


Luke 11:33 No man, when he hath lighted a candle, putteth it in a secret place, neither under a bushel, but on a candlestick, that they which come in may see the light.

Review

Our theme for 2017 is "Carry the Light."

The conduct of a true Christian, one who is genuinely "born again," is the outcome of a doctrinal foundation.

We are "living out our faith," and our testimony indicates the quality of it, be it good or bad.

As I believe, therefore I live.



<u>Introduction</u>

The two passages we are considering this morning represent this principle. We will construct a chronological order these passages.

I. THE RECOGNITION OF IDENTITY

Mt. 5:14 Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid.

A. The Present Ownership – "Ye are the light of the world..."

"Ye are..." – not, will be, or hope to be.

2 Cor. 5:17 Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.

Believers are "illuminated vessels" of testimony for Christ!

2 Cor. 5:20 Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech *you* by us: we pray *you* in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled to God.

B. The Presentation of the Obvious — "...A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid."

Eccl. 8:1 Who is as the wise man? and who knoweth the interpretation of a thing? a man's wisdom maketh his face to shine, and the boldness of his face shall be changed.

Dan. 12:3 And they that be wise shall shine as the brightness of the firmament; and they that turn many to righteousness as the stars for ever and ever.

- Who you are determines what you do.
- If you are light...you shine!

II. THE RESPONSIBILITY OF INFLUENCE

Luke 11:33 No man, when he hath lighted a candle, putteth it in a secret place, neither under a bushel but on a candlestick, that they which come in may see the light.

Mt. 5:15 Neither do men light a candle, and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house.

A. The Producer of the Influence "...lighted a candle..."

The principle is that someone had lighted a candle.

Jn. 1:6 There was a man sent from God, whose name was John.

7 The same came for a witness, to bear witness of the Light, that all *men* through him might believe.

8 He was not that Light, but was sent to bear witness of that Light.

9 That was the true Light, which lighteth every man that cometh into the world.

Original Word: φωτίζω

Transliteration: phótizó

Definition: (a) I light up, illumine, (b) I bring to light, make

evident, reveal.

phōtízō (from phốs, "light") – properly, enlighten; (figuratively) God sharing His life, exposing and overcoming darkness – like the ignorance (prejudice) caused by sin. http://biblehub.com/greek/5461.htm

Eph. 1:18 The eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that ye may know what is the hope of his calling, and what the riches of the glory of his inheritance in the saints,

Eph. 3:9 And to make all men see what is the fellowship of the mystery, which from the beginning of the world hath been hid in God, who created all things by Jesus Christ:

Heb. 10:32 But call to remembrance the former days, in which, after ye were illuminated, ye endured a great fight of afflictions;

- B. The Place of Influence "...no man...putteth it in a secret place, neither under a bushel, but on a candlestick..."
- To put "... it in a secret place..." = cowardly, closet Christian.

God does not put a believer where he cannot "shine."

Mark 4:21 And he said unto them, Is a candle brought to be put under a bushel, or under a bed? and not to be set on a candlestick?

- "...under a bushel or under a bed..." represent two specific reasons for losing a testimony
 = commercialism or laziness.
- Commercialism and/or laziness are both expressions of selfishness, smothering the light.
- When "the light" is smothered, it is ineffective, a waste of what a candle is designed for.

Heb. 6:9 But, beloved, we are persuaded better things of you, and things that accompany salvation, though we thus speak.

- Our place to shine is "...to be set on a candlestick..."
- The Scriptural definition of the candlestick is found in <u>Rev. 1:20</u>:

Rev. 1:20 The mystery of the seven stars which thou sawest in my right hand, and the seven golden candlesticks. The seven stars are the angels of the seven churches: and the seven candlesticks which thou sawest are the seven churches.

- God's plan for a believer, after salvation, is to be Scripturally baptized, and consequently, join a Bible preaching church.
- God's plan is for the believer, to shine via the "candlestick," utilizing God-given gifts for His glory, ministering through the church. (Eph. 4:11-16)

C. Purpose of the Influence – "...that they which come in may see the light."

Phil. 2:15 That ye may be blameless and harmless, the sons of God, without rebuke, in the midst of a crooked and perverse nation, among whom ye shine as lights in the world;

Eph. 5:8 For ye were sometimes darkness, but now are ye light in the Lord: walk as children of light:



III. THE RAMIFICATIONS OF INCLINATION

Luke 11:34 The light of the body is the eye: therefore when thine eye is single, thy whole body also is full of light; but when thine eye is evil, thy body also is full of darkness.

35 Take heed therefore that the light which is in thee be not darkness.

A. The Importance of the Focus

Luke 11:34 The light of the body is the eye: therefore when thine eye is single, thy whole body also is full of light; but when thine eye is evil, thy body also is full of darkness.




Mt. 13:13 Therefore speak I to them in parables: because they seeing see not; and hearing they hear not, neither do they understand.

14 And in them is fulfilled the prophecy of Esaias, which saith, By hearing ye shall hear, and shall not understand; and seeing ye shall see, and shall not perceive:

15 For this people's heart is waxed gross, and their ears are dull of hearing, and their eyes they have closed; lest at any time they should see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and should understand with their heart, and should be converted, and I should heal them.

16 But blessed are your eyes, for they see: and your ears, for they hear.



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Where we focus our attention, our hearts will follow.

Prov. 4:23 Keep thy heart with all diligence; for out of it are the issues of life.

Luke 12:34 For where your treasure is, there will your heart be also.

B. The Inclination for the Fallout

Luke 11:35 Take heed therefore that the light which is in thee be not darkness.

36 If thy whole body therefore be full of light, having no part dark, the whole shall be full of light, as when the bright shining of a candle doth give thee light.

Rom. 6:16 Know ye not, that to whom ye yield yourselves servants to obey, his servants ye are to whom ye obey; whether of sin unto death, or of obedience unto righteousness?


IV. THE REASON FOR ILLUMINATION

A. What the Candle is To Do, Imperatively


– "Let your light so shine..."
