## THE INCARNATION Jn. 1:1-3, 14, 18, 1 Tim. 3:16 "The Greatest Bridge Between God and Man"

Jn. 1:1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 The same was in the beginning with God. 3 All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made. 14 And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth. ... 18 No man hath seen God at any time; the only begotten Son, which is in the bosom of the Father, he hath declared him.

<u>1 Tim. 3:16</u> And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory.

#### "The Greatest Bridge Between God and Man"

The Incarnation is, perhaps, the greatest doctrinal truth mankind can grasp.

- The Incarnation encapsulates eternity within temporality.
- The Incarnation is holiness wrapped in humility and love.
- The Incarnation is the eternal hope for all mankind.
- The Incarnation is the Gospel the Lord Jesus Christ

### I. THE GREAT TRANSFORMATION IN ETERNITY

Jn. 1:1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God.
2 The same was in the beginning with God.
3 All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made.

A. There was no beginning for the Lord Jesus Christ
 – Eternity

- "In the beginning..." the Lord Jesus Christ was already there.
- "In the beginning..." the Lord Jesus Christ was the Creator.

<u>Eph. 3:9</u> And to make all *men* see what *is* the fellowship of the mystery, which from the beginning of the world hath been hid in God, who created all things by Jesus Christ:

 "In the beginning..." the Lord Jesus Christ was God and will always be God.

B. There was a beginning for Jesus – Bethlehem

<u>2 Cor. 8:9</u> For ye know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that, though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, that ye through his poverty might be rich.

#### II. THE GREAT TRANSFORMATION ON EARTH

<u>Jn. 1:14</u> And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth. ... <u>18</u> No man hath seen God at any time; the only begotten Son, which is in the bosom of the Father, he hath declared him.

<u>1 Tim. 3:16</u> And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory.

#### A. The Motive of the Incarnation – Love

Jn. 3:16 For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

<u>Rom. 5:8</u> But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

<u>1 Jn. 4:9</u> In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him.

#### B. The Method of the Incarnation – Humanity

- The motive was love, but the method of the Incarnation is most intriguing and complex.
- The simple truth is that Jesus came to die.
- He came as the "Last Adam" to deliver us from the sinful dilemma of the first Adam.

<u>1 Cor. 15:45</u> And so it is written, The first man Adam was made a living soul; the last Adam *was made* a quickening spirit.

<u>Rom. 5:12</u> Wherefore, as **by one man sin entered** into the world, and **death by sin**; and so death passed upon all men, for that **all have sinned**:

Sin is the reason Jesus came to die. In <u>2 Cor. 5:21</u>, we see this stark reality:

<u>2 Cor. 5:21</u> For he hath made him *to be* sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him.

- In order for Jesus to die for our sins, He needed to be clothed in human form.
- As God, He cannot die.
- Mary was not the mother of God. She was the mother of Jesus, providing the human body in anticipation of the death, burial and resurrection of Christ.

Phil. 2:5 Let this mind be in you, which was also in Christ Jesus:

<u>6</u> Who, being in the form of God, thought it not robbery to be equal with God:

<u>7</u> But made himself of no reputation, and took upon him the form of a servant, and was made in the likeness of men: <u>8</u> And being found in fashion as a man, he humbled himself, and became obedient unto death, even the death of the cross.

<u>9</u> Wherefore God also hath highly exalted him, and given him a name which is above every name:

<u>10</u> That at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of *things* in heaven, and *things* in earth, and *things* under the earth;

<u>11</u> And that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

# C. The Majesty of the Incarnation –the Savior and Salvation

- The only way that any of us, as sinners, can be considered righteous before God, is to have the righteousness of Christ imputed to us.
- Such imputation only happens when we place our faith in Him, and what He has done.

Jas. 2:23 And the scripture was fulfilled which saith, Abraham believed God, and it was imputed unto him for righteousness: and he was called the Friend of God.

Rom. 4:24 But for us also, to whom it shall be imputed, if we believe on him that raised up Jesus our Lord from the dead;

#### • The only way to heaven is through the Lord Jesus Christ:

<u>Jn. 14:6</u> Jesus saith unto him, I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.

<u>Acts 4:12</u> Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved.

When we place our faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, then we understand that religious efforts are futile. Baptism and the Lord's Supper are ordinances that symbolize the Gospel, but faith in such good works will not suffice for our souls.

<u>Eph. 2:8</u> For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: *it is* the gift of God:
<u>9</u> Not of works, lest any man should boast.

#### <u>Summary</u>

- The Incarnation, properly understood, gives all the honor and glory of our salvation unto the Lord Jesus Christ!

#### <u>Conclusion</u>

<u>2 Cor. 5:17</u> Therefore **if any man** *be* **in Christ**, *he is* **a new creature**: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.

<u>2 Cor. 6:2</u> (For he saith, I have heard thee in a time accepted, and in the day of salvation have I succoured thee: behold, now is the accepted time; behold, now is the day of salvation.)
