a. The Monarchs, 18:9-10

- 81% of them are trapped in forced labor.
- 25% of them are children.
- 75% are women and girls.
- The International Labor Organization estimates that forced labor and human trafficking is a \$150 billion industry worldwide.
- The U.S. Department of Labor has identified 148 goods from 75 countries made by forced and child labor.
- In 2017, an estimated 1 out of 7 endangered runaways reported to the <u>National Center for Missing and Exploited Children</u> were likely child sex trafficking victims.
 - Of those, 88% were in the care of social services or foster care when they ran.
