

LOVE SO AMAZING

BY DEGREE Luke 7:36-47

2022 THEME

- Luke 7:36 And one of the Pharisees desired him that he would eat with him. And he went into the Pharisee's house, and sat down to meat.
- 37 And, behold, a woman in the city, which was a sinner, when she knew that *Jesus* sat at meat in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster box of ointment,
- 38 And stood at his feet behind him weeping, and began to wash his feet with tears, and did wipe them with the hairs of her head, and kissed his feet, and anointed them with the ointment.

- 39 Now when the Pharisee which had bidden him saw it, he spake within himself, saying, This man, if he were a prophet, would have known who and what manner of woman this is that toucheth him: for she is a sinner.
- <u>40</u> And Jesus answering said unto him, Simon, I have somewhat to say unto thee. And he saith, Master, say on.
- 41 There was a certain creditor which had two debtors: the one owed five hundred pence, and the other fifty.
- 42 And when they had nothing to pay, he frankly forgave them both. Tell me therefore, which of them will love him most?

- 43 Simon answered and said, I suppose that *he*, to whom he forgave most. And he said unto him, Thou hast rightly judged.
- 44 And he turned to the woman, and said unto Simon, Seest thou this woman? I entered into thine house, thou gavest me no water for my feet: but she hath washed my feet with tears, and wiped *them* with the hairs of her head.
- 45 Thou gavest me no kiss: but this woman since the time I came in hath not ceased to kiss my feet.
- 46 My head with oil thou didst not anoint: but this woman hath anointed my feet with ointment.
- <u>47</u> Wherefore I say unto thee, Her sins, which are many, are forgiven; for she loved much: but to whom little is forgiven, the same loveth little.

Our theme for 2022 is...

LOVE SO AMAZING

We have considered "LOVE SO AMAZING" that in spite of our wretched sinfulness, the Lord loved us and gave Himself for us. We saw an illustration given by the Lord Jesus to show us LOVE SO AMAZING in forgiving the "prodigal son" and his older brother of their sinfulness and selfishness. Last week, we considered LOVE SO AMAZING, UNTIL THE RAPTURE. This morning we will observe an illustration given by the Lord Jesus regarding His evaluation of one's love. Not everyone loves the Lord the same. Today we consider...

LOVE SO AMAZING BY DEGREE

The occasion is a meal in a Pharisee's house who had invited Jesus to join him.

I. THE SITUATION EMERGES

A. The Uninvited Company, Luke 7:37-38

- Luke 7:37 And, behold, a woman in the city, which was a sinner, when she knew that *Jesus* sat at meat in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster box of ointment,
- 38 And stood at his feet behind him weeping, and began to wash his feet with tears, and did wipe them with the hairs of her head, and kissed his feet, and anointed them with the ointment.

- A woman purposely sought our Jesus and was prepared to honor Him.
- She found Jesus reclining, probably upon a triclinium:

Original Word: ἀνάκειμαι

Transliteration: anakeimai

Definition: to be laid up, to recline; **Usage:** I recline,

especially at a dinner-table.

She honored Jesus by washing His feet with tears, wiping them with her hair, kissing His feet, and anointing them with the ointment.

B. The Unexpected Conclusion, <u>Luke 8:39</u>

<u>Luke 8:39</u> Now when the Pharisee which had bidden him saw *it*, he spake within himself, saying, **This man**, **if he were a prophet**, would have known who and what manner of woman *this is* that toucheth him: for **she is a sinner**.

Because Jesus was invited into the Pharisee's house did not mean that the Pharisee was spiritual.

- ❖ The judging Pharisee jumped to conclusion about the spiritual status of Jesus – "...This man, if he were a prophet, would have known who and what manner of woman this is that toucheth him: for she is a sinner."
- The Pharisee, within his heart, judged Jesus as not being spiritually perceptive.

II. THE SINNER EXPOSED

<u>Luke 7:37</u> And, behold, a woman in the city, which was a sinner, when she knew that *Jesus* sat at meat in the Pharisee's house, brought an alabaster box of ointment,

39 Now when the Pharisee which had bidden him saw it, he spake within himself, saying, This man, if he were a prophet, would have known who and what manner of woman this is that toucheth him: for she is a sinner.

A. The Honesty Demonstrated – v. 47 "...Her sins, which are many..."

The Lord Jesus knows the sinful condition of all mankind, and loves us anyway.

Rom. 5:8 But God commendeth his love toward us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.

