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(2) The High Point, 16:1b-3

(a) The Faithful Commencement of Timothy, 16:1b "...and, behold, a certain disciple was there, named Timotheus, the son of a certain woman, which was a Jewess, and believed; but his father was a Greek:

<u>1 Cor. 4:17</u> For this cause have I sent unto you Timotheus, who is my beloved son, and faithful in the Lord, who shall bring you into remembrance of my ways which be in Christ, as I teach every where in every church.

<u>2 Tim. 1:5</u> When I call to remembrance the unfeigned faith that is in thee, which dwelt first in thy grandmother Lois, and thy mother Eunice; and I am persuaded that in thee also. <u>2 Tim. 3:15</u> And that from a child thou hast known the holy scriptures, which are able to make thee wise unto salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus.

(b) The Fine Commendation of Timothy, 16:2

Acts 16:2 Which was well reported of by the brethren that were at Lystra and Iconium.

(c) The Full Commitment of Timothy, 16:3

Acts 16:3 Him would Paul have to go forth with him; and took and circumcised him because of the Jews which were in those quarters: for they knew all that his father was a Greek.

<u>1 Cor. 7:19</u> Circumcision is nothing, and uncircumcision is nothing, but the keeping of the commandments of God.

 Paul put into practice the principle stated in Jerusalem in Acts 15.

<u>1 Cor. 9:20</u> And unto the Jews I became as a Jew, that I might gain the Jews; to them that are under the law, as under the law, that I might gain them that are under the law; <u>21</u> To them that are without law, as without law, (being not without law to God, but under the law to Christ,) that I might gain them that are without law. <u>22</u> To the weak became I as weak, that I might gain the weak: I

am made all things to all *men*, that I might by all means save some.

 In order to win someone to Christ, we make adjustments to accommodate the lost. Rom. 14:13 Let us not therefore judge one another any more: but judge this rather, that no man put a stumblingblock or an occasion to fall in *his* brother's way. 14 I know, and am persuaded by the Lord Jesus, that *there is* nothing unclean of itself: but to him that esteemeth any thing to be unclean, to him *it is* unclean. 15 But if thy brother be grieved with *thy* meat, now walkest thou not charitably. Destroy not him with thy meat, for whom Christ died.

 The greater principle is to crucify our flesh, lay aside our preeminence for the sake of someone else – walking in love toward "them that are without..."

Eph. 5:2 And walk in love, as Christ also hath loved us, and hath given himself for us an offering and a sacrifice to God for a sweetsmelling savour. Col. 4:5 Walk in wisdom toward them that are without, redeeming the time.

(3) The Highlights, 16:4-5

(a) The Local Churches Enlightened,

<u>Acts 16:4</u> And as they went through the cities, they delivered them the decrees for to keep, that were ordained of the apostles and elders which were at Jerusalem.

b. A Time of Vagueness, 16:6-8

(1) Paul Leading Westward – But Aware of the Spirit's Refusal, 16:6

<u>Acts 16:6</u> Now when they had gone throughout Phrygia and the region of Galatia, and were forbidden of the Holy Ghost to preach the word in Asia,



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(2) Paul Leaning Northward – But Aware of the Spirit's Restraint, 16:7

<u>Acts 16:7</u> After they were come to Mysia, they assayed to go into Bithynia: but the Spirit suffered them not.
