The town was noteworthy for three reasons:

- First, it was a center for many pagan religious cults, and emperor worship was more intense there than in any other surrounding city.
- Second, it boasted a university with a large library, second only to the one in Alexandria.
- Third, it was the leader and center of the production of parchment, which derived its name from the city.

The omniscience of Christ indicated by the word "know:"

Original Word: οἶδα Transliteration: eidó Definition: I know, remember, appreciate. https://biblehub.com/greek/1492.htm The Lord knows the character of the church in Pergamos: "I know thy works, and where thou dwellest, even where Satan's seat is: and thou holdest fast my name..."

Original Word: ἕργον **Transliteration:** ergon **Definition: work**, task, employment; a deed, action; that which is wrought or made, a work.

érgon (from *ergō*, "to work, accomplish") – a *work* or *worker* who accomplishes something. *érgon* ("work") is a deed (action) that carries out (completes) an *inner desire* (intension, purpose). https://biblehub.com/greek/2041.htm 2. Their Loyalty to the Lord's Precepts, 2:13b "...And hast not denied my faith, even in those days wherein Antipas *was* my faithful martyr, who was slain among you, where Satan dwelleth."

- Mystery Babylon the connection with Tammuz, Semiramis, Nimrod, etc. – moved from Babylon to Pergamos in 133 B.C.
- The term ex cathedra = "from the throne"

B. The False Creeds in This Church, 2:14-15

1. The Doctrine of Balaam, 2:14

<u>Rev. 2:14</u> But I have a few things against thee, because thou hast there them that hold the doctrine of Balaam, who taught Balac to cast a stumblingblock before the children of Israel, to eat things sacrificed unto idols, and to commit fornication.

- Balaam told Balak that he could overcome the Israelites if he would involve them in Moabite religious feasts that included sacred prostitution (Num. 25).
- This would render them unfaithful to God and consequently subject to His discipline.

 The pagans in Pergamum, likewise, were evidently encouraging the Christians to join in their pagan feasts, and the sexual immorality that accompanied those feasts.

 By thus participating, some in the church had given tacit approval to Balaam's teaching.

2. The Doctrine of the Nicolaitans, 2:15

<u>Rev. 2:15</u> So hast thou also them that hold the doctrine of the Nicolaitans, which thing I hate.

C. The Fearful Crisis in This Church, 2:16-17

1. How the Lord Warned the Church, 2:16

<u>Rev. 2:16</u> Repent; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will fight against them with the sword of my mouth.

<u>1 Cor. 11:31</u> For if we would judge ourselves, we should not be judged.

<u>Num. 31:8</u> And they slew the kings of Midian, beside the rest of them that were slain; *namely*, Evi, and Rekem, and Zur, and Hur, and Reba, five kings of Midian: Balaam also the son of Beor they slew with the sword.

2. How the Lord Wooed the Church, 2:17

<u>Rev. 2:17</u> He that hath an ear, let him hear what the Spirit saith unto the churches; To him that overcometh will I give to eat of the hidden manna, and will give him a white stone, and in the stone a new name written, which no man knoweth saving he that receiveth *it*.
