Love Came Down

1. The Perspective

a. Considering the Incarnation – "And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth."

b. Cultivating the Inspiration

As a believer has the proper perspective of Christmas, the powerful influence will be presenting the wonderful explanation of the Incarnation.

Rom. 5:8 But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

<u>1 Jn. 4:9</u> In this was manifested the love of God toward us, because that God sent his only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through him.

<u>10</u> Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son *to be* the propitiation for our sins.

2. The "Prayer-peration"

<u>1 Thess. 5:17</u> Pray without ceasing.

<u>Phil. 4:6</u> Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.
<u>7</u> And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

3. The Preparing

<u>1 Cor. 14:40</u> Let all things be done decently and in order.

a. Christmas savings account

b. Christmas gift list

c. Christmas food list (Mom or Grandma's special recipes)

4. The Planning

Luke 14:28 For which of you, intending to build a tower, sitteth not down first, and **counteth the cost**, whether he have *sufficient* to finish *it*?

a. Christmas decorations

b. Christmas music

c. Christmas cards

d. Display a nativity scene

5. The Presenting

 a. An perpetual explanation to children about the true meaning of Christmas – via the nativity scene, the music, the cards, etc.

b. The gifts as tokens of love

6. The Praising

a. The Person – the Lord Jesus Christ (not Santa)

<u>2 Cor. 9:15</u> Thanks *be* unto God for his unspeakable gift.

<u>1 Chron. 16:8</u> Give thanks unto the LORD, call upon his name, make known his deeds among the people.

Psa. 18:49 Therefore will I give thanks unto thee, O LORD, among the heathen, and sing praises unto thy name.

Psa. 30:4 Sing unto the LORD, O ye saints of his, and give thanks at the remembrance of his holiness.

<u>Col. 3:17</u> And whatsoever ye do in word or deed, *do* all in the name of the Lord Jesus, **giving thanks to God and the Father by him**.

b. The Purpose = the Incarnation (Phil. 2:5-11)
