IS WORKING WITHIN THE BELIEVER Rom. 5:1-5

2022 THEME

- Rom. 5:1 Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:
- <u>2</u> By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God.
- <u>3</u> And not only *so*, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience;
- 4 And patience, experience; and experience, hope:
- 5 And hope maketh not ashamed; because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us.

Too much of modern Christianity is related to "association" to Scriptural principles and not to "causation" of spirituality motivated by, and empowered by, the Holy Spirit.

Religious "rules" are a discipline incorporated in one's life for the sake of conformity, but may not be motivated by a love for the Savior. Some rules may be "right" to do but not necessarily evidence of a love to do right.

Rom. 5:3 And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also: knowing that tribulation worketh patience;

Original Word: κατεργάζομαι

Transliteration: katergazomai

Definition: to work out; **Usage:** I effect by labor, achieve,

work out, bring about.

katergázomai – literally, "work down to the end-point," bring to decisive finality (end-conclusion).

- The imputation of Christ's righteousness has made the difference.
- The groundwork for our passage is the imputation of Christ's righteousness, given by grace to undeserving sinners, providing justification in the eyes of God.

Eph. 1:6 To the praise of the glory of his grace, wherein he hath made us accepted in the beloved.

Last week, we began looking at divine truth revealed to us in Rom. 5:1:

I. HOW GOD HAS LIFTED US, 5:1-5

A. As to Our Standing, 5:1-2

1. We Have Acceptance, 5:1

Rom. 5:1 Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:

- Justification of sinners can only be accomplished through the redemptive work of the Lord Jesus Christ.
- 1 Jn. 2:1 My little children, these things write I unto you, that ye sin not. And if any man sin, we have an advocate with the Father, Jesus Christ the righteous: 2 And he is the propitiation for our sins: and not for ours only, but also for the sins of the whole world.
- As we understand propitiation we understand God's love toward us:
- 1 Jn. 4:10 Herein is love, not that we loved God, but that he loved us, and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins.

As our Advocate, the Lord Jesus does not plea mercy for us, He appeals for our righteousness and consequential justice which provides "peace with God."

2. We Have Access, 5:2

Rom. 5:2 By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God.

Believers stake their testimony upon the grace of their relationship with Christ – "By whom...wherein we stand..." Original Word: ἵστημι

Transliteration: histémi

Through the Lord Jesus Christ we have "peace with God" that is only accessible "by faith into this grace wherein we stand..." = experiencing this "grace" also produces a joy that causes the believer to "...rejoice in hope of the glory of God."

Knowing the Scriptural foundation of salvation, truth motivates to endure during difficult times.

- Our standing with the Lord is perfect; our state in life is progressive.
- The progression includes four stages:
- There is a melting process;
- 2) There is a mellowing process;
- 3) There is a molding process;
- 4) There is a maturing process.

B. As to Our State, 5:3-5

1. How Maturity is Displayed in Us, 5:3a "And not only so, but we glory in tribulations also..."

Believers do not only identify with Christ, but do so with "glory."

Original Word: καυχάομαι

Transliteration: kauchaomai

Definition: to boast; Usage: I boast; I glory (exult) proudly.

kauxáomai – properly, living with "head up high," figuratively, it refers to living with *God-given* confidence.

- Rom. 5:2 By whom also we have access by faith into this grace wherein we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God. ...
- 11 And not only so, but we also joy in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom we have now received the atonement.
- Gal. 6:14 But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world.
- Believers do not only rejoice and identify with Christ, but do so in spite of "tribulations."

Original Word: θλῖψις

Transliteration: thlipsis

Definition: tribulation; **Usage:** persecution, affliction, distress, tribulation.

thlipsis – properly, pressure (what constricts or rubs together), used of a narrow place that "hems someone in"; tribulation, especially internal pressure that causes someone to feel confined (restricted, "without options").

thlipsis ("compression, tribulation") carries the challenge of coping with the internal pressure of a tribulation, especially when feeling there is "no way of escape" ("hemmed in").

Rom. 12:12 Rejoicing in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer;

2 Thess. 1:4 So that we ourselves glory in you in the churches of God for your patience and faith in all your persecutions and tribulations that ye endure:

Tribulations are great challenges but the love of Christ is greater! Rom. 8:35 Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword? ...

37 Nay, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us.

38 For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things

present, nor things to come,

39 Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature,

shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

2. How Maturity is Developed in Us, 5:3b-5a

Rom. 5:3b "...knowing that tribulation worketh patience;

- 4 And patience, experience; and experience, hope:
- 5 And hope maketh not ashamed..."

Original Word: οἶδα

Transliteration: eidó

Definition: be aware, behold, consider, perceive; **Usage:** I

know, remember, appreciate.

eídō (oida) – perceiving ("mentally seeing").

eidō ("seeing that becomes knowing")

Mature believers look at the "big picture," knowing absolutely that "tribulation" will be a factor affecting growth of "patience," being able to endure the challenge.





Trials of tribulation are "tools" that create spiritual maturity in the form of "patience."

Original Word: ὑπομονή

Transliteration: hupomoné

Definition: a remaining behind, a patient enduring;

Usage: endurance, steadfastness, patient waiting for.

hypomoné — properly, remaining under, endurance; steadfastness, especially as God enables the believer to "remain (endure) under" the challenges He allots in life. https://biblehub.com/greek/5281.htm

<u>Luke 8:15</u> But that on the good ground are they, which in an honest and good heart, having heard the word, keep it, and bring forth fruit with patience.

Patience works within the believer to provide experience, which in turn, develops hope, an expectation anticipating good things to come.

Original Word: ἐλπίς

Transliteration: elpis

Definition: expectation, hope; **Usage:** hope, expectation, trust, confidence.

elpís – properly, expectation of what is sure (certain); hope. https://biblehub.com/greek/1680.htm

- Such hope creates an attitude that is courageous, that "...maketh not ashamed..."
- Such hope motivates action with an anticipation of results:
- 1 Cor. 9:10 Or saith he *it* altogether for our sakes? For our sakes, no doubt, *this* is written: that he that ploweth should plow in hope; and that he that thresheth in hope should be partaker of his hope.
 - 3. How Maturity is Determined in Us, 5:5b "...because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us."

- Enduring tribulations is connected to "the love of God" which is "working" in a believer by the influence of the "Holy Ghost which is given unto us."
- Believers do not try to conjure up spiritual characteristics, rather, they are the by-product of a spiritual relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ.

1 Cor. 12:6 And there are diversities of operations, but it is the same God which worketh all in all.

1 Cor. 12:11 But all these worketh that one and the selfsame Spirit, dividing to every man severally as he will.

Gal. 5:6 "...but faith which worketh by love."

Conclusion

- 2 Cor. 5:14 For the love of Christ constraineth us; because we thus judge, that if one died for all, then were all dead:
- 15 And that he died for all, that they which live should not henceforth live unto themselves, but unto him which died for them, and rose again. ...

 17 Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.

- Rom. 12:9 Let love be without dissimulation. Abhor that which is evil; cleave to that which is good. 10 Be kindly affectioned one to another with brotherly love; in honour preferring one another; 11 Not slothful in business; fervent in spirit; serving the Lord;
- 12 Rejoicing in hope; patient in tribulation; continuing instant in prayer;
- 13 Distributing to the necessity of saints; given to hospitality.
