


2 Jn. 1:5 And now I beseech thee, lady, not as though I wrote a new commandment unto thee, but that which we had from the beginning, that we love one another.

## II. A WORD OF COMMAND, 1:5-6

A. Love demanded, 1:5

2 Jn. 1:5 And now I beseech thee, lady, not as though I wrote a new commandment unto thee, but that which we had from the beginning, that we love one another.

Original Word: ἐρωτάω Transliteration: erótaó

Definition: (a) I ask (a question), question, (b) I request, make a request to,

pray.

erōtáō (from eromai, "ask") – make an earnest request, especially by someone on "special footing," i.e. in "preferred position."

erōtáō ("to ask on special footing, intimacy") requests from a "preferred position" (E. Abbot, Johannine Grammar, 467,8). Such requesting receives special consideration because of the special relationship involved.

 To love one another is the implementation of a reciprocal relationship that pleases God.

B. Love defined, 1:6

2 Jn. 1:6 And this is love, that we walk after his commandments. This is the commandment, That, as ye have heard from the beginning, ye should walk in it.

Original Word: περιπατέω Transliteration: peripateó

Definition: I walk, hence Hebraistically (in an ethical sense): I

conduct my life, live.

1 Jn. 3:22 And whatsoever we ask, we receive of him, because we keep his commandments, and do those things that are pleasing in his sight.

## III. A WORD OF CAUTION, 1:7-11

A. The danger from the deceiver, 1:7-8

2 Jn. 1:7 For many deceivers are entered into the world, who confess not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh. This is a deceiver and an antichrist.

8 Look to yourselves, that we lose not those things which we have wrought, but that we receive a full reward.

Original Word: πλάνος Transliteration: planos

Definition: adj: misleading, deceiving, wandering; as subst: a

deceiver, imposter.

plános (a substantival adjective, derived from planáō, "wander") – a deceiver, trying to get others to also veer off God's course (path of safety). http://biblehub.com/greek/4108.htm

(1:8) 2 Jn. 1:8 Look to yourselves, that we lose not those things which we have wrought, but that we receive a full reward.

Original Word: βλέπω

Transliteration: blepó

Definition: (primarily physical), I look, see, perceive, discern

(Imperative in 2 Jn. 1:8)

blépō – properly, to see, be observant (watchful). (blépō) suggests "to see something physical, with spiritual results (perception)." That is, it carries what is seen into the non-physical (immaterial) realm so a person can take the needed action (respond, beware, be alert). <a href="http://biblehub.com/greek/991.htm">http://biblehub.com/greek/991.htm</a>



## **WROUGHT**

- 1. Worked; formed by work or labor; as wrought iron.
- 2. Effected; performed.

She hath wrought a good work upon me. Matthew 26:10.

**3.** Effected; produced. He *wrought* the public safety. A great change was *wrought* in his mind.

This wrought the greatest confusion in the unbelieving Jews.

4. Used in labor.

The elders of that city shall take a heifer that hath not been wrought with. **Deuteronomy 21:3**.

Original Word: ἐργάζομαι

Transliteration: ergazomai

Definition: I work, trade, perform, do, practice, commit, acquire by

labor.

ergázomai (from érgon, "work" found in 1 Cor. 3:13-15) <a href="http://biblehub.com/greek/2038.htm">http://biblehub.com/greek/2038.htm</a>

- 1 Cor. 3:9 For we are labourers together with God: ye are God's husbandry, ye are God's building.
- 10 According to the grace of God which is given unto me, as a wise masterbuilder, I have laid the foundation, and another buildeth thereon. But let every man take heed how he buildeth thereupon.
- 11 For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ.
- 12 Now if any man build upon this foundation gold, silver, precious stones, wood, hay, stubble;
- 13 Every man's work shall be made manifest: for the day shall declare it, because it shall be revealed by fire; and the fire shall try every man's work of what sort it is.
- 14 If any man's work abide which he hath built thereupon, he shall receive a **reward**.
- 15 If any man's work shall be burned, he shall suffer loss: but he himself shall be saved; yet so as by fire.

- 7. A believer can lose his LIFE (1 Cor. 10:10-11)

Original Word: μισθός

Transliteration: misthos

Definition: (a) pay, wages, salary, (b) reward, recompense,

punishment.


misthós – a reward (recompense) that appropriately compensates a particular decision (action).