Isa. 64:6 But we are all as an unclean thing, and all our righteousnesses are as filthy rags; and we all do fade as a leaf; and our iniquities, like the wind, have taken us away.

Isa. 38:17 Behold, for peace I had great bitterness: but thou hast in love to my soul delivered it from the pit of corruption: for thou hast cast all my sins behind thy back.

B. The Humility Displayed

She humbly honored Jesus by washing His feet with tears, wiping them with her hair, kissing His feet, and anointing them with the ointment.

III. THE SAVIOR EXPLAINS

A. The Incidental Lesson

- <u>Luke 7:40</u> And Jesus answering said unto him, Simon, I have somewhat to say unto thee. And he saith, Master, say on.
- 41 There was a certain creditor which had two debtors: the one owed five hundred pence, and the other fifty.
- 42 And when they had nothing to pay, he frankly forgave them both. Tell me therefore, which of them will love him most?
- 43 Simon answered and said, I suppose that *he*, to whom he forgave most. And he said unto him, Thou hast rightly judged.

- Jesus used an analogy to teach Simon, the Pharisee, a spiritual lesson.
- The objective: determining the magnitude or degree of love.
- Two debtors, who had nothing to pay, were both forgiven.
- Of the two, who would love him most?
- The Pharisee answered correctly, "rightly judged." (v. 43) – "...to whom he forgave most..."

B. The Indisputable Love

- Luke 7:44 And he turned to the woman, and said unto Simon, Seest thou this woman? I entered into thine house, thou gavest me no water for my feet: but she hath washed my feet with tears, and wiped them with the hairs of her head.
- 45 Thou gavest me no kiss: but this woman since the time I came in hath not ceased to kiss my feet.
- 46 My head with oil thou didst not anoint: but this woman hath anointed my feet with ointment.
- 47 Wherefore I say unto thee, Her sins, which are many, are forgiven; for she loved much: but to whom little is forgiven, the same loveth little.

- Jesus pointed out that Simon, compared with the sinful woman, was greatly lacking in service to the Lord – the reason…less love.
- The sinful woman loved Jesus more than the selfrighteous Pharisee.
- How does this event apply to modern Christianity?

Summary

- Lack of love for Christ is the plague of modern Christianity.
- The modern Christian loves the world, self, and sin more than love for Christ.
- The lack of appreciation for personal forgiveness results in shallow love and service to the King of kings!
- Christ is the Creator:

<u>Eph 3:9</u> And to make all *men* see what *is* the fellowship of the mystery, which from the beginning of the world hath been hid in God, who created all things by Jesus Christ:

- Col. 1:16 For by him were all things created, that are in heaven, and that are in earth, visible and invisible, whether they be thrones, or dominions, or principalities, or powers: all things were created by him, and for him: 17 And he is before all things, and by him all things consist.
- 18 And he is the head of the body, the church: who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead; that in all things he might have the preeminence.

- Isa. 40:12 Who hath measured the waters in the hollow of his hand, and meted out heaven with the span, and comprehended the dust of the earth in a measure, and weighed the mountains in scales, and the hills in a balance? ...
- 18 To whom then will ye liken God? or what likeness will ye compare unto him? ...
- 21 Have ye not known? have ye not heard? hath it not been told you from the beginning? have ye not understood from the foundations of the earth?

 22 It is he that sitteth upon the circle of the earth,
- and the inhabitants thereof *are* as grasshoppers; that stretcheth out the heavens as a curtain, and spreadeth them out as a tent to dwell in: ...

<u>26</u> Lift up your eyes on high, and behold who hath created these things, that bringeth out their host by number: he calleth them all by names by the greatness of his might, for that he is strong in power; not one faileth.

Psa. 147:4 He telleth the number of the stars; he calleth them all by their names.

Psa. 19:1 The heavens declare the glory of God; and the firmament sheweth his handywork.

Psa. 33:6 By the word of the LORD were the heavens made; and all the host of them by the breath of his mouth.

Psa. 97:6 The heavens declare his righteousness, and all the people see his glory.

The Creator of the universe condescends to have fellowship with sinners.

Psa. 103:12 As far as the east is from the west, so far hath he removed our transgressions from us.

2 Cor. 5:21 For he hath made him to be sin for us, who knew no sin; that we might be made the righteousness of God in him.

- <u>2 Cor. 8:8</u> I speak not by commandment, but by occasion of the forwardness of others, and to prove the sincerity of your love.
- 9 For ye know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that, though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, that ye through his poverty might be rich.
