In the English language, the word “as” can be used for a variety of purposes. It can be used as a conjunction, preposition, or adverb depending on the context.

Romans 1:21 Because that, when they knew God, they glorified him not **as** God, neither were thankful; but became vain in their imaginations, and their foolish heart was darkened.

An adverb modifying the verb “glorified”. “**As**”: *hōs*: as, like, even as, to the same degree or amount.


“When they knew”: *ginōskō*. To know, understand, perceive, have knowledge of, to understand completely.

“Glorified not”: *doxazō*. To think, suppose, be of opinion; to praise, extol, magnify, celebrate.

“Imaginations”: *dialogismos*. The thinking of a man deliberating with himself; a thought, inward reasoning.




