<u>Ruth 4:13</u> So Boaz took Ruth, and she was his wife: and when he went in unto her, the LORD gave her conception, and she bare a son. <u>14</u> And the women said unto Naomi, Blessed be the LORD, which hath not left thee this day without a kinsman, that his name may be famous in Israel.

<u>15</u> And he shall be unto thee a restorer of *thy* life, and a nourisher of thine old age: for **thy daughter in law, which loveth thee**, which is better to thee than seven sons, hath born him.

<u>16</u> And Naomi took the child, and laid it in her bosom, and became nurse unto it.

<u>17</u> And the women her neighbours gave it a name, saying, There is a son born to Naomi; and they called his name Obed: he is the father of Jesse, the father of David.

I. <u>RUTH HAD HOPE FROM THE PAST</u>

<u>Ruth 1:12</u> Turn again, my daughters, go your way; for I am too old to have an husband. If I should say, I have hope, *if* I should have an husband also to night, and should also bear sons;

A. Acceptance of the Ramifications

- Ruth was a Moabitess
- Ruth was a widow.
- Ruth was childless.

Eph. 2:2 Wherein in time past ye walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that now worketh in the children of disobedience: <u>3</u> Among whom also we all had our conversation in times past in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were by nature the children of wrath, even as others.

B. Application of the Redemption

- She was "redeemed" by the Kinsman Redeemer.
- All of the past was truly behind her.

Psa. 103:12 As far as the east is from the west, so far hath he removed our transgressions from us.

II. <u>RUTH HAD HOPE IN THE PRESENT</u>

A. Embracing the Newness

<u>2 Cor. 5:17</u> Therefore **if any man** *be* **in Christ**, *he is* **a new creature**: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.

<u>Ruth 4:10</u> Moreover Ruth the Moabitess, the wife of Mahlon, have I purchased to be my wife, to raise up the name of the dead upon his inheritance, that the name of the dead be not cut off from among his brethren, and from the gate of his place: ye *are* witnesses this day.

B. Exhibiting the Newness

<u>Eph. 4:21</u> If so be that ye have heard him, and have been taught by him, as the truth is in Jesus:
<u>22</u> That ye **put off concerning the former conversation the old man**, which is corrupt according to the deceitful lusts;
<u>23</u> And be renewed in the spirit of your mind;
<u>24</u> And that ye **put on the new man**, which after God is created in righteousness and true holiness.

<u>Col. 3:10</u> And have **put on the new** *man*, which is renewed in knowledge after the image of him that created him:

III. <u>RUTH HAD HOPE FOR HER POSTERITY</u>

<u>Ruth 4:13</u> So Boaz took Ruth, and she was his wife: and when he went in unto her, the LORD gave her conception, and she bare a son.

<u>14</u> And the women said unto Naomi, Blessed be the LORD, which hath not left thee this day without a kinsman, that his name may be famous in Israel.

<u>15</u> And he shall be unto thee a restorer of *thy* life, and a nourisher of thine old age: for **thy daughter in law, which loveth thee**, which is better to thee than seven sons, hath born him.

A. The Praise Acknowledging Faithfulness, 4:14b "...Blessed be the LORD, which hath not left thee this day without a kinsman..."

B. The Present Affects the Future, 4:14c "...That his name may be famous in Israel."

C. The Posterity Affirmed for the Family, 4:17

<u>Ruth 4:17</u> And the women her neighbours gave it a name, saying, There is a son born to Naomi; and they called his name Obed: he *is* the father of Jesse, the father of David. Ezek. 37:25 And they shall dwell in the land that I have given unto Jacob my servant, wherein your fathers have dwelt; and they shall dwell therein, *even* they, and their children, and their children's children for ever: and my servant David *shall be* their prince for ever.

<u>Psa. 103:17</u> But the mercy of the LORD *is* from everlasting to everlasting upon them that fear him, and his righteousness unto children's children;

Prov. 13:22a "A good man leaveth an inheritance to his children's children..."

<u>Conclusion</u>

Psa. 38:15 For in thee, O LORD, do I hope: thou wilt hear, O Lord my God.

Psa. 39:7 And now, Lord, what wait I for? my hope is in thee.

<u>Psa. 42:11</u> Why art thou cast down, O my soul? and why art thou disquieted within me? hope thou in God: for I shall yet praise him, who is the health of my countenance, and my God.

Psa. 119:114 Thou art my hiding place and my shield: I hope in thy word.

Psa. 130:5 I wait for the LORD, my soul doth wait, and in his word do I hope.

<u>Psa. 146:5</u> Happy is he that hath the God of Jacob for his help, whose hope is in the LORD his God:

<u>Prov. 10:28</u> The hope of the righteous *shall be* gladness: but the expectation of the wicked shall perish.

<u>Rom. 5:1</u> Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:
<u>2</u> By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God. ...
<u>5</u> And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.
