John next explained a vision of the glorified Christ that God had given him (cf. Isa. 6; Ezek. 1).

• First, he related the circumstances of his first commission to write (vv. 9-11).

Second, he provided a detailed description of the source of that commission (vv. 12-16).

 Third, he explained more about his commission and the One who gave it (vv. 17-20).

III. THE CHARACTER OF THE AGE, 1:9-20

A. It Is an Age of Individual Witness, 1:9

<u>Rev. 1:9</u> I John, who also am your brother, and companion in tribulation, and in the kingdom and patience of Jesus Christ, was in the isle that is called Patmos, for the word of God, and for the testimony of Jesus Christ. Original Word: συγκοινωνός Transliteration: sugkoinónos Definition: a partaker with, co-partner. (companion) http://biblehub.com/greek/4791.htm

Original Word: θλῖψις **Transliteration:** thlipsis **Definition:** persecution, affliction, distress, tribulation.

thlípsis – properly, *pressure* (what constricts or rubs together), used of a narrow place that "hems someone in"; *tribulation*, especially *internal pressure* that causes someone to feel confined (restricted, "without options").

thlípsis ("compression, tribulation") carries the challenge of coping with the *internal* pressure of a *tribulation*, especially when feeling there is "no way of escape" ("hemmed in"). <u>https://biblehub.com/greek/2347.htm</u> **Original Word:** ὑπομονή **Transliteration:** hupomoné **Definition:** endurance, steadfastness, patient waiting for.

hypomoné – properly, remaining under, endurance; steadfastness, especially as God enables the believer to "remain (endure) under" the challenges He allots in life. https://biblehub.com/greek/5281.htm

John described himself to his readers as their "brother" in Christ, and as a "companion" with them in three things:

1. These were, first, the religious persecution ("tribulation") they were presently experiencing as a result of their faith in Jesus Christ.

Jn. 16:33 These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world.

<u>Acts 14:22</u> Confirming the souls of the disciples, *and* exhorting them to continue in the faith, and that we must through much tribulation enter into the kingdom of God.

<u>Rom. 8:17</u> And if children, then heirs; heirs of God, and joint-heirs with Christ; **if so be that we suffer with** *him*, **that we may be also glorified together**.

<u>2 Tim. 2:12</u> If we suffer, we shall also reign with *him*: if we deny *him*, he also will deny us:

<u>2 Tim. 3:12</u> Yea, and all that will live godly in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution.

2. Second, they shared in the present and future "kingdom" of Jesus Christ.

<u>Rev. 1:6</u> And hath made us kings and priests unto God and his Father; to him *be* glory and dominion for ever and ever. Amen.

<u>Rev. 5:10</u> And hast made us unto our God kings and priests: and we shall reign on the earth.

Luke 12:32 Fear not, little flock; for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom.

Luke 22:29 And I appoint unto you a kingdom, as my Father hath appointed unto me;

<u>1 Thess. 2:12</u> That ye would walk worthy of God, who hath called you unto his kingdom and glory.

<u>2 Thess. 1:5</u> Which is a manifest token of the righteous judgment of God, that ye may be counted worthy of the kingdom of God, for which ye also suffer:

Jas. 2:5 Hearken, my beloved brethren, Hath not God chosen the poor of this world rich in faith, and heirs of the kingdom which he hath promised to them that love him?

3. Third, their "patience" as they remained steadfast in the midst of affliction.

<u>1 Thess. 1:6</u> And ye became followers of us, and of the Lord, having received the word in much affliction, with joy of the Holy Ghost:

<u>1 Pet. 2:21</u> For even hereunto were ye called: because Christ also suffered for us, leaving us an example, that ye should follow his steps:

<u>1 Pet. 4:13</u> But rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings; that, when his glory shall be revealed, ye may be glad also with exceeding joy.

<u>2 Cor. 1:7</u> And our hope of you *is* stedfast, knowing, that as ye are partakers of the sufferings, so *shall ye be* also of the consolation.

<u>Phil. 3:10</u> That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death;

I, John, your brother and companion in the suffering and kingdom and patient endurance that are ours in Jesus, was on the island of Patmos because of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus.

New American Standard Bible

I, John, your brother and fellow partaker in the tribulation and kingdom and perseverance which are in Jesus, was on the island called Patmos because of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus.

Christian Standard Bible

I, John, your brother and partner in the affliction, kingdom, and endurance that are in Jesus, was on the island called Patmos because of the word of God and the testimony of Jesus.

King James Bible
