




## **Invite Your One**


The Invite Your One is a program that provides each one the opportunity to have a "Personalized Arise and Build" involvement in our church.



























- The spiritual development of a believer is to move from the old life of carnality and selfishness, to the transforming lifestyle of a believer who lives life to honor and glorify God.

  - ❖ The spiritual growth is indicated by moving from "good" → "acceptable" → perfect "will of God."

















## B. The Application of Diversity, 12:6-8


Rom. 12:6 Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, whether prophecy, let us prophesy according to the proportion of faith;

7 Or ministry, let us wait on our ministering: or he that teacheth, on teaching;

<u>8</u> Or he that exhorteth, on exhortation: he that giveth, *let him do it* with simplicity; he that ruleth, with diligence; he that sheweth mercy, with cheerfulness.

Eccl. 9:10 Whatsoever thy hand findeth to do, do it with thy might; for there is no work, nor device, nor knowledge, nor wisdom, in the grave, whither thou goest.

Jn. 2:5 His mother saith unto the servants, Whatsoever he saith unto you, do it.



## Summary: How do we strip away selfishness? 1. Romans 12:3a "For I say, through the grace given unto me..." Humility begins with grace (unmerited favor from an unobligated Giver). 2. Romans 12:3 "...not to think of himself more highly than he ought to think..." Humility continues with true self-awareness. 3. Romans 12:4 "...we have many members in one body..." Selfless individuals become unified.
