Introduction

Tonight, we continue studying this great sermon, "The Sermon on the Mount," focusing upon verse 9.

Markette

Note the progression of the Beatitudes that we have studied thus far:

Mt. 5:3 Blessed *are* the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

- 4 Blessed are they that mourn: for they shall be comforted.
- 5 Blessed are the meek: for they shall inherit the earth.
- 6 Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness: for they shall be filled.
- 7 Blessed are the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy.
- 8 Blessed are the pure in heart: for they shall see God.
- 9 Blessed *are* the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God.

• With Mt. 5:6 as a pivotal point, consider how the first three *Beatitudes* compare with the last three:

Mt. 5:3 Blessed *are* the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. / 7 Blessed *are* the merciful: for they shall obtain mercy.

4 Blessed *are* they that mourn: for they shall be comforted. / 8 Blessed *are* the pure in heart: for they shall see God.

<u>5</u> Blessed *are* the meek: for they shall inherit the earth. / <u>9</u> Blessed *are* the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God.

 These six Beatitudes have too much in common to be coincidences.

the poor in spirit = the merciful:

they that mourn = the pure in heart

the meek = the peacemakers:

Tonight, we will place our focus upon verse 9:

c. When Facing Conflict, 5:9

Mt. 5: 9 Blessed *are* the peacemakers: for they shall be called the children of God.

• The need of *peacemakers* verifies that the world is indeed at variance with God and man.

Jer. 17:9 The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked: who can know it?

1 Jn. 5:19 And we know that we are of God, and the whole world lieth in wickedness.

Prov. 12:20 Deceit *is* in the heart of them that imagine evil: but to the counsellors of peace *is* joy.

The world needs the peace that only Christ can give:

Jn. 14:27 Peace Heave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

 The concern for "peace" is in the beginning of Paul's epistles:

Rom. 1:7 To all that be in Rome, beloved of God, called *to be* saints: Grace to you and peace from God our Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ.

1 Cor. 1:3 Grace be unto you, and peace, from God our Father, and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

2 Cor. 1:2 Grace be to you and peace from God our Father, and from the Lord Jesus Christ.


Gal. 1:3 Grace be to you and peace from God the Father, and from our Lord Jesus Christ,

Eph. 1:2 Grace be to you, and peace, from God our Father, and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

Phil. 1:2 Grace be unto you, and peace, from God our Father, and from the Lord Jesus Christ.

Col. 1:2 To the saints and faithful brethren in Christ which are at Colosse: Grace *be* unto you, and peace, from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

- 1 Thess. 1:1 Paul, and Silvanus, and Timotheus, unto the church of the Thessalonians which is in God the Father and in the Lord Jesus Christ: Grace be unto you, and peace, from God our Father, and the Lord Jesus Christ.
- 2Thess. 1:2 Grace unto you, and peace, from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.
- 1 Tim. 1:2 Unto Timothy, my own son in the faith: Grace, mercy, and peace, from God our Father and Jesus Christ our Lord.
- 2 Tim. 1:2 To Timothy, my dearly beloved son: Grace, mercy, and peace, from God the Father and Christ Jesus our Lord.



- The peacemaker has wisdom "from above:"
- Jas. 3:13 Who is a wise man and endued with knowledge among you? let him shew out of a good conversation his works with meekness of wisdom.
- 14 But if ye have bitter envying and strife in your hearts, glory not, and lie not against the truth.
- 15 This wisdom descendeth not from above, but *is* earthly, sensual, devilish.
- 16 For where envying and strife is, there is confusion and every evil work.
- 17 But the wisdom that is from above is first pure, then peaceable, gentle, and easy to be intreated, full of mercy and good fruits, without partiality, and without hypocrisy.
- 18 And the fruit of righteousness is sown in peace of them that make peace.

• The word *peacemaker* is defined by the 1828 Webster's Dictionary as...

