- A. A word of exhortation, 5:12
  - 1. Peter's colleague, 5:12a "By Silvanus, a faithful brother unto you..."
- 2 Cor. 1:19 For the Son of God, Jesus Christ, who was preached among you by us, even by me and Silvanus and Timotheus, was not yea and nay, but in him was yea.
- 1 Thess. 1:1 Paul, and Silvanus, and Timotheus, unto the church of the Thessalonians which is in God the Father and in the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace be unto you, and peace, from God our Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ.

- 2 Thess. 1:1 Paul, and Silvanus, and Timotheus, unto the church of the Thessalonians in God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ:

Original Word: ἵστημι

Part of Speech: Verb (Aorist-Imperative-Active)

Transliteration: histémi

Definition: trans: (a) I make to stand, place, set up, establish, appoint; mid: I place myself, stand, (b) I set in balance, weigh; intrans: (c) I stand, stand by, stand still; met: I stand ready, stand firm, am steadfast. <a href="http://biblehub.com/greek/2476.htm">http://biblehub.com/greek/2476.htm</a>

- B. A word of explanation, 5:13
  - 1. Greetings from a specific church, 5:13a "The *church that is* at Babylon, elected together with *you*, saluteth you..."

Original Word: συνεκλεκτός Transliteration: suneklektos

Definition: fellow-elect, fellow-chosen.

syneklektós (sýn, "identity with" and eklektós, "chosen") – properly, fellow-elect, i.e. believers who belong to each other because each belongs to the Lord (used only in 1 Pet 5:13). See (eklektos). http://biblehub.com/greek/4899.htm

Col. 3:12 Put on therefore, as the elect of God, holy and beloved, bowels of mercies, kindness, humbleness of mind, meekness, longsuffering;

- 1 Pet. 2:4 To whom coming, as unto a living stone, disallowed indeed of men, but chosen of God, and precious, 9 But ye are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, an holy nation, a peculiar people; that ye should shew forth the praises of him who hath called you out of darkness into his marvellous light:
  - 2. Greetings from a special Christian, 5:13b "...and so doth Marcus my son."
  - C. A word of expectation, 5:14
    - 1. Their love expressed, 5:14a "Greet ye one another with a kiss of charity..."

Original Word: φίλημα Transliteration: philéma Definition: a kiss.

phílēma (from philéō, "share warm affection") – a kiss to show respect or affection between friends – i.e. people sharing a deep (common) bond. http://biblehub.com/greek/5370.htm

- 2. Their love extolled, 5:14b-c
  - a. His peace assured, 5:14b "...Peace be with you..."
  - b. His presence assumed, 5:14c "...all that are in Christ Jesus. Amen."
