<u>1 Jn. 5:4</u>

<u>1 Jn. 5:4</u> For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, *even* our faith.

Our theme for 2020:

FAITH'S VISION FOR VICTORY

The Bible gives us the following information about faith:

<u>Heb. 11:1</u> Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen. ... <u>6</u> But without faith *it is* impossible to please *him*: for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and *that* he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him. Ex. 2:1 And there went a man of the house of Levi, and took to wife a daughter of Levi.

<u>2</u> And the woman conceived, and bare a son: and when she saw him that he *was a* goodly *child*, she hid him three months.

<u>3</u> And when she could not longer hide him, she took for him an ark of bulrushes, and daubed it with slime and with pitch, and put the child therein; and she laid *it* in the flags by the river's brink.

<u>Heb. 11:23</u> By faith Moses, when he was born, was hid three months of his parents, because they saw *he was* a proper child; and they were not afraid of the king's commandment.

I. Faith's Sanctifying Virtue, 11:24-26

A. Over Social Position, 11:24

<u>Heb. 11:24</u> By faith Moses, when he was come to years, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter;

B. Over Sinful Pleasure, 11:25 <u>Heb. 11:25</u> Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season;

<u>2 Cor. 5:17</u> Therefore if any man *be* in Christ, *he* is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.

C. Over Staggering Prosperity, 11:26

Heb. 11:26 Esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt: for he had respect unto the recompence of the reward.

Moses showed his contempt for the world: its prestige (v. 24); its pleasures (v. 25); its prosperity (v. 27.)

<u>Heb. 11:24</u> By faith Moses, when he was come to years, refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter;

<u>25</u> Choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God, than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a season;

<u>26</u> Esteeming the reproach of Christ greater riches than the treasures in Egypt: for he had respect unto the recompence of the reward. <u>27</u> By faith he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king: for he endured, as seeing him who is invisible.

II. Faith's Solid Victory, 11:27

<u>Heb. 11:27</u> By faith he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king: for he endured, as seeing him who is invisible.

A. Over the Lure of the World, 11:27a "By faith he forsook Egypt..."

In the Scriptures, Egypt is a type of the world.

<u>1 Jn. 2:15</u> Love not the world, neither the things *that are* in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him. <u>16</u> For all that *is* in the world, the lust of the flesh, and the lust of the eyes, and the pride of life, is not of the Father, but is of the world. <u>17</u> And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever. Before engaging his greatest battle in life, Moses "forsook Egypt."

Victory is dependent upon wise decisions – difficult decisions. Moses "forsook Egypt." B. Over the Lust of the Flesh, 11:27b "...not fearing the wrath of the king..."

<u>Prov. 29:25</u> The fear of man bringeth a snare: but whoso putteth his trust in the LORD shall be safe.

When Moses was 40 years old, he feared the king – but not now.

One of life's victories is gaining spiritual maturity as you age – growing in grace!

Job 28:28 And unto man he said, Behold, the fear of the Lord, that is wisdom; and to depart from evil is understanding.

Eccl. 12:13 Let us hear the conclusion of the whole matter: Fear God, and keep his commandments: for this *is* the whole *duty* of man.

C. Over the Lies of the Devil, 11:27c "...for he endured, as seeing him who is invisible."

- The endurance was through the whole ordeal facing Pharaoh, the plagues against the gods of Egypt, and the following 40 more years in the wilderness.
- First, he faced a fear that caused to him flee at 40 years of age Pharaoh.
- After the first encounter, Moses and Aaron had to face Pharaoh, and the false promises, several times – 10 plagues.
- Moses endured the challenge of Pharaoh and the Egyptian gods.

<u>Ex. 12:12</u> For I will pass through the land of Egypt this night, and will smite all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and against all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgment: I am the LORD.

Moses looked beyond the obvious – "...seeing him who is invisible."

Original Word: ὑράω **Transliteration:** horaó **Usage:** I <mark>see</mark>, look upon, experience, perceive, discern, beware.

horáō – properly, *see*, often with *metaphorical* meaning: "to see with the mind" (i.e. spiritually see), i.e. perceive (with inward spiritual perception). <u>https://biblehub.com/greek/3708.htm</u> **Original Word:** ἀόρατος **Transliteration:** aoratos **Definition:** invisible **Usage:** unseen, invisible.

aóratos (from A "not" and horáō, "see") – properly, not seen; invisible to the physical ("naked") eye; (figuratively) spiritual reality as perceived through God's inbirthings of faith.

<u>Col. 1:15</u> Who is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of every creature:

<u>16</u> For by him were all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether *they be* thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by him, and for him:

<u>1 Tim. 1:17</u> Now unto the King eternal, immortal, invisible, the only wise God, *be* honour and glory for ever and ever. Amen.

Elisha prayed for his servant to see the unseen.

<u>2 Kings 6:14</u> Therefore sent he thither horses, and chariots, and a great host: and they came by night, and compassed the city about.

<u>15</u> And when the servant of the man of God was risen early, and gone forth, behold, an host compassed the city both with horses and chariots. And his servant said unto him, Alas, my master! how shall we do?

<u>16</u> And he answered, Fear not: for they that *be* with us *are* more than they that *be* with them.

<u>17</u> And Elisha prayed, and said, LORD, I pray thee, open his eyes, that he may see. And the LORD opened the eyes of the young man; and he saw: and, behold, the mountain *was* full of horses and chariots of fire round about Elisha.

<u>18</u> And when they came down to him, Elisha prayed unto the LORD, and said, Smite this people, I pray thee, with blindness. And he smote them with blindness according to the word of Elisha.

The eye of faith, looking to Christ, will help us see "...him who is invisible."

Where is your focus?

<u>Heb. 12:2</u> Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of *our* faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.

<u>Conclusion</u>

- A believer's REFUSAL and CHOICE indicates the genuineness of conversion.
- Moses' faith, fueled by love for Christ, was his "Vision for Victory" during his life.
- Moses' focus was upon Christ not self, circumstances, things on the Lord Jesus Christ.
- Ex. 20:20 And Moses said unto the people, Fear not: for God is come to prove you, and that his fear may be before your faces, that ye sin not.
- <u>Deut. 1:21</u> Behold, the LORD thy God hath set the land before thee: **go up** *and* **possess** *it*, as the LORD God of thy fathers hath said unto thee; **fear not, neither be discouraged**.

Deut. 31:6 Be strong and of a good courage, fear not, nor be afraid of them: for the LORD thy God, he *it is* that doth go with thee; he will not fail thee, nor forsake thee. ... <u>8</u> And the LORD, he *it is* that doth go before thee; he will be with thee, he will not fail thee, neither forsake thee: fear not, neither be dismayed.

<u>Mt. 28:18</u> And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. <u>19</u> Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:

<u>20</u> Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen.
