"Visions of Christmas" Jn. 1:14 *"The Vision of God's Glory from a Personal Perspective."* <u>Jn. 1:14</u> And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.

<u>Review</u>

We are down to the last few days of a very challenging year. How do we finish strong? Hopefully, "Visions of Christmas" will assist us in finishing the year with encouragement.

Our theme this year is...VISION20/20HIS VISION.OUR FOCUS.

We began the Christmas season by looking at **the earthly perspective** of "*The Vision of Glory.*" Last week, we considered **the heavenly perspective**, "*The Vision of God's Glory.*" Today we will focus upon **the personal perspective.** As we focus upon these perspectives, we should have a wonderful vision of Christmas.

This morning we begin looking at...

"The Vision of God's Glory from a Personal Perspective."

I. <u>RECOGNIZING OUR PERSONAL PERSPECTIVE</u>

A. The Brutal Honesty Needed

When a person clearly views God in His glory, the immediate effect is most humbling.

<u>Isa. 6:1</u> In the year that king Uzziah died I saw also the Lord sitting upon a throne, high and lifted up, and his train filled the temple.
<u>5</u> Then said I, Woe is me! for I am undone; because I am a man of unclean lips, and I dwell in the midst of a people of unclean lips: for mine eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts.

<u>Isa. 64:6</u> But we are all as an unclean *thing*, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags; and we all do fade as a leaf; and our iniquities, like the wind, have taken us away.

The Apostle Paul stated his evaluation of himself:

<u>1 Tim. 1:15</u> This *is* a faithful saying, and worthy of all acceptation, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners; of whom I am chief.

- A proud, arrogant person is most ignorant of who God is.
- An honest person is most accurate in evaluating self:

Jas. 4:6 But he giveth more grace. Wherefore he saith, God resisteth the proud, but giveth grace unto the humble. ... <u>10 Humble yourselves in the sight of the Lord</u>, and he shall lift you up.

God honors the humble person:

<u>Mt. 18:4</u> Whosoever therefore shall humble himself as this little child, the same is greatest in the kingdom of heaven.

Mt. 23:12 And whosoever shall exalt himself shall be abased; and he that shall humble himself shall be exalted.

Brutal honesty leads to blessed honors:

<u>1 Pet. 5:5</u> Likewise, ye younger, submit yourselves unto the elder. Yea, all *of you* be subject one to another, and **be clothed with humility: for God resisteth the proud, and giveth grace to the humble.** <u>6</u> Humble yourselves therefore under the mighty hand of God, that he may exalt you in due time:

B. The Blessed Honor Noticed

<u>1 Jn. 3:1</u> Behold, what manner of love the Father hath bestowed upon us, that we should be called the sons of God: therefore the world knoweth us not, because it knew him not.
<u>2</u> Beloved, now are we the sons of God, and it doth not yet appear what we shall be: but we know that, when he shall appear, we shall be like him; for we shall see him as he is. <u>1 Jn. 5:13</u> These things have I written unto you that believe on the name of the Son of God; that ye may **know that ye have eternal life**, and that ye may believe on the name of the Son of God.

"The Vision of God's Glory from a Personal Perspective" produces motivation to reconstructing life.

II. RECONSTRUCTING OUR PERSONAL PERSPECTIVE

A. Start at the Foundation

 A believer is to "take heed how" a personal lifestory is developed.

<u>1 Cor. 3:10</u> According to the grace of God which is given unto me, as a wise masterbuilder, I have laid the foundation, and another buildeth thereon. But let every man take heed how he buildeth thereupon. <u>11</u> For other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ.

The quality of a person's life is dependent upon the foundation:

Luke 6:48 He is like a man which built an house, and digged deep, and laid the foundation on a rock: and when the flood arose, the stream beat vehemently upon that house, and could not shake it: for it was founded upon a rock. 49 But he that heareth, and doeth not, is like a man that without a foundation built an house upon the earth; against which the stream did beat vehemently, and immediately it fell; and the ruin of that house was great.

Regardless of any person's spirituality, it is possible to grow cold.

<u>Rev. 2:4</u> Nevertheless I have *somewhat* against thee, because **thou hast left thy first love**. <u>5</u> Remember therefore from whence thou art fallen, and repent, and do the first works; or else I will come unto thee quickly, and will remove thy candlestick out of his place, except thou repent.

 A proper perspective of having a vision of God's glory should be manifested by a perpetual desire for a believer. <u>2 Pet. 3:18</u> But grow in grace, and *in* the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. To him be glory both now and for ever. Amen.

 A saved person is one who has seen the glory of the Lord, repented as a sorrowful sinner, lives a "changed" life desiring to honor the Lord by loving Him, serving Him, exalting Him, worshipping Him, proclaiming Him and fellowshipping WITH Him.

B. Strengthen the Faith

• Building a relationship with God is a spiritual phenomenon based upon strengthening faith.

<u>Psa. 27:14</u> Wait on the LORD: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart: wait, I say, on the LORD.

Psa. 31:24 Be of good courage, and he shall strengthen your heart, all ye that hope in the LORD.

Our spiritual strength comes from the Lord.

<u>Isa. 41:10</u> Fear thou not; for I *am* with thee: be not dismayed; for I *am* thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness.

We are strengthened by His Spirit:

<u>Eph. 3:16</u> That he would grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man;

Zech. 4:6 Then he answered and spake unto me, saying, This *is* the word of the LORD unto Zerubbabel, saying, Not by might, nor by power, but **by my spirit**, **saith the LORD of hosts**.

<u>Col. 1:11</u> Strengthened with all might, according to his glorious power, unto all patience and longsuffering with joyfulness;

 The Apostle Paul gave testimony of God's presence and His strengthening power.

2 Tim. 4:16 At my first answer no man stood with me, but all *men* forsook me: *I pray God* that it may not be laid to their charge.
17 Notwithstanding the Lord stood with me, and strengthened me; that by me the preaching might be fully known, and *that* all the Gentiles might hear: and I was delivered out of the mouth of the lion.

The Apostle Paul's life is a wonderful example of an individual who saw the glory of God in the Lord Jesus Christ, repented, and then lived his life to honor the Savior.

<u>Jn. 1:14</u> And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.

<u>Summary</u>

- Believers are susceptible to backsliding, losing their vision of God's glory.
- The lost has no clue of the greatness of God's glory.
- A proper, spiritual perspective of God's glory begins at the "foundation" – Christ!
- The foundation is the place to build upon according to God's perfect will for our lives – as we grow in grace and live our lives for the glory of God.
- Believers must develop a mindset to renew, rebuild, and rekindle their relationship with Christ, perpetually – every single day!
- Such dedication and discipline will create...
