

First Peter 1 Pet. 4:7-11

- 1 Pet. 4:7 But the end of all things is at hand: be ye therefore sober, and watch unto prayer.
- 8 And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins.
- 9 Use hospitality one to another without grudging.
- 10 As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.
- 11 If any man speak, *let him speak* as the oracles of God; if any man minister, *let him do it* as of the ability which God giveth: that God in all things may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom be praise and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

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 - 1. It should make us more prayerful, 4:7
 - a. A grave observation, 4:7a "But the end of all things is at hand..."

Jas. 5:8 Be ye also patient; stablish your hearts: for the coming of the Lord draweth nigh.

Rom. 13:11 And that, knowing the time, that now *it is* high time to awake out of sleep: for now *is* our salvation nearer than when we believed.

Heb. 9:28 So Christ was once offered to bear the sins of many; and unto them that look for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation.

- 1 Jn. 2:18 Little children, it is the last time: and as ye have heard that antichrist shall come, even now are there many antichrists; whereby we know that it is the last time.
 - b. A great obligation, 4:7b "...be ye therefore sober, and watch unto prayer."

Original Word: σωφρονέω Transliteration: sóphroneó

Definition: I am of sound mind, am sober-minded, exercise self-control.

sōphronéō – properly, safety-minded; having a sober outlook that reflects true balance.

For the believer, sōphronéō ("think shrewdly") reflects what God defines is true moderation. This God-controlled perspective blends the extremities of truth on both sides of a matter.

[The whole word-family (root, *sōphro-*) comes from two words: *sōos* ("safe") and *phrēn* ("what *regulates* life," the root of the English term, "*diaphram*").

Example: An opera singer controls the length (quality) of their tones by their diaphragm, which even controls our ability to breathe and moderates heartbeat. This regulates ("brings safety") to the body, keeping it properly controlled.] http://biblehub.com/greek/4993.htm

Mark 5:15 And they come to Jesus, and see him that was possessed with the devil, and had the legion, sitting, and clothed, and in his right mind: and they were afraid.

Original Word: νήφω

Transliteration: néphó

Definition: (lit: I am sober), I am calm (vigilant), circumspect,

watching.

néphō ("be sober, unintoxicated") refers to having presence of mind (clear judgment), enabling someone to be temperate (self-controlled). néphō ("uninfluenced by intoxicants") means to have "one's wits (faculties) about them," which is the opposite of being irrational.

- 1 Tim. 2:1 I exhort therefore, that, first of all, supplications, prayers, intercessions, and giving of thanks, be made for all men;
- 1 Thess. 5:17 Pray without ceasing.
- Heb. 4:15 For we have not an high priest which cannot be touched with the feeling of our infirmities; but was in all points tempted like as we are, yet without sin.

- 2. It should make us more practical, 4:8-10
 - a. What we must show, 4:8

1 Pet. 4:8 And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins.

Original Word: ἐκτενής

Transliteration: ektenés

Definition: intent, constant, strenuous, intense, fervent; met:

earnest, zealous.

Properly, stretch *out*, i.e. fully because completely taut; (figuratively) at *maximum potential*, without slack because fully *ex*tended to its necessary *out*come. http://biblehub.com/greek/1618.htm

Acts 12:5 Peter therefore was kept in prison: but prayer was made without ceasing of the church unto God for him.

Rom. 13:8 Owe no man any thing, but to love one another: for he that loveth another hath fulfilled the law.

- 9 For this, Thou shalt not commit adultery, Thou shalt not kill, Thou shalt not steal, Thou shalt not bear false witness, Thou shalt not covet; and if *there be* any other commandment, it is briefly comprehended in this saying, namely, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.
- 10 Love worketh no ill to his neighbour: therefore love is the fulfilling of the law.

- 1 Thess. 5:8 But let us, who are of the day, be sober, putting on the breastplate of faith and love; and for an helmet, the hope of salvation. ...
- 15 See that none render evil for evil unto any *man*; but ever follow that which is good, both among yourselves, and to all *men*.
- 1 Jn. 4:7 Beloved, let us love one another: for love is of God; and every one that loveth is born of God, and knoweth God.
- 8 He that loveth not knoweth not God; for God is love.
- 9 In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him.
- 10 Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins.
- 11 Beloved, if God so loved us, we ought also to love one another.

Prov. 10:12 Hatred stirreth up strifes: but love covereth all sins.

Jas. 5:20 Let him know, that he which converteth the sinner from the error of his way shall save a soul from death, and shall hide a multitude of sins.

1 Jn. 1:9 If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Summary

- 1 Pet. 4:7 But the end of all things is at hand: be ye therefore sober, and watch unto prayer.
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Because the Lord's return is at hand...

- Have your head on straight, and be cognizant of the reality of eternality.
- Pray with a calm, clear mind because of such spiritual maturity.
- Love the brethren with an intensity that is genuinely spiritual, caring for another's spiritual welfare.

- 1 Pet. 4:9 Use hospitality one to another without grudging.

c. What we must share, 4:10

1 Pet. 4:10 As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.

- 1 Cor. 4:1 Let a man so account of us, as of the ministers of Christ, and stewards of the mysteries of God.
- 2 Moreover it is required in stewards, that a man be found faithful. ...
- <u>5</u> Therefore judge nothing before the time, until the Lord come, who both will bring to light the hidden things of darkness, and will make manifest the counsels of the hearts: and then shall every man have praise of God.
 - 3. It should make us more perceptive, 4:11
 - a. About the Word of God, 4:11a "If any man speak, let him speak as the oracles of God..."

Original Word: λόγιον

Transliteration: logion

Definition: plur: oracles, divine responses or utterances (it can include the entire Old Testament).

Know the Bible!

1 Pet. 3:15 But sanctify the Lord God in your hearts: and be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear:

b. About the work of God, 4:11b "...if any man minister, let him do it as of the ability which God giveth..."

Rev. 1:5 And from Jesus Christ, who is the faithful witness, and the first begotten of the dead, and the prince of the kings of the earth. Unto him that loved us, and washed us from our sins in his own blood,

6 And hath made us kings and priests unto God and his Father; to him be glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

c. About the worship of God, 4:11c "...that God in all things may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom be praise and dominion for ever and ever. Amen."

Conclusion
