

I. A GODLY FATHER MUST LEAD

Gen. 18:19 For I know him, that he will command his children and his household after him, and they shall keep the way of the LORD, to do justice and judgment; that the LORD may bring upon Abraham that which he hath spoken of him.

II. A GODLY FATHER MUST LISTEN

Prov. 18:13 He that answereth a matter before he heareth it, it is folly and shame unto him.

A. Listen to lead

Prov. 1:5 A wise man will hear, and will increase learning; and a man of understanding shall attain unto wise counsels:

Talking and listening to your child holds a lot of importance, as it helps your child build a bond with you and develop his trust. It improves the bonding in a relationship, and builds a child's confidence. Not many parents have the skill to 'listen', but with a conscious effort, they can develop it. And slowly, with practice, you can better it as well.

When you are trying to talk or communicate with your child you should:

Encourage your child to open up with you by talking
Be patient and listen to your child while he puts his feelings and
thoughts across

Respond in a sensitive way to everything that he says, good or bad

Focus on body language and actions, so as to understand the non-verbal forms of his communication

B. Lead to listen

 A godly father teaches his children the value of listening by implementing the principle himself – LEAD BY DOING.

Prov. 4:1 Hear, ye children, the instruction of a father, and attend to know understanding.

Prov. 8:33 Hear instruction, and be wise, and refuse it not.

Prov. 23:19 Hear thou, my son, and be wise, and guide thine heart in the way.

<u>Prov. 19:20</u> Hear counsel, and receive instruction, that thou mayest be wise in thy latter end. ...

27 Cease, my son, to hear the instruction that causeth to err from the words of knowledge.

Prov. 22:17 Bow down thine ear, and hear the words of the wise, and apply thine heart unto my knowledge.

Eccl. 7:5 It is better to hear the rebuke of the wise, then for a man to hear the song of fools.

III. A GODLY FATHER MUST LEARN

<u>Prov. 1:8</u> My son, hear the instruction of thy father, and forsake not the law of thy mother:

A. The Teacher has been Taught

Job 36:22 Behold, God exalteth by his power: who teacher like him?

Prov. 9:9 Give *instruction* to a wise *man*, and he will be yet wiser: a just *man*, and he will increase in learning.

Psa. 25:4 Shew me thy ways, O LORD; teach me thy paths.

B. The Teacher has to Teach

Psa. 34:11 Come, ye children, hearken unto me: I will you the fear of the LORD.

2 Tim. 2:24 And the servant of the Lord must not strive; but be gentle unto all men, and to teach, patient,



IV. A GODLY FATHER MUST LET

A. The Preparation for Living = Father's Role

V. A GODLY FATHER MUST LOVE

Jn. 3:35 The Father loveth the Son, and hath given all things into his hand.

Jn. 5:20 For the the land the Son, and sheweth him all things that himself doeth: and he will shew him greater works than these, that ye may marvel.

A. Love that is Tangible

1 Jn. 3:18 My little children, let us not love in word, neither in tongue; but in decoration and in truth.

B. Love that is Tough

Prov. 3:12 For whom the LORD loveth he correcteth; even as a father the son *in whom* he delighteth.

C. Love that is Tender

Eph. 6:4 And, ye fathers, provoke not your to wrath: but bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

Col. 3:21 Fathers, provoke not your children to anger, lest they be discouraged.

D. Love that is Trustworthy

1 Jn. 3:18 My little children, let us not less in word, neither in tongue; but in deed and in the let.



VI. A GODLY FATHER MUST LEAVE

Heb. 9:27 And as it is appointed unto men once to die, but after this the judgment:

- A. Cultivate an Attitude of Acceptance
- B. Cultivate an Attitude of Appreciation

VII. A GODLY FATHER MUST LIVE

Heb. 13:18 Pray for us: for we trust we have a good conscience, in all things willing to live honestly.
