

<u>1 Pet. 4:7</u> But the end of all things is at hand: be ye therefore sober, and watch unto prayer.

<u>Review</u>

During the Christmas season, we are following our theme, *Carry the Light*, by focusing on how carrying the light of the Gospel will allow us to *exhibit God* with our lives.

The conduct of a true Christian, one who is genuinely "born again," is the outcome of a doctrinal foundation. We are "living out our faith," and our testimony indicates the quality of it, be it good or bad.

As I believe, therefore I live.

I. <u>CARRY THE LIGHT TO EXHIBIT GOD'S GREATNESS</u>

<u>Mt. 5:14</u> Ye are the light of the world. A city that is set on an hill cannot be hid.

<u>15</u> Neither do men light a candle, and put it under a bushel, but on a candlestick; and it giveth light unto all that are in the house. <u>16</u> Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.

II. CARRY THE LIGHT TO EXHIBIT GOD'S GUIDANCE

<u>Prov. 3:5</u> Trust in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto thine own understanding.
<u>6</u> In all thy ways acknowledge him, and he shall direct thy paths.

III. CARRY THE LIGHT TO EXHIBIT GOD'S GRACE

<u>2 Cor. 8:1</u> Moreover, brethren, we do you to wit of the grace of God bestowed on the churches of Macedonia;
<u>2</u> How that in a great trial of affliction the abundance of their joy and their deep poverty abounded unto the riches of their liberality.

"Carry the Light to Exhibit God's Gift"

<u>1 Pet. 4:10</u> As every man hath received the gift, *even so* minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.

The principle of "the gift" is also found in several passages: <u>Rom.</u> <u>12:6-8, 1 Cor. 12:8-10</u>.

<u>Rom. 12:6</u> Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, whether prophecy, *let us prophesy* according to the proportion of faith; <u>7</u> Or ministry, *let us wait* on *our* ministering: or he that teacheth, on teaching; <u>8</u> Or he that exhorteth, on exhortation: he that giveth, *let him do it* with simplicity; he that ruleth, with diligence; he that sheweth mercy, with cheerfulness. <u>1 Cor. 12:8</u> For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit;
<u>9</u> To another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit;
<u>10</u> To another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits; to another *divers* kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues:

 The Apostle Paul emphasized that Timothy utilized his gift for God's glory.

<u>1 Tim. 4:14</u> Neglect not the gift that is in thee, which was given thee by prophecy, with the laying on of the hands of the presbytery.

<u>2 Tim. 1:6</u> Wherefore I put thee in remembrance that thou stir up the gift of God, which is in thee by the putting on of my hands.

Let's look at the premise by considering the context of our passage:

IV. CARRY THE LIGHT TO EXHIBIT GOD'S GIFT

A. The General Expectations

1. <u>Steadfastness</u> – Pay attention to the time – v. 7

<u>1 Pet. 4:7</u> But the end of all things is at hand: be ye therefore sober, and watch unto prayer.

2. <u>Sensitivity</u> – Have fervent charity – v. 8

<u>1 Pet. 4:8</u> And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins.

3. <u>Sweet-spirited</u> – Be hospitable with grace – v. 9

<u>**1** Pet. 4:9</u> Use hospitality one to another without grudging.

hospitality

1. The friendly reception and treatment of guests or strangers.

2. The quality or disposition of receiving and treating guests and strangers in a warm, friendly, generous way.

4. <u>Stewardship</u> – Be a good steward of your gift – v. 10

<u>1 Pet. 4:10</u> As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.

<u>1 Cor. 4:2</u> Moreover it is **required in stewards**, that a man **be found faithful**.

5. <u>Spirit-filled</u> – Be faithful to glorify God – v. 11

<u>1 Pet. 4:11</u> If any man speak, *let him speak* as the oracles of God; if any man minister, *let him do it* as of the ability which God giveth: that God in all things may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom be praise and dominion for ever and ever. Amen. **B.** The Gift Exhibited

1. The Gift of Salvation

Rom. 6:23 For the wages of sin *is* death; but the gift of God *is* eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

<u>Eph. 2:8</u> For by grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: *it is* the gift of God: <u>9</u> Not of works, lest any man should boast.

2. The Gift of Service

<u>1 Pet. 4:10</u> As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.

 We are responsible, as stewards, to utilize the gift that God has given us, by ministering to one another.

<u>Mark 10:42</u> But Jesus called them *to him,* and saith unto them, Ye know that they which are accounted to rule over the Gentiles exercise lordship over them; and their great ones exercise authority upon them.

- <u>43</u> But so shall it not be among you: but whosoever will be great among you, shall be your minister:
- <u>44</u> And whosoever of you will be the chiefest, shall be servant of all.

<u>45</u> For even the Son of man came not to be ministered unto, but to minister, and to give his life a ransom for many.

- Our greatest example of ministering to others is the Lord Jesus Christ.
- When we are good stewards, ministering our gift, we are exhibiting that gift to others.

Mark 14:8 She hath done what she could: she is come aforehand to anoint my body to the burying.

<u>Luke 17:10</u> So likewise ye, when ye shall have done all those things which are commanded you, say, We are unprofitable servants: we have done that which was our duty to do.

For us to exhibit the gift given to us is simply to do our duty, for His glory.

<u>1 Pet. 4:11</u> If any man speak, *let him speak* as the oracles of God; if any man minister, *let him do it* as of the ability which God giveth: that God in all things may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom be praise and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

<u>Prov. 23:26</u> My son, give me thine heart, and let thine eyes observe my ways.

Rom. 12:1 I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that **ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God**, *which is* your reasonable service.
