When we are introduced to the life of Joseph he is seventeen years old. How did his seventeen years prepare him for his future?

## II. THE INDIVIDUAL PREPARATION FOR FAITHFULNESS

A. The Dedication of Parents

Gen. 33:2 And he put the handmaids and their children foremost, and Leah and her children after, and Rachel and Joseph hindermost. ...

7 And Leah also with her children came near, and bowed themselves: and after came Joseph near and Rachel, and they bowed themselves.

Gen. 37:3 Now Israel loved Joseph more than all his children, because he was the son of his old age: and he made him a coat of many colours.

- Jacob was 91 years old when Joseph was born.
- Joseph's mother, Rachel, was the love of Jacob's life, and so was Joseph special to Jacob. (See Gen. 29:18, 30)
- The text does not say that Jacob did not love his other children; it said he loved Joseph more.

Gen. 37:4 And when his brethren saw that their father loved him more than all his brethren, they hated him, and could not speak peaceably unto him.

- Joseph, through no fault of his own, was hated by his brothers.
- In spite of the sibling rivalry, Jacob and Rachel did an excellent job in rearing their children.

Prov. 22:6 Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it.

## B. The Deception of Perception

Gen 37:18 And when they saw him afar off, even before he came near unto them, they conspired against him to slay him.

19 And they said one to another, Behold, this dreamer cometh.

20 Come now therefore, and let us slay him, and cast him into some pit, and we will say, Some evil beast hath devoured him: and we shall see what will become of his dreams.

23 And it came to pass, when Joseph was come unto his brethren, that they stript Joseph out of his coat, his coat of many colours that was on him;

24 And they took him, and cast him into a pit: and the pit was empty, there was no water in it. 27 Come, and let us sell him to the Ishmeelites, and let not our hand be upon him; for he is our brother and our flesh. And his brethren were content. 28 Then there passed by Midianites merchantmen; and they drew and lifted up Joseph out of the pit, and sold Joseph to the Ishmeelites for twenty pieces of silver: and they brought Joseph into Egypt.



- Joseph's brothers, blinded by jealousy, did not perceive what God was doing before their eyes regarding Joseph.
- They focused their attention on misperceived assumptions. To them, Joseph was simply a "dreamer."
- The siblings deceived themselves.

Gal. 6:3 For if a man think himself to be something, when he is nothing, he deceiveth himself. ...

7 Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap.

Trials of our faith are the challenging parts of our spiritual development.

Prov. 22:6 Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it.

At seventeen, Joseph had to "grow up" fast.

1 Cor. 13:11 When I was a child, I spake as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child: but when I became a man, I put away childish things.

Eph. 4:14 That we henceforth be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, and cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive;

Eph. 6:10 Finally, my brethren, be strong in the Lord, and in the power of his might.

11 Put on the whole armour of God, that ye may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil.

12 For we wrestle not against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this world, against spiritual wickedness in high *places*.

Some who "carry the light" are not necessarily from God.

2 Cor. 11:12 But what I do, that I will do, that I may cut off occasion from them which desire occasion; that wherein they glory, they may be found even as we.

13 For such are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into the apostles of Christ.

14 And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light.

15 Therefore it is no great thing if his ministers also be transformed as the ministers of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their works.

Gen. 50:20 But as for you, ye thought evil against me; but God meant it unto good, to bring to pass, as it is this day, to save much people alive.

- The motivation of Joseph's siblings was wrong.
   They hurt their brother.
- Would our adversary use us to be a stumbling block to another?

Rom. 14:13 Let us not therefore judge one another any more: but judge this rather, that no man put a stumbling block or an occasion to fall in his brother's way.

Is it possible to be a stumbling block without our intention to do so?

1 Cor. 8:9 But take heed lest by any means this liberty of yours become a stumblingblock to them that are weak.

 Regardless of the motivation against us, God can turn the results into "good." Rom. 8:28 And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.

- Those who love God, and are called "according to his purpose" the good will occur.
- We deceive ourselves when we fail to realize that the love we profess for God pales in comparison of our love that we have for ourselves.

C. The Development of Priorities

1 Pet. 1:6 Wherein ye greatly rejoice, though now for a season, if need be, ye are in heaviness through manifold temptations:

7 That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ:

8 Whom having not seen, ye love; in whom, though now ye see him not, yet believing, ye rejoice with joy unspeakable and full of glory:

9 Receiving the end of your faith, even the salvation of your souls.

Job 23:10 But he knoweth the way that I take: when he hath tried me, I shall come forth as gold.

1 Thess. 2:4 But as we were allowed of God to be put in trust with the gospel, even so we speak; not as pleasing men, but God, which trieth our hearts.
