23</u> For **the wages of sin** *is* **death**; but the gift of God *is* eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Rom. 8:6 For to be carnally minded *is* death; but to be spiritually minded *is* life and peace. (Isa. 26:3)





2. The subtlety of temptation, 1:16

Jas. 1:16 Do not err, my beloved brethren.

<u>2 Cor. 2:11</u> Lest Satan should get an advantage of us: for we are not ignorant of **his devices**.

<u>1 Cor. 6:9</u> Know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? **Be not deceived**: neither fornicators, nor idolaters, nor adulterers, nor effeminate, nor abusers of themselves with mankind,

<u>1Cor. 15:33</u> **Be not deceived**: evil communications corrupt good manners.




<u>Gal. 6:7</u> **Be not deceived**; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap.

<u>1 Jn. 3:7</u> Little children, **let no man deceive you**: he that doeth righteousness is righteous, even as he is righteous.

Rom. 7:11 For sin, taking occasion by the commandment, deceived me, and by it slew me.

<u>Heb. 3:13</u> But exhort one another daily, while it is called To day; **lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin**.





# <u>Conclusion</u>

<u>Rom. 8:35</u> Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? ...

37 Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us.
