### First Peter <u>1 Pet. 2:11-12</u>

<u>1 Pet. 2:11</u> Dearly beloved, I beseech *you* as strangers and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts, which war against the soul;

<u>12</u> Having your conversation honest among the Gentiles: that, whereas they speak against you as evildoers, they may by *your* good works, which they shall behold, glorify God in the day of visitation.

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a. Our new attitude to the world around us, 2:11a – "Dearly beloved, I beseech *you* as strangers and pilgrims..."

<u>Gen. 23:4</u> I am a stranger and a sojourner with you: give me a possession of a buryingplace with you, that I may bury my dead out of my sight.

Psa. 39:12 Hear my prayer, O LORD, and give ear unto my cry; hold not thy peace at my tears: for I *am* a stranger with thee, *and* a sojourner, as all my fathers *were*.

<u>Eph. 2:19</u> Now therefore ye are no more strangers and foreigners, but fellowcitizens with the saints, and of the household of God;

Heb. 13:14 For here have we no continuing city, but we seek one to come.

b. Our new attitude to the war within us, 2:11b-c

(1) An attitude of denial, 2:11b – "...abstain from fleshly lusts..."

Original Word: ἀπέχω Transliteration: apechó Definition: I have in full, am far, it is enough.

Properly, to have one thing by separating from (letting go of) another. http://biblehub.com/greek/568.htm <u>1 Jn. 2:15</u> Love not the world, neither the things *that are* in the world. If any men love the world, the love of the Father is not in him.

<u>16</u> For all that *is* in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world.

<u>17</u> And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever.

<u>Jas. 4:4</u> Ye adulterers and adulteresses, know ye not that the **friendship of the world is enmity with God**? whosoever therefore will be a **friend of the world is the enemy of God**.

- We are in the world, but not of the world. Like an island in the midst of the sea, we must draw our boundary lines of separation.
- <u>Gal. 5:16</u> This I say then, Walk in the Spirit, and ye shall not fulfil the lust of the flesh.
- <u>17</u> For the flesh lusteth against the Spirit, and the Spirit against the flesh: and these are contrary the one to the other: so that ye cannot do the things that ye would.
- 18 But if ye be led of the Spirit, ye are not under the law.
- <u>19</u> Now the works of the flesh are manifest, which are *these*; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness,
- <u>20</u> Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies,
- 21 Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told *you* in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God.
- 22 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith,
- 23 Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law.
- 24 And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts.
- 25 If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit.
- <u>26</u> Let us not be desirous of vain glory, provoking one another, envying one another.

Rom. 6:12 Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, that ye should obey it in the lusts thereof.

Rom. 13:14 But put ye on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make not provision for the flesh, to *fulfil* the lusts *thereof*.

Eph. 2:3 Among whom also we all had our conversation in times past in the lusts of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind; and were by nature the children of wrath, even as others.

<u>Eph. 4:22</u> That ye put off concerning the former conversation the old man, which is corrupt according to the deceitful lusts;

<u>1 Tim. 6:9</u> But they that will be rich fall into temptation and a snare, and *into* many foolish and hurtful lusts, which drown men in destruction and perdition.

<u>2 Tim. 2:22</u> Flee also youthful lusts: but follow righteousness, faith, charity, peace, with them that call on the Lord out of a pure heart.

<u>2 Tim. 4:3</u> For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears;

<u>Titus 3:3</u> For we ourselves also were sometimes foolish, disobedient, deceived, serving divers lusts and pleasures, living in malice and envy, hateful, *and* hating one another.

<u>1 Pet. 1:14</u> As obedient children, not fashioning yourselves according to the former lusts in your ignorance:

<u>1 Pet. 4:2</u> That he no longer should live the rest of *his* time in the flesh to the lusts of men, but to the will of God. <u>3</u> For the time past of *our* life may suffice us to have wrought the will of the Gentiles, when we walked in lasciviousness, **lusts**, excess of wine, revellings, banquetings, and abominable idolatries:

<u>Titus 2:12</u> Teaching us that, denying ungodliness and worldly lusts, we should live soberly, righteously, and godly, in this present world; (2) An attitude of discernment, 2:11c –"...which war against the soul;"

Original Word: στρατεύομαι Transliteration: strateuó Definition: I wage war, fight, serve as a soldier; fig: of the warring lusts against the soul.

Properly, to contend, *fighting* like a soldier in *war*; (figuratively) to engage in *spiritual warfare*. <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/4754.htm</u>

 The negative aspect of spiritual warfare is the reality of it derailing our spirituality. (Eph. 6:10-18)

 The positive aspect spiritual warfare is the recognition of being prepared to fight the good fight of faith. <u>1 Tim. 6:12</u> Fight the good fight of faith, lay hold on eternal life, whereunto thou art also called, and hast professed a good profession before many witnesses.

<u>2 Tim. 4:7</u> I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith:

 Paul's mentoring and encouragement to Timothy is be prepared to fight a war against spiritual conflict.

<u>1 Tim. 1:18</u> This charge I commit unto thee, son Timothy, according to the prophecies which went before on thee, that thou by them mightest war a good warfare;

<u>2 Tim. 2:4</u> No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of *this* life; that he may please him who hath chosen him to be a soldier.

### C. Its results, 2:12

 A faithful admonition, 2:12a – "Having your conversation honest among the Gentiles..."

Original Word: καλός

Transliteration: kalos

Definition: beautiful, as an outward sign of the inward good, noble, honorable character; good, worthy, honorable, noble, and seen to be so, honest.

kalós – attractively good; good that inspires (motivates) others to embrace what is lovely (beautiful, praiseworthy); i.e. *well* done so as to be winsome (appealing). <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/2570.htm</u> Eph. 2:10 For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.

2. A false accusation, 2:12b – "...that, whereas they speak against you as evildoers..."

3. A future affirmation, 2:12c – "...they may by your good works, which they shall behold, glorify God in the day of visitation."

Mt. 5:16 Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.

#### Conclusion

- <u>Col. 3:1</u> If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God.
- 2 Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth.
