II. THE QUESTION OF SCRIPTURE, 1:9-12

A. As to its message, 1:9

<u>1 Pet. 1:9</u> Receiving the end of your faith, even the salvation of your souls.

Original Word: τέλος Transliteration: telos Definition: (a) an end, (b) event or issue, (c) the principal end, aim, purpose, (d) a tax.

Properly, consummation (the *end-goal*, *purpose*), such as *closure* with all its *results*.

[This root (*tel-*) means "reaching the *end* (*aim*)."]

In *philosophy*, the doctrine that the doctrine that final causes exist, that there is evidence of purpose or design in the universe, and especially that this provides proof of the existence of a Designer. <u>http://www.dictionary.com/browse/teleology?s=t</u> <u>1 Tim. 1:5</u> Now the end of the commandment is charity out of a pure heart, and *of* a good conscience, and *of* faith unfeigned:

<u>2 Cor. 5:1</u> For we know that if our earthly house of *this* tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, an house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens. <u>2</u> For in this we groan, earnestly desiring to be clothed upon with our house which is from heaven:

Rom. 8:22 For we know that the whole creation groaneth and travaileth in pain together until now. 23 And not only *they*, but ourselves also, which have the firstfruits of the Spirit, even we ourselves groan within ourselves, waiting for the adoption, *to wit*, the redemption of our body.

B. As to its mystery, 1:10-11

1. What the prophets pursued, 1:10a "Of which salvation the prophets have enquired and searched diligently..."

We need to realize that what we have in Christ is SO special to our dispensation!

Original Word: ἐκζητέω Transliteration: ekzeteo Definition: I seek out, seek out after, require.

Properly, seek *out*, emphasizing the *personal intent* of the seeker, i.e. the *outcome intensely* and personally desired by the seeker. This seeking is only as valuable (viable) as the motive which drives it. <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/1567.htm</u>

Original Word: ἐξερευνάω Transliteration: exeraunaó Definition: I search diligently, I examine carefully (minutely).

eksereunáō ("*diligently* search") is used only in 1 Pet 1:10. Here it focuses on the *end*-result of the searching, i.e. the *fulfillment* of salvation (unique glorification) in a believer's life (cf. 1 Pet 3:9). <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/1830.htm</u>

2. What the prophets proclaimed, 1:10b "...who prophesied of the grace that should come unto you:"

<u>Isa. 53:4</u> Surely he hath borne our griefs, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted.

5 But he was wounded for our transgressions, he was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon him; and with his stripes we are healed. ...

<u>10</u> Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise him; he hath put *him* to grief: when thou shalt make **his soul an offering for sin**, he shall see *his* seed, he shall prolong *his* days, and the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in his hand.

<u>11</u> He shall see of the travail of his soul, *and* shall be satisfied: by his knowledge shall my righteous servant justify many; for he shall bear their iniquities.



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C. As to its majesty, 1:12

- 2. The dispensation of the church age, 1:12b "...which are now reported unto you by them that have preached the gospel unto you with the Holy Ghost sent down from heaven..."
- 3. The desire of the angels, 1:12c "...which things the angels desire to look into."

Conclusion
