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

- The first church knew that Jesus was the Head of the church.
- The first church obeyed the Lord Jesus Christ's command.
- The first church was empowered by the Holy Ghost.

## II. THE OPERATION

Acts 1:9 And when he had spoken these things, while they beheld, he was taken up; and a cloud received him out of

their sight.

10 And while they looked stedfastly toward heaven as he went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel; 11 Which also said, Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? this same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven.

A. Watching the Ascension of the Savior, 1:9-11

1. The Parting, 1:9

Acts 1:9 And when he had spoken these things, while they beheld, he was taken up; and a cloud received him out of their sight.

Mark 16:19 So then after the Lord had spoken unto them, he was received up into heaven, and sat on the right hand of God.

- The Resurrection was done in obscurity, but the Ascension was done openly.
- The Ascension was miraculous in defying gravity, and in manifesting glory,
- Being seated at the Father's right hand, Christ is ascended to be our Advocate.
- 1 Jn. 2:1 My little children, these things write I unto you, that ye sin not. And if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous:

Rom. 8:34 Who is he that condemneth? It is Christ that died, yea rather, that is risen again, who is even at the right hand of God, who also maketh intercession for us.

Col. 3:1 If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God. (Heb. 10:12)

Heb. 12:2 Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of *our* faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.

1 Pet. 3:22 Who is gone into heaven, and is on the right hand of God; angels and authorities and powers being made subject unto him.

- From mistreatment to majesty, Christ is receiving the glory and honor in Heaven.
  - 2. The Prospect, 1:10-11

Acts 1:10 And while they looked stedfastly toward heaven as he went up, behold, two men stood by them in white apparel;

11 Which also said, Ye men of Galilee, why stand ye gazing up into heaven? this same Jesus, which is taken up from you into heaven, shall so come in like manner as ye have seen him go into heaven.

- The Apostle's awe was interrupted.
- The Apostles were questioned about their "gazing."
- The Apostles were given hope for the prospect of His return!
  - B. Waiting for Empowering of the Spirit, 1:12-26
    - 1. The faithful exercise of the Apostles, 1:12-15

Acts 1:12 Then returned they unto Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is from Jerusalem a sabbath day's journey.

13 And when they were come in, they went up into an upper room, where abode both Peter, and James, and John, and Andrew, Philip, and Thomas, Bartholomew, and Matthew, James the son of Alphaeus, and Simon Zelotes, and Judas the brother of James.

- 14 These all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication, with the women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brethren.
- 15 And in those days Peter stood up in the midst of the disciples, and said, (the number of names together were about an hundred and twenty,)

## a. Their assembly, 1:12-13

Acts 1:12 Then returned they unto Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is from Jerusalem a sabbath day's journey.

13 And when they were come in, they went up into an upper room, where abode both Peter, and James, and John, and Andrew, Philip, and Thomas, Bartholomew, and Matthew, James *the son* of Alphaeus, and Simon Zelotes, and Judas *the brother* of James.

- The Apostles returned to the location of the first church.
- The Jewish connection is noted a sabbath's day's journey – about 2,000 yards.
- All eleven apostles were assembled in one place.

b. Their assurance, 1:14-15

Acts 1:14 These all continued with one accord in prayer and supplication, with the women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brethren.

15 And in those days Peter stood up in the midst of the disciples, and said, (the number of names together were about an hundred and twenty,)

- 1. They were a persevering church "These all continued..."
- 2. They were a purposeful church "...with one accord..."
- 3. They were a praying church "...in prayer and supplication..."
- 4. They were a precious church —
  "...with the women, and Mary...and
  with his brethren. 15...about an
  hundred and twenty,"

- The unity is depicted via prayer and supplication.
- Phil. 4:4 Rejoice in the Lord alway: and again I say, Rejoice. 5 Let your moderation be known unto all men. The Lord is at hand.
- 6 Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.
- 7 And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.
- The peace of such unity is given as assurance to the first church.
- The roll was taken and 120 disciples were at the church service.
- The Apostles and disciples practiced faithful church attendance.
