A few weeks ago we began focusing upon glorifying the Creator because His is worthy.

This morning, we will focus on the privilege of knowing our Creator, regarding the reason for encouragement.

I. THE COMPREHENSION OF THE CREATOR

A. The Privilege of Knowledge – 1:9 "...that ye might be filled with the knowledge of his will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding;"

B. The Power of Knowledge – 1:10-12

Col. 1:10 That ye might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God;

11 Strengthened with all might, according to his glorious power, unto all patience and longsuffering with joyfulness; 12 Giving thanks unto the Father, which hath made us meet to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in light:

- "...increasing in the knowledge of God;" 1:10
- "Strengthened with all might, according to his glorious power..."
- "...unto all patience and longsuffering with joyfulness;"
- "Giving thanks.... made us meet to be partakers..."

- C. The Person of Knowledge = The Lord Jesus Christ
- 14 In whom we have redemption through his blood, even the forgiveness of sins:
- 15 Who is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of every creature:

- 16 For by him were all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by him, and for him:

II. THE CONSISTENCY OF CONTROL

Col. 1:17b "...and by him all things consist."

A. The Consistency

God, and His Word, never changes.

Mal. 3:6 For I am the LORD, I change not; therefore ye sons of Jacob are not consumed.

Heb. 13:8 Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and to day, and for ever.

Psa. 119:89 For ever, O LORD, thy word is settled in heaven.

God is faithful and true to Himself and His Word.

1 Cor. 1:9 God is faithful, by whom ye were called unto the fellowship of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

Deut. 7:9 Know therefore that the LORD thy God, he is God, the faithful God, which keepeth covenant and mercy with them that love him and keep his commandments to a thousand generations;

B. The Control

- As the Creator, God is a God of order and complexity.
- As the Creator, the Lord Jesus Christ has all things under control – "...by him all things consist."

Original Word: συνίστημι Transliteration: sunistémi

Definition: I place together, commend, prove, consist, exhibit; instrans: I stand with; I am composed of, cohere = stand

together

synistáō (from sýn, "union, together with" and hístēmi, "to stand") – properly, "stand together," referring to facts "lining up" with each other to support (commend) something.

III. THE CAVEAT OF COMMITMENT

CAVEAT – "a warning or caution; admonition."

A. The Factor for His Peace

Rom. 8:28 And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to *his* purpose.

- When we are living daily in fellowship with Christ, we can be encouraged to know that all things work together for good, even when things are challenging.
- The caveat is realizing that we cannot we living out of fellowship and expecting this to be true.

Prov. 13:15 Good understanding giveth favour: but the way of transgressors is hard.

Right living for Christ is the result of right loving of Christ.

Rom. 8:28 And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to *his* purpose.

Short Definition: I work together
