





- 1 Cor. 15:12 Now if Christ be preached that he rose from the dead, how say some among you that there is no resurrection of the dead?
- 13 But if there be no resurrection of the dead, then is Christ not risen:
- 14 And if Christ be not risen, then is our preaching vain, and your faith is also vain.
- 15 Yea, and we are found false witnesses of God; because we have testified of God that he raised up Christ: whom he raised not up, if so be that the dead rise not.
- 16 For if the dead rise not, then is not Christ raised:
- 17 And if Christ be not raised, your faith is vain; ye are yet in your sins.
- 18 Then they also which are fallen asleep in Christ are perished.
- 19 If in this life only we have hope in Christ, we are of all men most miserable.
- 20 But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the firstfruits of them that slept.


The Resurrection of the Lord Jesus Christ is the most important event in history. When an individual understands the true meaning of it, then repents and puts faith in Christ, then the ramifications and repercussions of the Resurrection just became personal for all of eternity!

In our passage this morning, the Holy Spirit has moved the Apostle Paul to write to the church in Corinth regarding the Resurrection. Beginning in verse twelve, Paul presents a scenario about the ramifications and repercussion of the Resurrection. The issue is the validation of the Resurrection — is it true or not?



- 1 Cor. 15:3 For I delivered unto you first of all that which I also received, how that Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures;
- 4 And that he was buried, and that he rose again the third day according to the scriptures:
- 5 And that he was seen of Cephas, then of the twelve:
- 6 After that, he was seen of above five hundred brethren at once; of whom the greater part remain unto this present, but some are fallen asleep.
- 7 After that, he was seen of James; then of all the apostles.
- 8 And last of all he was seen of me also, as of one born out of due time.





B. The Repercussions 1 Cor. 15:13 But if there be no resurrection of the dead then is Christ not risen: 14 And if Christ be not risen then is our preaching vain, and your faith is also vain. 15 Yea, and we are found false witnesses of God; because we have testified of God that he raised up Christ: whom he raised not up, if so be that the dead rise not. 16 For if the dead rise not then is not Christ raised: 17 And if Christ be not raised your faith is vain; ye are yet in your sins.

 The worst repercussion of no resurrection is the vanity of life and lost condition.

18 Then they also which are fallen asleep in Christ are perished.

19 If in this life only we have hope in Christ we are of all men most miserable.

III. THE POWERFUL CONFESSION

A. The Immediate Profession as a Response

1 Cor. 15:20 But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the firstfruits of them that slept.

- B. The Inheritance Promised as a Repercussion
- The greatest repercussion of the Resurrection is the promise of eternal life!
- 1 Pet. 1:3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,
- 4 To an inheritance incorruptible, and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for you,

 5 Who are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.

Conclusion

Col. 3:1 If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God.

2 Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth.

3 For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God.

4 When Christ, who is our life, shall appear, then shall ye also appear with him in glory.
