**Introduction** 


As always, we will emphasize that honoring the Lord Jesus Christ should be "the reason for the season."

Our text this morning is a wonderful guideline for us in connecting love with giving:

<u>2 Cor. 9:7</u> Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give; not grudgingly, or of necessity: for God loveth a cheerful giver.

 THE METHOD FOR CHRISTMAS GIVING "Every man according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give ..."

A. The All-inclusive Participation – "Every man..."

Pray about a list to whom you should give – mate, parents, children, extended family, friends, teachers, colleagues, even strangers. B. The Action of Purpose – "…according as he purposeth in his heart, so let him give …"

The source of our concern is the heart – according to the will of God, being a reflection of Him and His love.

II. <u>THE MOTIVE FOR CHRISTMAS GIVING</u> "...as he purposeth in his heart..."

The motive for giving should originate with purpose from the heart.

to choose for oneself before another thing (prefer), i.e. (by implication) to propose (intend):—purpose. https://www.blueletterbible.org/lexicon/g4255/kjv/tr/0-1/

A. The Conviction – "...as he purposeth..."

◆ Particularly, if you love someone, determine to express it → purpose in your heart.

## B. The Cause – "...in his heart..."

The motive should be to be a blessing to another.

<u>1 Pet. 1:22</u> Seeing ye have purified your souls in obeying the truth through the Spirit unto unfeigned love of the brethren, see that ye love one another with a pure heart fervently:

<u>1 Pet. 3:8</u> Finally, *be ye* all of one mind, having compassion one of another, **love as brethren**, *be* pitiful, *be* courteous:

III. <u>THE MINDSET FOR CHRISTMAS GIVING</u> "...not grudgingly, or of necessity..."

A. The Attitude – "...not grudgingly..."

Resentment should not be a factor in the giving process.

B. The Aspiration – "...or of necessity..."

The mindset should be a gift from the heart, not motivated for personal gain.

<u>IV. THE MEMORY FOR CHRISTMAS GIVING – "…for</u> God loveth a cheerful giver."

A. Remembering God's Gift

<u>2 Cor. 9:15</u> Thanks *be* unto God for his unspeakable gift.

<u>Rom. 6:23</u> For the wages of sin *is* death; but the gift of God *is* eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.

B. Reflecting God's Grace

Original Word: ἰλαρός Transliteration: hilaros Definition: cheerful Usage: joyous, cheerful, not grudging.

hilarós – properly, propitious; disposed because satisfied describing someone who is cheerfully ready to act because already approving ("already persuaded"). hilarós ("won over, already inclined") is only used in 2 Cor 9:7 where it describes spontaneously *non-reluctant* giving. https://biblehub.com/greek/2431.htm

Jas. 1:17 Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, and cometh down from the Father of lights, with whom is no variableness, neither shadow of turning.

<u>1 Pet. 4:10</u> As every man hath received the gift, even so minister the same one to another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.
