Being a godly husband means to be a "blessing" to your wife!

Being a godly wife has many similar characteristics that it takes to be a godly husband, but there are also different challenges. Should a wife be concerned about "complementarianism" or "egalitarianism"? What does the Bible say?



DEFINING THE DEBATE

Complementarianism –The belief that a husband should be the spiritual head of his family, and that husband and wife will have different and complementary roles in their marriage.

Egalitarianism – The belief that there are no separate gender roles in marriage, and that husband and wife will lead the family collaboratively.

The Bible teaches "complementarianism." A Christian woman that loves the Lord should want to do that which pleases Him.

The Bible gives specific duties for the wife. Let's begin looking at them.

III. THE ROLE OF THE WIFE IN GLORIFYING THE CREATOR

A. The Responsibility of the Aged Women, Titus 2:3

<u>Titus 2:3</u> directs the older women to have "...behaviour as becometh holiness..." in order to teach younger women about the role of a godly wife.

Original Word: κατάστημα, Transliteration: katastéma Definition: behavior, conduct, deportment, demeanor.

katástēma (from *katá, "down,* exactly according to," intensifying *hístēmi,* "stand") – properly, stand *down,* referring to what is *established,* i.e. settled *according to* a *fixed, exact design* (used only in Titus 2:3).

katástēma ("settled-lifestyle") refers to a believer exemplifying enduring qualities that specifically (exactly) glorify the Lord.

[(*katástēma*) primarily refers to a "*condition, state*, of the body, etc., hence *demeanor*"] <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/2688.htm</u> When a wife strives to model Christ, she influences her husband with her Godly behavior

The behavior to glorify the Lord includes that which "...becometh holiness..."

Original Word: ἱεροπρεπής Transliteration: hieroprepés Definition: suitable to a sacred character, reverent.

hieroprepéss (from *hieron*, "a sacred place, a temple," and *prépō*, "fitting") –"befitting men, places, actions, or things sacred to God, reverent" (K. Wuest); "*suited* to a sacred **character, reverend**" (*Abbott-Smith*). <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/2412.htm</u>

Such behavior that "becometh holiness" is "...not false accusers, not given to much wine, teachers of good things;"

"not false accusers"

Original Word: διάβολος Transliteration: diabolos Definition: (adj. used often as a noun), slanderous; with the article: the Slanderer (par excellence), the Devil.

diábolos (from diabállō, "to slander, accuse, defame") – properly, a slanderer; a false accuser; unjustly criticizing to hurt (malign) and condemn to sever a relationship. [(diábolos) is the root of the English word, "Devil" (see also Webster's Dictionary)

(*diabolos*) in *secular* Greek means "backbiter," i.e. an accuser, calumniator (slanderer). (*diábolos*) is literally someone who "*casts through*," i.e. making charges that bring down (destroy). Satan is *used* by God in this plan – as a predictable wind-up toy, playing out his evil nature.] <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/1228.htm</u> "not given to much wine"

Original Word: δουλόω Transliteration: douloó Definition: I enslave.

doulóō – enslave (passive, "become enslaved"), focusing on the status of being a bond-slave. In contrast to the other verb-form of the same root (*douleúō*), *doulóō*) stresses the *results* (effects) of enslavement. That is, what automatically goes with *belonging to another*. http://biblehub.com/greek/1402.htm

"teachers of good things;"

Original Word: καλοδιδάσκαλος Transliteration: kalodidaskalos Definition: a teacher of that which is noble (honorable) and good.

kalodidáskalos (from kalós, "attractively good" and didáskalos, "a teacher") – properly, a teacher sharing what is honorable and noble – literally, "a teacher of winsome goodness." http://biblehub.com/greek/2567.htm

 A good woman, with a sweet spirit, is needed in order to teach good things for the younger women to also have a sweet spirit.

• The "good things" are the focus for the younger women.

B. The Role of the Younger Women, Titus 2:4-5

<u>Prov. 9:1</u> Wisdom hath builded her house, she hath hewn out her seven pillars:

Titus 2:4-5 gives us "seven pillars" regarding the role of the wife in glorifying the Creator.

<u>1 Tim. 5:14</u> I will therefore that the younger women marry, bear children, guide the house, give none occasion to the adversary to speak reproachfully.

Original Word: σωφρονίζ Transliteration: sóphronizó Definition: I make sober-minded, admonish, control.

sōphronízō (from *sṓphrōn*, "truly *moderate*") – being radicallymoderate, i.e. living as *God* defines *true balance* (used only in Titus 2:4).

sōphronízō (literally "living in divine *moderation*") is moving in the "bigger picture" transforming someone to be "radically-balanced" according to the Lord's will. This radical-moderation requires a *complete* perspective that is eclectic, combining the legitimate extremities of truth from both sides of a matter. Doing this is vital to counseling young women (mothers) in the will of God (Titus 2:4).

[(*sōphronízō*) and (*sōphronéō*) are both *verbs*, and are both formed from the same root (*sṓphrōn*). (*sōphronízō*) emphasizes *passing on* what the Lord reveals is true balance. (*sōphronéō*) expresses a *settled state of mind* that embraces what the Lord defines is true (radical) moderation.] <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/4994.htm</u> Restore one to his senses
To moderate, control, curb, disciple
To hold one to his duty
To admonish, to exhort earnestly

2. The Pillar of Complementarity – "...to love their husbands..."

"to love their husbands"

Original Word: φίλανδρος Transliteration: philandros Definition: loving one's husband.

phílandros (from *phílos*, "loving friend" and *anér*, "husband, the male companion of a wife") – **properly**, the special affection of a woman for her life-time mate (husband), embracing him as her "calling" (stewardship) from God (used only in Titus 2:4). <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/5362.htm</u>

 Being a loving friend produces deeper fellowship and companionship, laying a foundation for a more enjoyable future.

