(1) A Note of Chastening, 27:21

Acts 27:21 But after long abstinence Paul stood forth in the midst of them, and said, Sirs, ye should have hearkened unto me, and not have loosed from Crete, and to have gained this harm and loss.

(2) A Note of Cheer, 27:22-24

(a)God's Promise, 27:22

Acts 27:22 And now I exhort you to be of good cheer: for there shall be no loss of any man's life among you, but of the ship.

<u>Heb. 6:18</u> That by two immutable things, in which *it was* impossible for God to lie, we might have a strong consolation, who have fled for refuge to lay hold upon the hope set before us:

(b) God's Purposes, 27:23-24a "For there stood by me this night the angel of God, whose I am, and whom I serve, <u>24</u> Saying, Fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar..."

"...the angel of God..." = a Christophany

Ex. 3:2 And the angel of the LORD appeared unto him in a flame of fire out of the midst of a bush: and he looked, and, behold, the bush burned with fire, and the bush *was* not consumed... <u>4</u> And when the LORD saw that he turned aside to see, God called unto him out of the midst of the bush, and said, Moses, Moses. And he said, Here *am* I. (c) God's Presence, 27:24b "...and, lo, God hath given thee all them that sail with thee."

<u>Acts 27:25</u> Wherefore, sirs, be of good cheer: for I believe God, that it shall be even as it was told me. <u>26</u> Howbeit we must be cast upon a certain island.
