# RENEW. REBUILD. REKINDLE. <u>1 Pet. 1:3-9</u> "Rekindling a Lively Hope That Expresses Love For The Savior"

1 Pet 1:3 Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, which according to his abundant mercy hath begotten us again unto a lively hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, 4 To an inheritance incorruptible, and undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for you, 5 Who are kept by the power of God through faith unto salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. 6 Wherein ye greatly rejoice, though now for a season, if need be, ye are in heaviness through manifold temptations:

7 That the trial of your faith, being much more precious than of gold that perisheth, though it be tried with fire, might be found unto praise and honour and glory at the appearing of Jesus Christ: 8 Whom having not seen, ye love; in whom, though now ye see him not, yet believing, ye rejoice with joy unspeakable and full of glory: 9 Receiving the end of your faith, even the salvation of *your* souls.

## <u>Review</u> Our theme this year is... <u>RENEW. REBUILD. REKINDLE.</u>

During the last few weeks we have been considering...

"Rekindling a Lively Hope"

We have been observing what the Bible says in *First Peter.* We began with "WE HAVE AN EXPECTANT HOPE" because "WE HAVE AN EXPERIENTIAL FAITH."

Today is *Resurrection Day, 2021!* This morning we will observe that due to the resurrection, WE HAVE AN EXPRESSIVE LOVE.

### III. WE HAVE AN EXPRESSIVE LOVE, 1:8-9

A.What Our Love Dares, 1:8a "Whom having not seen, ye love..."

Though believers today have not "seen" the Lord Jesus Christ with the natural eye, they have seen Him through the vision of faith. <u>Heb 11:27</u> By faith he forsook Egypt, not fearing the wrath of the king: for he endured, as seeing him who is invisible.

<u>Heb. 12:2</u> Looking unto leave the author and finisher of *our* faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God.

Our love dares to love Him because He first loved us, even when were yet sinners.

<u>Rom. 5:8</u> But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

### <u>1 Jn. 4:19</u> We love him, because he first loved us.

- Faith's fuel is love for the Savior which produces an undaunted belief!
- <u>Gal. 5:6</u> "...faith which worketh by love."
  - B. What Our Love Does, 1:8b-9
    - 1. Its Undaunted Belief, 1:8b "...in whom, though now ye see *him* not, yet believing..."

 The focus for the believer always should be upon the Lord Jesus Christ!

 "...though now ye see him not..." speaks of the immediate, yet, like Job, believers have confidence of seeing the Savior in eternity!

Job 19:26 And though after my skin worms destroy this body, yet in my lesh shall see God:

 The fact of the resurrection secures our hope in Christ for eternity!

<u>Rom. 6:5</u> For if we have been planted together in the likeness of his death, we shall be also *in the likeness* of *his* resurrection:

 The Apostle Paul expressed his hope to the church in Philippi:

<u>Phil. 1:21</u> For to me to he is christ, and to die *is* gain.
...
<u>23</u> For I am in a strait betwixt two, having a desire to depart, and to be with Christ; which is far better:

2. Its Undying Bliss, 1:8c-d-9

a. Gladness Beyond All Words, 1:8c "...ye rejoice with joy unspeakable..."

Original Word: ἀγαλλιάω Transliteration: agalliaó Definition: to exult, rejoice greatly Usage: I exult, am full of joy.

agalliáō (from agan, "much, very" and hállomai, "jump, leap") – property, getting so glad one jumps in celebration; to exult (boast) because so experientially joyful. https://biblehub.com/greek/21.htm 2 Cor. 12:2 I knew a man in Christ above fourteen years ago, (whether in the body, I cannot tell; or whether out of the body, I cannot tell: God knoweth;) such an one caught up to the third heaven. <u>3</u> And I knew such a man, (whether in the body, or out of the body, I cannot tell: God knoweth;) 4 How that he was caught up into paradise, and heard unspeakable words, which it is not lawful for a man to utter.

> b. Glory Beyond All Words, 1:8d "...and full of glory:"

The glory of God was viewed by Moses and had an astounding effect:

<u>Ex. 34:35</u> And the children of Israel saw the face of Moses, that the skin of the second sec

<u>2 Cor. 3:7</u> But if the ministration of death, written and engraven in stones, was glorious, so that the children of Israel could not stedfastly behold the face of Moses for the glory of his countenance; which glory was to be done away: <u>8</u> How shall not the ministration of the spirit be rather glorious?

## <u>9</u> For if the ministration of condemnation *be* glory, much more doth the ministration of righteousness exceed in glory.

- <u>10</u> For even that which was made glorious had no glory in this respect, by reason of the glory that excelleth.
- <u>11</u> For if that which is done away *was* glorious, much more that which remaineth is glorious.
- <u>12</u> Seeing then that we have such hope, we use great plainness of speech:

<u>13</u> And not as Moses, *which* put a vail over his face, that the children of Israel could not stedfastly look to the end of that which is abolished: <u>14</u> But their minds were blinded: for until this day remaineth the same vail untaken away in the reading of the old testament; which can be done away in Christ.
<u>15</u> But even unto this day, when Moses is read, the vail is upon their heart.
<u>16</u> Nevertheless when it shall turn to the Lord, the vail

shall be taken away.

<u>17 Now the Lord is that Spirit: and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty.</u>

<u>18</u> But we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord.

#### c. Gains Beyond All Words, 1:9

<u>1 Pet. 1:9</u> Receiving the end of your faith, even the salvation of your souls.

 The end of our faith is eternity in heaven with Christ = "the salvation of OUR souls!"

#### **Conclusion**

<u>1 Cor. 15:19 If in this life only we have hope in Christ,</u> we are of all men most miserable. 20 But now is Christ risen from the dead, and become the firstfruits of them that slept. 42 So also is the resurrection of the dead. It is sown in corruption; it is raised in incorruption: 43 It is sown in dishonour; it is raised in glory: it is sown in weakness; it is raised in power: 44 It is sown a natural body; it is raised a spiritual body. There is a natural body, and there is a spiritual body. 51 Behold, I shew you a mystery; We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed,

52 In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed. 53 For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal *must* put on immortality. 54 So when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption, and this mortal shall have put on immortality, then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written, Death is swallowed up in victory. 55 O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory? 56 The sting of death *is* sin; and the strength of sin *is* the law.

57 But thanks *be* to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. 58 Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye stedfast, unmoveable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord.