3. The Pillar of Compassion – "...to love their children..."

"to love their children"

Original Word: φιλότεκνος Transliteration: philoteknos Definition: loving one's children. <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/5388.htm</u>

<u>Prov. 29:15</u> The rod and reproof give wisdom: but a child left *to himself* bringeth his mother to shame.

<u>Prov. 13:24</u> He that spareth his rod hateth his son: but he that loveth him chasteneth him betimes.

4. The Pillar of Conduct – "...discreet, chaste..."

"To be discreet"

Original Word: σώφρων Transliteration: sóphrón Definition: of sound mind, self-controlled, temperate, sober-minded, modest, discreet.

sóphron (from *soos*, "sound, safe" and *phrén*, "inner outlook" which regulates outward behavior) – properly, safe (sound) because *moderated*, referring to what is prudent because correctly (divinely) balanced (which is far more than being "the middle of the road")

sốphrōn ("acting in God's definition of *balance*") makes someone *genuinely temperate*, i.e. *well-balanced* from *God's perspective*. *True balance* is not "one-size-fits-all" nor is it blandly static. Biblical moderation (*sốphrōn*) describes "*a man who does not command himself*, but rather *is commanded by God*"" (K. Wuest, *Word Studies*, 2, 46). This root (*sōphro-*, "soundness") then reflects living in *God-defined* balance.

[The root (*phrēn*) is the root of "*diaphram*," the inner organ (muscle) that regulates physical life, controlling breathing and heart beat.

Example: An opera singer controls the length (quality) of their tones by their *diaphragm* which even controls the ability to breathe and *moderates* heartbeat. Hence it *regulates* ("brings *safety*") to the body, keeping it *properly controlled*.] <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/4998.htm</u>

<u>discreet</u>

1. Judicious in one's conduct or speech, especially with regard to respecting privacy or maintaining silence about something of a delicate nature; prudent; circumspect.

2. Showing prudence and circumspection; decorous: a discreet silence.

3. Modestly unobtrusive; unostentatious: http://www.dictionary.com/browse/discreet?s=t

- A discreet wife keeps herself properly balanced while multi-tasking many things.
- A discreet wife has herself under control while everything else goes to pieces.

"chaste"

Original Word: ἀγνός Transliteration: hagnos Definition: (originally, in a condition prepared for worship), pure (either ethically, or ritually, ceremonially), chaste.

hagnós (an adjective, which may be cognate with hágios, "holy") – properly, pure (to the core); virginal (chaste, unadultered); pure inside and out; holy because uncontaminated (undefiled from sin), i.e. without spoilation even within (even down to the center of one's being); not mixed with guilt or anything condemnable. http://biblehub.com/greek/53.htm Sure, modesty has a price. You will not attract as many lustful people as you otherwise would. But it will probably attract someone who knows the difference between love and lust.

5. The Pillar of Caretaking – "...keepers at home..."

<u>Prov. 14:1</u> Every wise woman buildeth her house: but the foolish plucketh it down with her hands.

• The foolish woman misuses the opportunity, but the Virtuous Woman builds upon the opportunity to build her home.

<u>Prov. 31:13</u> She seeketh wool, and flax, and worketh willingly with her hands.

"keepers at home"

Original Word: οὐκουρός Transliteration: oikouros Definition: a keeper-at-home, a housekeeper. <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/3626.htm</u> <u>1 Tim. 5:11</u> But the younger widows refuse: for when they have begun to wax wanton against Christ, they will marry;

<u>12</u> Having damnation, because they have cast off their first faith. <u>13</u> And withal they learn *to be* idle, wandering about from house to house; and not only idle, but tattlers also and busybodies, speaking things which they ought not.

<u>14</u> I will therefore that the younger women marry, bear children, guide the house, give none occasion to the adversary to speak reproachfully.

Original Word: οἰκοδεσποτέω Transliteration: oikodespoteó Definition: I manage a household. <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/3616.htm</u> <u>Luke 13:25</u> When once **the master of the house** is risen up, and hath shut to the door, and ye begin to stand without, and to knock at the door, saying, Lord, Lord, open unto us; and he shall answer and say unto you, I know you not whence ye are:

6. The Pillar of Character – "...good..."

"good"

Original Word: ἀγαθός Transliteration: agathos Definition: intrinsically good, good in nature, good whether it be seen to be so or not, the widest and most colorless of all words with this meaning.

agathós – inherently (intrinsically) *good*; as to the believer, (*agathós*) describes what *originates from God* and is *empowered* by Him in their life, through faith. http://biblehub.com/greek/18.htm Character goes beyond where we happen to find ourselves on Sunday morning where everyone sees us. It's where we find ourselves on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday night when only God is watching.

"obedient to their own husbands"

Original Word: ὑποτάσσω Transliteration: hupotassó Definition: I place under, subject to; mid, pass: I submit, put myself into subjection.

hypotássō (from *hypó*, "under" and *tássō*, "arrange") – properly, "under God's arrangement," i.e. submitting to the Lord (His plan). <u>http://biblehub.com/greek/5293.htm</u>
