# ECCLESIASTES

## Eccl. 10:8-11

Eccl. 10:8 He that diggeth a pit shall fall into it; and whoso breaketh an hedge, a serpent shall bite him. 9 Whoso removeth stones shall be hurt therewith; and he that cleaveth wood shall be endangered thereby.

<u>10</u> If the iron be blunt, and he do not whet the edge, then must he put to more strength: but wisdom *is* profitable to direct.

<u>11</u> Surely the serpent will bite without enchantment; and a babbler is no better.

This evening, we continue on a wonderful, spiritual journey through the Book of Ecclesiastes, known also as "The Preacher."

(a) Preparing Evil, 10:8

i. Digging: A Great Fall Awaits, 10:8a "He that diggeth a pit shall fall into it..."

 Sinning against the Lord equates to digging a hole of destruction for oneself. • Such a hole becomes a trap to capture and bind against the freedom of the future.

<u>Prov. 26:27</u> Whoso diggeth a pit shall fall therein: and he that rolleth a stone, it will return upon him.

 Digging a hole to trap someone else may be a trap of God's vengeance.

<u>Rom. 12:19</u> Dearly beloved, avenge not yourselves, but *rather* give place unto wrath: for it is written, Vengeance *is* mine; I will repay, saith the Lord. Jer. 18:19 Give heed to me, O LORD, and hearken to the voice of them that contend with me.

<u>20</u> Shall evil be recompensed for good? for they have digged a pit for my soul. Remember that I stood before thee to speak good for them, and to turn away thy wrath from them. <u>21</u> Therefore deliver up their children to the famine, and pour out their blood by the force of the sword; and let their wives be bereaved of their children, and be widows; and let their men be put to death; let their young men be slain by the sword in battle.

<u>22</u> Let a cry be heard from their houses, when thou shalt bring a troop suddenly upon them: for they have digged a pit to take me, and hid snares for my feet.

23 Yet, LORD, thou knowest all their counsel against me to slay *me*: forgive not their iniquity, neither blot out their sin from thy sight, but let them be overthrown before thee; deal *thus* with them in the time of thine anger. <u>Psa. 57:6</u> They have prepared a net for my steps; my soul is bowed down: they have digged a pit before me, into the midst whereof they are fallen *themselves*. Selah.

ii. Destroying: A Great FoeAwaits, 10:8b "...and whosobreaketh an hedge, a serpentshall bite him."

The one destroying the boundaries will not go unpunished.

The hedge-breaker will face unexpected retribution – "…a serpent shall bite him."

Broken hedges lead to vulnerability.

<u>Psa. 80:12</u> Why hast thou *then* broken down her hedges, so that all they which pass by the way do pluck her?

<u>Psa. 89:40</u> Thou hast broken down all his hedges; thou hast brought his strong holds to ruin.

 Hedges of separation distinguishes a faithful follower of Christ from a compromising backslider and/or of the world.

#### **<u>2 Cor. 6:14</u>** Be ye not unequally yoked together with

**unbelievers**: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with darkness?

- <u>15</u> And what concord hath Christ with Belial? or what part hath he that believeth with an infidel?
- <u>16</u> And what agreement hath the temple of God with idols? for ye are the temple of the living God; as God hath said, I will dwell in them, and walk in *them*; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people.
- <u>17</u> Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the unclean *thing*; and I will receive you,
- <u>18</u> And will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty.

(b) Prosecuting Evil, 10:9

i. Deception Practiced: Hurt Lurks Unseen, 10:9a "Whoso removeth stones shall be hurt therewith..."

 Simple tasks may incur unexpected and unforeseen injuries = life is uncertain.

> ii. Destruction Practiced: Harm Lurks Unseen, 10:9b "...and he that cleaveth wood shall be endangered thereby."

 The load you carry may be the one that breaks your back = beware of doing too much.

(2) Over the Laboring Man, 10:10

(a) Why He Works So Hard, 10:10a "If the iron be blunt, and he do not whet the edge, then must he put to more strength..."

• You can make it easier for yourself or more difficult.

• Take time to sharpen the dull edges in your life.

(b) Why He Wants to Heed, 10:10b"...but wisdom *is* profitable to direct."

- Work smarter, not harder.
- The quality of work employed will become responsible for the profit achieved.

(3) Over the Loquacious Man, 10:11

Eccl. 10:11 Surely the serpent will bite without enchantment; and a babbler is no better.

- The enchantment will prevent the attack of the serpent, and without it, the strike will occur.
- A babbler is like the unenchanted serpent, a dangerous annoyance.

Acts 17:18 Then certain philosophers of the Epicureans, and of the Stoicks, encountered him. And some said, What will this babbler say? other some, He seemeth to be a setter forth of strange gods: because he preached unto them Jesus, and the resurrection. Original Word: σπερμολόγος Transliteration: spermologos Definition: a seed picker, one who picks up scraps of knowledge Usage: a babbler, gossiper, one who picks up seeds and trifles as does a bird. https://biblehub.com/greek/4691.htm
