

Isa. 9:6 For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.

7 Of the increase of *his* government and peace *there shall be* no end, upon the throne of David, and upon his kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from henceforth even for ever. The zeal of the LORD of hosts will perform this.

When the Lord Jesus arrived in Bethlehem, what is commonly called "the First Advent," He was anticipated by many who knew that a Messiah had been prophesied. Consider Andrew and the Samaritan woman:

Jn. 1:41 He first findeth his own brother Simon, and saith unto him, We have found the Messias, which is, being interpreted, the Christ.

Jn. 4:25 The woman saith unto him, I know that Messias cometh, which is called Christ: when he is come, he will tell us all things.

26 Jesus saith unto her, I that speak unto thee am he.

The Lord Jesus, God Incarnate, came the first time as the "Suffering Messiah," and He will appear the next time as the "Reigning Messiah." This Christmas Eve we focus a few minutes on

<u>Psa. 2:2</u> The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the LORD, and against his anointed, saying,

<u>LORD hath anointed me</u> to preach good tidings unto the meek; he hath sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to *them that are* bound;

Luke 4:18 The Spirit of the Lord *is* upon me, because **he hath** anointed me to preach the gospel to the poor; he hath sent me to heal the brokenhearted, to preach deliverance to the captives, and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty them that are bruised,

**Transliteration:** Messias

**Definition:** Messiah, the O.T. title corresponding to Christ

Usage: Messiah, the Anointed One.

Messias – literally, "the anointed one," referring to Jesus as the Christ – supremely empowered by the Holy Spirit to accomplish all of the divine plan.

This Christmas Eve we will focus upon three considerations regarding the Messiah.

## II. THE PRESENTATION OF THE MESSIAH

Isa. 7:14 Therefore the Lord himself shall give you a sign; Behold, a virgin shall conceive, and bear a son, and shall call his name Immanuel.

Mt. 1:22 Now all this was done, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken of the Lord by the prophet, saying, 23 Behold, a virgin shall be with child, and shall bring forth a son, and they shall call his name Emmanuel, which being interpreted is, God with us.

Before a sinner comes to Christ, there must be an introduction ("presentation") and a realization of the true purpose of Christmas.

Luke 19:10 For the Son of man is come to seek and to save that which was lost.

1 Tim. 1:15 This is a faithful saying, and worthy of all acceptation, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners; of whom I am chief.

Luke 5:31 And Jesus answering said unto them, They that are whole need not a physician; but they that are sick.

32 I came not to call the righteous, but sinners to repentance.

- As prophesied, a virgin did conceive, had a son, and He was called Emmanuel "God with us."
- The greatest event in all of history was the Incarnation:

1 Tim. 3:16 And without controversy great is the mystery of godliness: God was manifest in the flesh, justified in the Spirit, seen of angels, preached unto the Gentiles, believed on in the world, received up into glory.

Jhn 1:14 And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.

## III. THE PRESENCE OF THE MESSIAH

Heb. 13:5 Let your conversation be without covetousness; and be content with such things as ye have: for he hath said, I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee.

The prophesied Messiah, appeared at Bethlehem, is Emmanuel – "God with us" to those who place their faith in the Lord Jesus Christ.

Rom. 3:22 Even the righteousness of God which is by faith of Jesus Christ unto all and upon all them that believe: for there is no difference:

When a person places faith in Christ, He promises to be with us, even unto the end of the world!

Mt. 28:18 And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth.

19 Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:

20 Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen.
