

As we continue looking at the Book of Acts, we need to be reminded of the scenario of the first church:

- The apostles had spent three years of preparation with the Lord Jesus Christ in order to serve Him for His glory.
- They were unclear about the establishing of His Kingdom.
- The Lord had ascended back to heaven.
- The Holy Spirit was their primary source of leadership.
- The organization for their actions was the first church.

- They had no complete Bible like we do, today.
- The focus of their lives was living what they believed.
- The title of the book is "The Acts of the Apostles" NOT the beliefs of the Apostles.
- We are looking at what they did, in relation to what they believed.
- The key to the effectiveness of what they did was that their lives were empowered by the Holy Spirit.
- We are observing how the Holy Spirit moved in their lives.

3. Stephen, the Triumphant Warrior, 7:54-60

a. His Convicting Voice, 7:54

Acts 7:54 When they heard these things, they were cut to the heart, and they gnashed on him with *their* teeth.

Original Word: διαπρίω

Transliteration: diaprió

Definition: (lit: I saw through), I cut to the quick (with indignation

and envy).

diapríō (from diá, "through" and priō, "cut with a saw") – properly, cut all the way through; (figuratively) emotionally "sawn asunder," as when the heart is "ripped in two" ("cut to the quick") – i.e. when a person is "split down the center" (emotionally) when overcome with indignation (envy, outrage). http://biblehub.com/greek/1282.htm

Acts 5:33 When they heard that, they were cut to the heart, and took counsel to slay them.

All Greek texts are the same, however, not all English texts are the same:

New International Version

When the members of the Sanhedrin heard this, they were furious and gnashed their teeth at him.

New American Standard Bible

Now when they heard this, they were cut to the quick, and they began gnashing their teeth at him.

Holman Christian Standard Bible

When they heard these things, they were enraged in their hearts and gnashed their teeth at him.

King James Bible

When they heard these things, they were cut to the heart, and they gnashed on him with *their* teeth.

Luke 13:28 There shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth, when ye shall see Abraham, and Isaac, and Jacob, and all the prophets, in the kingdom of God, and you *yourselves* thrust out.

b. His Complete Vindication, 7:55

Acts 7:55 But he, being full of the Holy Ghost, looked up stedfastly into heaven, and saw the glory of God, and Jesus standing on the right hand of God,

c. His Continuing Valor, 7:56-59

(1) His Final Testimony, 7:56

Acts 7:56 And said, Behold, I see the heavens opened, and the Son of man standing on the right hand of God.

Psa. 110:1 The LORD said unto my Lord, Sit thou at my right hand, until I make thine enemies thy footstool.

Acts 2:34 For David is not ascended into the heavens: but he saith himself, The LORD said unto my Lord, Sit thou on my right hand,

Luke 22:69 Hereafter shall the Son of man sit on the right hand of the power of God.

1 Tim. 2:5 For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus;

(2) His Final Trial, 7:57-58

(a) How They Stopped Him, 7:57

Acts 7:57 Then they cried out with a loud voice, and stopped their ears, and ran upon him with one accord,

There are three trials before the Sanhedrin that Luke recorded thus far:

1. The first ended with a threatening (4:17, 21)

Acts 4:17 But that it spread no further among the people, let us straitly threaten them, that they speak henceforth to no man in this name. ...

21 So when they had further threatened them, they let them go, finding nothing how they might punish them, because of the people: for all *men* glorified God for that which was done.

2. The second with beating (5:40)

Acts 5:40 And to him they agreed: and when they had called the apostles, and beaten *them*, they commanded that they should not speak in the name of Jesus, and let them go.

3. The third with stoning (7:58-60)

Acts 7:58 And cast him out of the city, and stoned him: and the witnesses laid down their clothes at a young man's feet, whose name was Saul.

59 And they stoned Stephen, calling upon *God*, and saying, Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.

60 And he kneeled down, and cried with a loud voice, Lord, lay not this sin to their charge. And when he had said this, he fell asleep.

(b) How They Stoned Him, 7:58

Acts 7:58 And cast him out of the city, and stoned him: and the witnesses laid down their clothes at a young man's feet, whose name was Saul.

Acts 13:9 Then Saul, (who also is called Paul,) filled with the Holy Ghost, set his eyes on him,

(3) His Final Triumph, 7:59

Acts 7:59 And they stoned Stephen, calling upon *God*, and saying, Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.

New International Version

While they were stoning him, Stephen prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit."

New American Standard Bible

They went on stoning Stephen as he called on the Lord and said, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit!"

Holman Christian Standard Bible

They were stoning Stephen as he called out: "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit!"

King James Bible

And they stoned Stephen, calling upon *God*, and saying, Lord Jesus, receive my spirit.

Luke 23:46 And when Jesus had cried with a loud voice, he said, Father, into thy hands I commend my spirit: and having said thus, he gave up the ghost.

d. His Crowning Victory, 7:60

Acts 7:60 And he kneeled down, and cried with a loud voice, Lord, lay not this sin to their charge. And when he had said this, he fell asleep.

Luke 6:27 But I say unto you which hear, Love your enemies, do good to them which hate you, 28 Bless them that curse you, and pray for them which despitefully use you.

Luke 23:34 Then said Jesus, Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do. And they parted his raiment, and cast lots.

Jn. 11:13 Howbeit Jesus spake of his death: but they thought that he had spoken of taking of rest in sleep.

1 Cor. 15:20 But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the firstfruits of them that slept.

1 Thess. 4:14 For if we believe that Jesus died and rose again, even so them also which sleep in Jesus will God bring with him.

Conclusion

Acts 7:51 Ye stiffnecked and uncircumcised in heart and ears, ye do always resist the Holy Ghost: as your fathers *did*, so *do* ye.

Eph. 4:30 And grieve not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption.

1 Thess. 5:19 Quench not the Spirit.

Zech. 4:6 "...Not by might, nor by power, but by my spirit, saith the LORD of hosts."

Acts 1:8 But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth.
