V. THE OPERATIVES: THE FOUNDATIONAL EMPHASIS – SAUL/PAUL THE PIONEER, 13:1-21:26

- A. The First Missionary Journey: Exploration, 13:1-15:35
 - 1. The Commencement of the Journey, 13:1-3
 - a. The Godly Elders at Antioch, 13:1

Acts 13:1 Now there were in the church that was at Antioch certain prophets and teachers; as Barnabas, and Simeon that was called Niger, and Lucius of Cyrene, and Manaen, which had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch, and Saul.

The prominent leadership in the church at Antioch

- Barnabas apparently the leader of the church
- <u>Simeon that was called Niger</u> "Simeon" is a Jewish name, but this man's nickname or family name, Niger, is Roman and implies that he was dark skinned, possibly from Africa.
- <u>Lucius of Cyrene</u> "Lucius" was a common Roman name;
 "Luke" was his Greek name. He was from North Africa (cf. 11:20). It seems unlikely that he was the same Luke who wrote this book.
- Manaen, which had been brought up with Herod the tetrarch —
 "Herod the tetrarch" refers to Herod Antipas, who beheaded
 John the Baptist and tried Jesus (Mark 6:14-19; Luke 13:31-33;
 23:7-12). The designation seems to indicate a foster brother relationship.

- Comparing and contrasting "Herod the tetrarch" with "Manaen" is an example of great diversity of spirituality within the same household.
- Saul Saul was evidently the newcomer (cf. 7:58—8:3; 9:1-30; 11:25-30).
- This list of leaders shows that the church in Antioch was cosmopolitan, and that God had gifted it with several speakers who exhorted and taught the believers.
 - b. The Godly Exercise at Antioch, 13:2-3
 - (1) They Were Remarkable in Service, 13:2a

(a) They Were Spiritual —"As they ministered to the Lord..."

Original Word: λειτουργέω

Transliteration: leitourgeó

Definition: I act in the public service, render service, minister, in the widest sense, of some special public religious service, but also of the service of priests and Levites.

leitourgéō (from leitourgós, "someone who officially serves sovereign and community") – properly, to minister in an official (technical, authorized) capacity, especially on behalf of the community. For the believer, (leitourgós) refers to the priestly-ministering they give to God – which automatically impacts (for eternity) all who witness it. Because each believer is an official priest of God, their ministering to the Lord is equally profound with every "living sacrifice" offered up in faith (cf. Ro 12:1-3,15:27). Thus it also carries out His plan for His people.

(b) They Were Sincere – "...and fasted..."

Mark 9:29

And he said unto them, This kind can come forth by nothing, but by prayer and fasting.

He replied, "This kind can come out only by prayer."

English Standard Version

And he said to them, "This kind cannot be driven out by anything but prayer."

New American Standard Bible

And He said to them, "This kind cannot come out by anything but prayer."

Holman Christian Standard Bible

And He told them, "This kind can come out by nothing but prayer and fasting."

King James Bible

And he said unto them, This kind can come forth by nothing, but by prayer and fasting.

- (2) They Were Responsive to the Spirit, 13:2b "...the Holy Ghost said, Separate me Barnabas and Saul for the work whereunto I have called them."
- (3) They Were Ready to Sacrifice, 13:3
 - (a) Praying for Barnabas and Saul, 13:a "And when they had fasted and prayed..."
 - (b) Partners with Barnabas and Saul, 13:b "...and laid their hands on them..."
 - (c) Parting with Barnabas and Saul, 13:3c "...they sent them away."
- This short paragraph [13:1-3] marks a major departure in Luke's story.

Conclusion

Mt. 28:18 And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth.

19 Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:

20 Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, Io, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen.
