3.A Hallowed Love, 3:4-5

a.Heart Delight, 3:4

<u>3:4</u> *It was* but a little that I passed from them, but I **found him whom my soul loveth**: I held him, and would not let him go, until I had brought him into my mother's house, and into the chamber of her that conceived me.

(1) She Saw Him – "...but I found him whom my soul loveth..."

(2) She Seized Him – "...I held him, and would not let him go..."

Luke 11:5 And he said unto them, Which of you shall have a friend, and shall go unto him at midnight, and say unto him, Friend, lend me three loaves; <u>6</u> For a friend of mine in his journey is come to me, and I have nothing to set before him? <u>7</u> And he from within shall answer and say, Trouble me not: the door is now shut, and my children are with me in bed; I cannot rise and give thee.

8 I say unto you, Though he will not rise and give him, because he is his friend, yet because of his importunity he will rise and give him as many as he needeth. 9 And I say unto you, Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you. 10 For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened.

Luke 18:1 And he spake a parable unto them to this end, that men ought always to pray, and not to faint; 2 Saying, There was in a city a judge, which feared not God, neither regarded man: <u>3</u> And there was a widow in that city; and she came unto him, saying, Avenge me of mine adversary. 4 And he would not for a while: but afterward he said within himself, Though I fear not God, nor regard man; 5 Yet because this widow troubleth me, I will avenge her, lest by her continual coming she weary me. 6 And the Lord said, Hear what the unjust judge saith. 7 And shall not God avenge his own elect, which cry day and night unto him, though he bear long with them? 8 I tell you that he will avenge them speedily. Nevertheless when the Son of man cometh, shall he find faith on the earth?

 She "…held him, and would not let him go…" is a beautiful picture of fellowship, abiding with the Beloved.

Jn. 15:4 Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine; no more can ye, except ye abide in me. 5 I am the vine, ye are the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without me ye can do nothing. 6 If a man abide not in me, he is cast forth as a branch, and is withered; and men gather them, and cast *them* into the fire, and they are burned.

<u>7</u> If ye abide in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall ask what ye will, and it shall be done unto you. <u>8</u> Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit; so shall ye be my disciples.

Believers are to abide in Christ until the Rapture!

<u>1 Jn. 2:28</u> And now, little children, abide in him; that, when he shall appear, we may have confidence, and not be ashamed before him at his coming.

(3)She Showed Him – "…until I had brought him into my mother's house, and into the chamber of her that conceived me."

There is a connection between the Bride and her mother:

Gal. 4:26 But Jerusalem which is above is free, which is the mother of us all.

Heb. 12:22 But ye are come unto mount Sion, and unto the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to an innumerable company of angels, 23 To the general assembly and church of the firstborn, which are written in heaven, and to God the Judge of all, and to the spirits of just men made perfect,

<u>Rev. 21:2</u> And I John saw the holy city, **new Jerusalem**, coming down from God out of heaven, **prepared as a bride adorned for her husband**.

b. Heart Danger, 3:5

<u>3:5</u> I charge you, O ye daughters of Jerusalem, by the roes, and by the hinds of the field, that ye stir not up, nor awake *my* love, till he please.

(1) Its Source – "…I charge you, O ye daughters of Jerusalem…"

 The term – "…daughters of Jerusalem" – is used seven times in the Song of Solomon.

Three times a "charge" is given to them:

Song 3:5 I charge you, O ye daughters of Jerusalem, by the roes, and by the hinds of the field, that ye stir not up, nor awake *my* love, till he please.

<u>Song 5:8</u> I charge you, O daughters of Jerusalem, if ye find my beloved, that ye tell him, that I *am* sick of love.

<u>Song 8:4</u> I charge you, O daughters of Jerusalem, that ye stir not up, nor awake *my* love, until he please.

(2)Its Substance – "...by the roes, and by the hinds of the field, that ye stir not up, nor awake *my* love, till he please."

- The Shulamite is concerned that her beloved be left alone.
- She does not want the other women to "...stir...up..." her beloved.
- The Shulamite wants the beloved's attention for herself – "…nor awake my love, till he please."

<u>Conclusion</u>

1 Jn. 2:6 He that saith he abideth in him ought himself also so to walk, even as he walked. ... 10 He that loveth his brother abideth in the light, and there is none occasion of stumbling in him. ... 14 I have written unto you, fathers, because ye have known him that is from the beginning. I have written unto you, young men, because ye are strong, and the word of God abideth in you, and ye have overcome the wicked one.... 17 And the world passeth away, and the lust thereof: but he that doeth the will of God abideth for ever. ...

<u>1 Jn. 3:24</u> And he that keepeth his commandments dwelleth in him, and he in him. And hereby we know that he abideth in us, by the Spirit which he hath given us.
