B. The Purpose of Promotions

Joseph endured many disappointments, and suffered much heartache as a young man before his promotion by Pharaoh. God was preparing him for the challenging position of ruler over Egypt. The promotion was not so much for Joseph to enjoy, because God put him there to be the provider of many blessings to the nation of Israel. <u>Gen. 45:4</u> And Joseph said unto his brethren, Come near to me, I pray you. And they came near. And he said, I *am* Joseph your brother, whom ye sold into Egypt. <u>5</u> Now therefore be not grieved, nor angry with yourselves, that ye sold me hither: for **God did send me before** you to preserve life.

<u>6</u> For these two years *hath* the famine *been* in the land: and yet *there are* five years, in the which *there shall* neither *be* earing nor harvest.

7 And God sent me before you to preserve you a posterity in the earth, and to save your lives by a great deliverance. 8 So now *it was* not you *that* sent me hither, but God: and he hath made me a father to Pharaoh, and lord of all his house, and a ruler throughout all the land of Egypt. <u>Gen. 50:20</u> But as for you, ye thought evil against me; but God meant it unto good, to bring to pass, as it is this day, to save much people alive.

21 Now therefore fear ye not: I will nourish you, and your little ones. And he comforted them, and spake kindly unto them.

Conclusion

Perhaps the line most frequently attributed to Dwight L. Moody is the famous quotation: "The world has yet to see what God can do with a man fully consecrated to him. By God's help, I aim to be that man."

In fact, Moody did not originate the line. Henry Varley, a British revivalist who had befriended the young American in Dublin, recalled that in 1873 Moody asked him to recount words they had spoken in private conversation a year earlier, just before Moody's return to the United States. Varley provides this account (as recorded in Paul Gericke's Crucial Experiences in the Life of D.L. Moody):



"Ah," said Mr. Moody, "those were the words sent to my soul, through you, from the Living God. As I crossed the wide Atlantic, the boards of the deck of the vessel were engraved with them, and when I reached Chicago, the very paving stones seemed marked with 'Moody, the world has yet to see what God will do with a man fully **consecrated to him**.' Under the power of those words I have come back to England, and I felt that I must not let more time pass until I let you know how God had used your words to my inmost soul."