PE'ACEMAKER, noun

One who makes peace by reconciling parties that are at variance. http://webstersdictionary1828.com/Dictionary/peacemaker

The Greek word translated *peacemaker* is from two Greek words: εἰρήνη and ποιέω

Original Word: εἰρηνοποιός **Transliteration:** eirénopoios


Definition: peacemaking, a peacemaker

eirēnopoiós (from eirēnopoiéō, "make peace") — properly, a peacemaker, bravely declares God's terms which makes someone whole (used only in Mt 5:9). https://biblehub.com/greek/1518.htm

- A peacemaker is NOT a pacifist nor an appeaser.
- Neville Chamberlain wanted peace at any price when meeting with Hitler, even declaring "Peace in our time," after returning from the Munich Conference in 1938.

"We regard the agreement signed last night and the Anglo-German Naval Agreement as symbolic of the desire of our two peoples never to go to war with one another again."

A peacemaker must know the true source of peace,

Isa. 9:6 For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace.

Eph. 2:14 For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and hath broken down the middle wall of partition between us;

Peace must first be established between God and man.

Isa. 57:21 There is no peace, saith my God, to the wicked.

Rom 5:1 Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:

6 For when we were yet without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly.

7 For scarcely for a righteous man will one die: yet peradventure for a good man some would even dare to die.

8 But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us. 9 Much more then, being now justified by his blood, we shall be saved from wrath through him. 10 For if, when we were enemies, we were reconciled to God by the death of his Son, much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by his life. 11 And not only so, but we also joy in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom we have now received the atonement. 2 Cor. 5:18 And all things are of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation; Eph. 2:16 And that he might reconcile both unto God in one body by the cross, having slain the enmity thereby:

- 2 Cor. 5:17 Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.
- 18 And all things are of God, who hath reconciled us to himself by Jesus Christ, and hath given to us the ministry of reconciliation;
- 19 To wit, that God was in Christ, reconciling the world unto himself, not imputing their trespasses unto them; and hath committed unto us the word of reconciliation.
- 20 Now then we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God did beseech *you* by us: we pray *you* in Christ's stead, be ye reconciled to God.
- 21 For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him.

- Peace must be maintained between men and men.
- Moses' father-in-law, Jethro, encouraged Moses to delegate work to others, for the purpose of not getting worn out, plus helping the congregation of Israel to have peace.

Ex. 18:23 If thou shalt do this thing, and God command thee so, then thou shalt be able to endure, and all this people shall also go to their place in peace.

Peacemakers assist in helping establish peace between others.

Rom. 12:18 If it be possible, as much as lieth in you, live peaceably with all men.

2 Cor. 13:11 Finally, brethren, farewell. Be perfect, be of good comfort, be of one mind, live in peace; and the God of love and peace shall be with you.

Rom. 14:19 Let us therefore follow after the things which make for peace, and things wherewith one may edify another.

Eph. 4:3 Endeavouring to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace.

• In order "to keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace" within a church, directions were given by the Lord Jesus on how to do it:

Mt. 18:15 Moreover if thy brother shall trespass against thee, go and tell him his fault between thee and him alone: if he shall hear thee, thou hast gained thy brother.

16 But if he will not hear thee, then take with thee one or two more, that in the mouth of two or three witnesses every word may be established.

17 And if he shall neglect to hear them, tell it unto the church: but if he neglect to hear the church, let him be unto thee as an heathen man and a publican.

Peace must be established within self.

Prov. 13:15 Good understanding giveth favour: but the way of transgressors is hard.

Job 22:21 Acquaint now thyself with him, and be at peace: thereby good shall come unto thee.

Psa. 119:165 Great peace have they which love thy law: and nothing shall offend them.

<u>Isa. 26:3</u> Thou wilt keep *him* in perfect peace, whose mind *is* stayed *on thee*: because he trusteth in thee.

Psa. 34:14 Depart from evil, and do good; seek peace, and pursue it.

The peacemakers, by being such as resemble the Savior, conducting themselves "other worldly" = "...for they shall be called the children of God." 1 Jn. 2:6 He that saith he abideth in him ought himself also so to walk, even as he walked.

Conclusion

Jn. 14:27 Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

Jn. 16:33 These things I have spoken unto you, that in me might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world.

Col. 3:15 And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to the which also ye are called in one body; and be ye thankful.

Heb. 12:14 Follow peace with all *men*, and holiness, without which no man shall see the Lord:
