

Acts 21:1 And it came to pass, that after we were gotten from them, and had launched, we came with a straight course unto Coos, and the *day* following unto Rhodes, and from thence unto Patara:

Their Loving Fellowship, 21:5

Acts 21:5 And when we had accomplished those days, we departed and went our way; and they all brought us on our way, with wives and children, till *we were* out of the city: and we kneeled down on the shore, and prayed.

Their Last Farewell, 21:6

Acts 21:6 And when we had taken our leave one of another, we took ship; and they returned home again.

(a) A Kindly Stop at Ptolemais, 21:7

i. Philip's Fame, 21:8

b. Paul's Coming Travails, 21:10-17

(1) The Deterring Prophecy, 21:10-11

(a) What Agabus Did, 21:10-11a

Acts 21:10 "And as we tarried *there* many days, there came down from Judaea a certain prophet, named Agabus. <u>11</u> And when he was come unto us, he took Paul's girdle, and bound his own hands and feet..." Mark 9:31 For he taught his disciples, and said unto them, The Son of man is delivered into the hands of men, and they shall kill him; and after that he is killed, he shall rise the third day.

Mark 10:33 Saying, Behold, we go up to Jerusalem; and the Son of man shall be delivered unto the chief priests, and unto the scribes; and they shall condemn him to death, and shall deliver him to the Gentiles:

<u>Jn. 21:18</u> Verily, verily, I say unto thee, When thou wast young, thou girdedst thyself, and walkedst whither thou wouldest: but when thou shalt be old, thou shalt stretch forth thy hands, and another shall gird thee, and carry *thee* whither thou wouldest not.

(b) What Agabus Declared, 21:11b "...and said, Thus saith the Holy Ghost, So shall the Jews at Jerusalem bind the man that owneth this girdle, and shall deliver *him* into the hands of the Gentiles."

(2) The Detaining People, 21:12

Acts 21:12 And when we heard these things, both we, and they of that place, besought him not to go up to Jerusalem.

(3) The Determined Paul. 21:13-17

## (a) His Passionate Fervor, 21:13

Acts 21:13 Then Paul answered, What mean ye to weep and to break mine heart? for I am ready not to be bound only, but also to die at Jerusalem for the name of the Lord Jesus.

<u>Rom. 9:1</u> I say the truth in Christ, I lie not, my conscience also bearing me witness in the Holy Ghost,

2 That I have great heaviness and continual sorrow in my heart.
 3 For I could wish that myself were accursed from Christ for my brethren, my kinsmen according to the flesh:

Phil. 3:4 Though I might also have confidence in the flesh. If any other man thinketh that he hath whereof he might trust in the flesh, I more:

5 Circumcised the eighth day, of the stock of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, an Hebrew of the Hebrews; as touching the law, a Pharisee;

<u>6</u> Concerning zeal, persecuting the church; touching the righteousness which is in the law, blameless.

Luke 9:51 And it came to pass, when the time was come that he should be received up, he stedfastly set his face to go to Jerusalem,

Luke 22:42 Saying, Father, if thou be willing, remove this cup from me: nevertheless not my will, but thine, be done.

(b) His Patient Friends, 21:14-17

i. Accepting Him, 21:14

<u>Acts 21:14</u> And when he would not be persuaded, we ceased, saying, The will of the Lord be done.

ii. Accompanying Him, 21:15-17

The Final Journey Recorded, 21:15-16

Acts 21:15 And after those days we took up our carriages, and went up to Jerusalem. <u>16</u> There went with us also *certain* of the disciples of Caesarea, and brought with them one Mnason of Cyprus, an old disciple, with whom we should lodge.

The Fateful Jerusalem Reached, 21:17

Acts 21:17 And when we were come to Jerusalem, the brethren received us gladly.
